NAME OF PROJECT – BORABAS MANDANA WATER SUPPLY PROJECT KOTA (RAJASTHAN)

TOTAL AREA TO BE DIVERTED – 4.00 HA.

AREA UNDER THIS OFFICE – 0.86 Ha.

This office is agree to divert the forest land for the above project as there is no alternate way to lay down drinking water pipelines and over head tanks. The area applied is minimum. The project has been permitted by the National Board of Wildlife on dated 02 june 2015 and further recommended by National Tiger Conservation Authority after field inspection with conditions as follows :-

1. The user agency shall provide water for wildlife at their own cost at 5 points as identified by DCF (WL), Mukundra Tiger Reserve.
2. The user agency will provide 2% of the project cost of the stretch falling inside the tiger reserve area for conservation and development of wildlife habitat. The funds will be placed at the disposal of the authority prescribed by the Chief Wildlife Warden. (The amount has been deposited by user agency in RPAC)
3. No cutting of trees will be allowed.
4. No night camping should be allowed by labour force during laying of pipeline within sanctuary area.
5. Work will be done during day time only.
6. Appropriate protection measures for trees will be provided at user agency's cost.
7. No disturbance to wildlife and its habitat would be caused.
8. The project personnel engaged in the project in the project shall observe the provision of Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 & Rules made there under.

The user agency for agumentation plan of the catchment area development have to deposite Rs. 20.00 Lacs in Rajasthan protected area conservation society as per recommendation of NBWL, and Field Director Mukandra Hills Tiger Reserve letter No. 3332 dated 01 july 2016.

Hence the project is recommended as per above conditions.
