3.00 The proposal has been initiated by the Executive Engineer, Minor Irrigation Division, Jalgaon for approval under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. This is storage tank proposed on Handya Kundya Nalla (Deohari), Tal. Chopada, Dist. Jalgaon. The proposed project irrigable command area covered from Jalgaon District will be 264.00 there was a continuous social demand from the village in the area from the providing irrigation facilities. Due to this project totoal 2.580 mm3 water will be stored at Handya Kundya Nalla as ground water in this area is substantially depleted lead to scarcity of drinking water for public as well for domestic and wild animals in the region. Thus project will benefit 3 villages namely Deohari, Deozari & Melane

from Chopada Taluka in Dist. Jalgaon. The site inspection report of the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Yawal Forest Division, Jalgaon is enclosed on page no. 101 to 103

3.0 Previously the aforesaid proposal was submitted to the Regional Office, Government of India vide the State Government letter FLD.3111/CR/170/F10, dt.11/11/2011 for prior approval of the Central Government under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The Central Government vide letter No.6-MHC-82/2011-BHO/150, dt.8/7/2015 desired information on the following points:-

- 3.1 Website entries of the site inspection Report of DCF
- 3.2 Certificate of the Collector, ensuring compliance under FRA, 2006.
- 3.3 CA scheme, map and suitability certificate.
- 3.4 Tree enumeration list.

4.00 The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Yawal Forest Division, Jalgaon has certified that:-

- 4.1 no suitable alternate land is available and the forest land required is barest minimum.
- 4.2 the area belongs to Eco-value class-III having density is 0.4 (Tropical Dry Deciduous Forest, Open Forest).
- 4.3 there are 9582 trees involved the project out of which 6909 trees required to be felled. The various species and trees is involved in implementation of the Project the Girth wise break up is as under:-

As per the Government of India, MoEF letter dated 30/01/2009 has mentioned that 'No tree felling in the area between FRL and 4 m below FRL shall be carried out' for the Minor Irrigation proposals. In this regard the actual tree felling for the said proposal is 6909 required to be felled.

- 4.4 the area involved in the project does not form part of any existing National Park, Wildlife Sanctuary, Nature Reserve etc.
- 4.5 proposed project is not likely to affect any monumental site of cultural, historical, religious, archeological or recreational importance.

- 4.6 there is no violation of Forest (Conservation) Act 1980.
- 4.7 proposed project area for the project is 2.50 km from the boundary of the project area (Sanctuary and National Park).
- 4.8 the non-forest area covered under the project is not under the provision of Maharashtra Private Forest (Acquisition) Act 1975 by virtue of application of Section 35 of Indian Forest Act 1927 and are not recognized as deemed reserved forest as well as not included in the area identified as "forest" as per dictionary meaning of forest as intimated to the expert committee appointed under interim judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 12/12/1996.
- 4.9 and proposed Compensatory Afforestation it is contiguous, suitable for afforestation and management purpose and it is free from encroachment and an encumbrances. The details of CA area is as under:-

- 5.7 The User Agency has certified that the aforesaid Environmental Clearance is not required as the command area 330 ha of the project is less than 2000 ha.

- 6.00 The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Yawal Forest Division, Jalgaon and Chief Conservator of Forest (T), Dhule have recommended the proposal for diversion of 31.49 ha. of forest land.

7.00 In view of this, the proposal is recommended for approval under the section -2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 subject to the following conditions: –

7.1 The legal status of the forest land required will remain unchanged.

7.2 Compensatory Afforestaton :-

Compensatory afforestation will be raised over 31.49 ha non forest land at the cost of user agency in Village Pimpalgaon & Savatkheda, Taluka. Jamner, Dist. Jalgaon. The details are as under:-

- 7.3 The cost of compensatory afforestation at the prevailing wage rates as per compensatory afforestation scheme and the cost of survey, demarcation and erection of permanent pillars if required on the CA land shall be deposited in advance with the Forest Department by the project authority. The CA will be maintained for 10 years. The scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years.
- 7.4 The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be demarcated on ground at the project cost by erecting four feet high reinforced cement concrete pillars, each inscribed with its serial number toward and back bearing and distance from pillar to pillar.

- 7.5 The Project Authority should provide water to forestry and allied purposes at the rate fixed by the Government of Maharashtra.
- 7.6 The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than specified in the project.
- 7.7 The project authority will defray the cost of Net Present Value of 31.49 ha. of forest land as per the latest Guideline of the Government of India.
- 7.8 The project authority will defray the additional/revised cost of Net Present Value of forest land as per the latest guidelines of Government of India.
- 7.9 The forest land shall not be utilized for any purpose other than specified in the project proposal
- 7.10 No damage shall be caused to the flora and fauna of the area.
- 7.11 No labour camp shall be established on the forest land;
- 7.12 The user agency, if required, shall undertake comprehensive soil conservation measure at the project cost in consultation with the Forest Department.
- 7.13 A Catchment Area Treatment Plan shall be prepared, and implemented under the supervision of the Forest Department at the project cost, if applicable;
- 7.14 The user agency shall obtain environmental clearance, 2006, if required.
- 7.15 The user agency shall carry out muck disposal at pre- designated sites in such manner so as to avoid its rolling down;
- 7.16 The dumping area for muck disposal shall be stabilized and reclaimed by planting suitable species by the user agency at the cost of project under the supervision of State Forest Department. Retaining walls and terracing shall be carried out to hold the dumping material in place. Stabilization and reclamation of such dumping sites shall be completed before handing over the same to the State Forest Department in a time bound manner as per plan;
- 7.17 The user agency shall consult organizations (s) having experience in construction of roads in hilly areas to avoid frequent road blocks due to landslides etc. and shall provide breast walls and retaining walls wherever necessary;
- 7.18 The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Central Government.
- 7.19 All other conditions as may be mandatory under relevant Acts, Rules and guidelines shall be complied with by the user agency.

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8.00 It is therefore, requested that Government of India may kindly be moved for approving the proposal for diversion of 31.49 ha. forest land under Forest (Conservation), 1980 for Construction of Handya Kundya Storage Tank Near Village Deohari Tal. Chopda, Dist. Jalgaon in the State of Maharashtra under section 2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
