Sub: Diversion of 18.844 Ha of forest land in Hosanagara Taluk, Shimoga District (Sagar Forest Division) for construction of 2 lane with paved shoulder road from Km 55.6-Adagodi to Km 90.7-Mavinakoppa of NH 766C with 4 major bridges across Sharavathi Backwaters in Favour of Executive Engineer, NH Division, PWD, Shimoga.

- 1. The Executive Engineer, NH Division, PWD, Shimoga [USER AGENCY] vide Ref (1) has submitted the proposal through FC web portal on 06-06-2022 seeking diversion of 18.844 Ha of forest land in Hosanagara Taluk, Shimoga District (Sagar Forest Division) for construction of 2 lane with paved shoulder road from Km 55.6-Adagodi to Km 90.7-Mavinakoppa of NH766C with 4 major bridges across Sharavathi Backwatersfor approval under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The same was accepted by Nodal Officer (FCA) on 13-

06-2022 for further processing under the Act. After receiving the online acknowledgement from the User Agency on 02-08-2022 for having delivered the hard copies of proposal to the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Sagar Division and Deputy Commissioner, Shimoga District, the online link was forwarded to the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Sagar Division on 04-08-2022 for field verification and further processing under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

2. Location details and Component wise break up: Location details of the forest land proposed for diversion are given below.

- **3. DCF, Sagar Report:** The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Sagar Division has inspected the project site on 20-09-2022and vide Ref (3) has submitted the Site Inspection Report along with details of the site in PART-II of the proposal to Conservator of Forests, Shimoga Circle. Main features of the forest land proposed for diversion as per the DCF, Sagar Division report r/w reports of CF, Shimoga Circle and that of ICT Centre of Forest Department are as follows.
 - a. The forest land proposed for diversion is in general landscape of Eco-class I (Tropical Wet Evergreen Forests/ Tropical Semi Evergreen Forests/ Topical Moist Deciduous Forests) with Canopy Density varies from 0.1 to 0.4 (Very Dense Forest).
 - b. As per Item 4(ii) of PART-II, there are 3213 trees on the forest land proposed for diversion. Major tree species include Lagerstroemia lanceolate, Emblica Officinalis, Syzigiumcumini, Albizia lebbeck, Bombax ceiba, Mangifera indica, Ficus benghalensis, Mimusop selengi, Adina cordifolia, Gmelina arborea, Swietenia mahagoni, Terminalia tomentosa, Alstonia scholar, Artocarpus heterophyllu sand various other jungle wood species.
 - c. Major wild animals found in and around the project area include Indian Gaur, Sambar deer, Wild boar, Hanuman langoor, King cobra, Peacock, Grey hornbill among others.
 - d. There are no rare / endangered / unique species of flora and fauna reported in the forest area proposed for diversion.
 - e. As per Item 8 (ii) of PART-II, the forest land proposed for diversion does not form part of any National Park/ Wildlife Sanctuary/ Biosphere Reserve/ Tiger Reserve/ Elephant Corridor/ Wildlife Migration Corridor.
 - f. As per Item 8 (iv) of PART-II, there are no National Park/ Wildlife Sanctuary/ Biosphere Reserve/ Tiger Reserve/ Elephant Corridor/ Wildlife Migration Corridor within one kilometer from the boundary of the forest land proposed for diversion.
 - g. The forest land proposed for diversion is not located within Eco-Sensitive Zone (ESZ) of any Protected Area notified under Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.

- h. There are no Protected/ Archeological/ Heritage Sites/ Defence establishments located in the proposed area.
- i. There is no violation reported under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
- 4. CF, Shimoga Circle Report: Agreeing with the recommendation made by the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Sagar Division, the Conservator of Forests, Shimoga Circle has also recommended the proposal.
- 5. Net Present Value (NPV): The User Agency is required to pay the Net Present Value (NPV) of forest land proposed for diversion as per the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide letter F.No. 5-3/2011-FC dated 06-01-2022. The User Agency has submitted an Undertaking to pay the charges towards Net Present Value (NPV) of the forest land proposed for diversion.
- 6. Compensatory Afforestation (CA): In accordance with the provisions of para 2.5 (i) (f) of the the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 28-03-2019, the User Agency being a State Government agency implementing a Central Government project is exempted from the requirement of providing the non-forest land for Compensatory Afforestation purpose and the Compensatory Afforestation can be raised and maintained at the cost of User Agency on degraded forest land twice in extent of the forest area proposed for diversion. Accordingly, the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Sagar Division have identified the following degraded forest land parcels in their jurisdictions.

The Compensatory Afforestation land details in form of KML files, Topo-maps, Geo-referenced maps along with GPS readings, CA Schemes and CA Site Certificates have been uploaded at Item 13 of PART-II. Further, the User Agency has furnished an Undertaking to pay the applicable Compensatory Afforestation (CA) charges.

7. Status of RoFR compliance: With regard to compliance of the provisions of Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forests Rights) Act 2006 and Rules 2008, the User Agency has not obtained and furnished the requisite Certificate in FORM-I (for Linear projects) issued by the jurisdictional Deputy Commissioner as per Annexure II of the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 28-03-2019. Accordingly, the User Agency is being informed once again to obtain the required RoFR certificate and submit a copy.

Under the above circumstances and agreeing with recommendations of the field officers, it is requested to move the proposal with the Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, Regional Office (Southern Zone), Bengaluru for according in-principle (Stage-I) approval under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 18.844 Ha of forest land in Hosanagara Taluk, Shimoga District (Sagar Forest Division) for construction of 2 lane with paved shoulder road from Km 55.60 Adagodi to Km 90.7 Mavinakoppa of NH 766C with 4 major bridges across Sharavathi Backwaters in Favour of Executive Engineer, NH Division, PWD, Shimoga for a period of thirty (30) years subject to production of RoFR Certificate in FORM-I (for linear projects) and further subject to the conditions appended in Annexure 'A'.

The hard copy of the proposal along with the relevant documents in 3 sets is submitted herewith for further needful.

ANNEXURE 'A'

- 1. The legal status of forest land shall remain unchanged and it shall continue to be the forest land.
- 2. The User Agency shall pay the applicable Net Present Value (NPV), Compensatory Afforestation (CA) charges, cost of extraction of trees (if required in future), land lease rent and any other levies as per the conditions of approval.
- 3. The User Agency shall demarcate the lease area in the manner specified at the time of approval at its own cost.
- 4. The User Agency shall provide the signages of appropriate size and kind all along the road within forest limits for creating awareness about forest, Wildlife and Environment issues among general public and the road users at project cost in consultation with the jurisdictional Deputy Conservator of Forests/ Conservator of Forests/ Chief Conservator of Forests.
- 5. The lessee shall not sub-lease, mortgage & hypothecate the forest area.
- 6. The leased out area should be used for the purpose for which it is granted. In case, the land is not used for the stipulated purpose within two years or when it is no longer needed for the stipulated purpose, the area would stand resumed to the Forest Department.
- 7. The application for renewal of the lease in the prescribed form and manner shall be submitted at least six months prior to the expiry of forest lease. In case, no renewal is sought, the Lessee shall hand over the lease.
- 8. No residential or commercial buildings shall be permitted in the forest area proposed for diversion.
- 9. No crushing / breaking of stones or labour camp shall be allowed inside forest area and all waste / debris generated shall be scientifically disposed off outside the forest area.
- 10. Any damage to forest area because of implementation of the project shall be compensated by the Lessee. The extent of damage shall be assessed by the jurisdictional Deputy Conservator of Forests/ Conservator of Forests/ Chief Conservator of Forests.
- 11. The Lessee shall ensure that no avoidable harm is caused to the fauna and flora in and around the proposed area.
- 12. No change in Land Use Plan shall be done unless prior approval of Government of India under FC Act is obtained.
- 13. In case, any violation of the provisions of the Karnataka Forest Act, 1963 & Rules, 1969 or other relevant Acts/Rules is reported during the lease period, the lease will be liable for forfeiture under Section 82 of Karnataka Forest Act, 1963. The Chief Conservator of Forests and/or Deputy Conservator of Forests concerned are authorized to take necessary action in this regard.
- 14. The approval under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 is subject to any other clearances necessary under the prevailing statutes.
- 15. The User Agency shall also abide by other conditions those may be imposed by the Government of India, Government of Karnataka and Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Head of Forest Force) before or after the approval.
