

Site Inspection report of the Divisional Forest Officer, Chintur on 19-02-2021 Regarding Diversion of forest land 3.89 Ha. for proposed road from R&B Road to Narasingapeta in Comp.No.181, RHRF Extn-I RF of Kunduluru Beat and in Comp.No.180, Pulusumamidi Ext-I RF of Gulletiwada Beat of Chintur Range & Comp.No.65 of Pulusumamidi RF and Comp.No.66 of Mattapally RF and Comp.No.178, Pulusumamidi Ext-II RF, Pedamattapalli Beat, V.R.Puram Range.

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On 19-02-2021 inspected the proposed forest land for upgradation of existing BT road including construction of culverts from R&B Road to Narasingapeta in Comp.No.181 of RHRF Extn-I RF, Kunduluru Beat and in Comp.No.180 of Pulusumamidi Ext-I RF, Gulletiwada Beat, Chinturu Range and Comp.No.65 of Pulusumamidi RF and Comp.No.66 of Mattapally RF and Comp.No.178 of Pulusumamidi Ext-II RF, Pedamattapalli Beat, V.R.Puram Range. The concerned Panchayath Raj staff and Forest Range Officer, Chintur along with his staff and concerned staff of V.R.Puram Range accompanied in the field inspection. The details of proposed Road length and width passing through the various Reserved Forest Blocks are mentioned below.



The proposed Road is from Narasingapeta in Chintur Range to Venkampalem in V.R Puram Range. At present BT road is existing which needs scarification and resurfacing with BT as the road is completely damaged. The density of the vegetation is 0.10 to 0.40 along the width of the road. The details of existing flora in the adjoining area for diversion are *Terminalia alata*, *Syzizium cumini*, *Choloroxylon swietinia*, *Buchnania latifilola*, *Anogeissus latifolia*, *Diaspyros melanoxyton*, *Lannea grandis*.

This project is very useful for many remote villages. This project is very essential for all departments to extend the Government activities to all the tribal habitations.

Further, the required R.F. area over 3.89 Ha. for this road is not falling in Wildlife sanctuary/ National Park. The proposed road is 3.5 Km. away from the Papikonda National Park and falling in the deemed Eco-Sensitive Zone of Papikonda National Park. It does not require Environment clearance as per the EIA Notification, 2006. There are no endangered and unique Flora & Fauna found in the proposed area, no Forest area will be effected to soil erosion and there are no archeological sites of importance and no historical monuments in the proposed area. In the inspected area the User agency did not carry out any work in violation of the provisions of FC Act and other relevant acts. The required forest area is unavoidable for the project and due to this project there is no threat to the local flora and fauna.
