

Site Inspection report of DCF


Inspection Date :-14.08.2020

The proposed road, **Amra-Bagahi Kalan (Harijan Tola)** passes through **Sohaipur Protected Forest**, notified for management purpose, by Environment, Forest and Climate Change Department, Government of Bihar vide **C/PF-10148/52-24R dated 02.01.1953** in which the present proposal for about **0.536 Hectare** is submitted for diversion. Actual area involved in the project is **0.536 Hectare** and has been visited by the undersigned along with survey team and verified the facts on the proposed site. The requirement of forest land as proposed by the user agency is unavoidable and barest minimum of the project.

- The diversion of 0.536 Hectare of protected forest land is proposed for the **Amra-Bagahi Kalan (Harijan Tola) Road**.
- During the inspection on 14.08.2020 as per the instruction of APPCF (CAMPA)- cum – nodal Officer (Forest Conservation) letter No. **22/19 CAMPA-FC/254 dated 28.03.2019**, the actual area was found to **0.536 Hectare**, which is notified as Protected Forest. At present user agency only requires **0.536 Hectare** for the **Amra-Bagahi Kalan (Harijan Tola) Road**.
- The area for diversion is **0.536 Hectare** and the user agency requires forest land devoid of any tree species. No endangered and rare tree/ species were found in the proposed area. Density of Vegetation is approximately **zero** for the purpose of NPV calculation. In few places the weeds and grass are present. This part of the protected forest is the minimum area proposed for diversion to complete of the project.
- This is bare minimum forest area required for completion of **Amra-Bagahi Kalan (Harijan Tola) Road**.
- **0.536 Hectare** land is mainly required by the user agency to complete the project. No other alternative exists to the user agency to avoid this bare minimum land.
- Generally the project area is vulnerable to medium soil erosion due to intrinsic geological features of the substrate during rainy season.
- The proposed project area is only **Notified Protected Forest** and does not form part of any National Park, Wildlife Sanctuary, Biosphere Reserve, Tiger Reserve, Elephant Corridor etc.
- **Nilgai** is found naturally and freely distributed across the Gaya district in the farm lands. Animals like jackal, hair, Common Langur etc are also found in the nearest forest areas. Apart from these, local birds are abundant in these areas. The undersigned is of the

opinion that the proposed project will in no way affect the distribution or movement of any wild animal found in the areas where it is found. So far no cases of wildlife deaths have been reported in the proposed road. The crop raiding Nilgai is also present in the adjoining areas of the forest boundary.

- As per my knowledge, the enquiry report of the Forest official and information provided by user agency, there is no record of any protected archaeological/heritage site/defence establishment or any other important monument located in the area of the proposed project.
- The requirement of forest land, as proposed by the user agency in Col. No. 2 of Part - I is minimum and unavoidable for the project and it's only viable option.
- The User Agency has not violated the prescribed provisions of the Forest conservation Act and Indian Forest Act at the time of inspection.
- The area identified for Greening falls in the degraded forests of Gaya Range where 1320 plants in the form of block plantation will be done on a net area of 1.2 Ha.
