

Specific recommendations of concerned Chief Conservator of Forest for acceptance or otherwise of the proposal with detailed reasons	: <p>The project Kumchai EPS (Arunachal Pradesh) to Kusijan FGGS (Assam) is for laying of 8 inch Crude Oil & 14 inch Gas pipeline. As per justification for Route-1 the total project area involved is 60.45 Km length of pipeline in Assam & Arunachal Pradesh with 15m ROW. Out of this 18.87 Km falls in Arunachal Pradesh while balance 41.58 Km falls in Assam.</p> <p>In Arunachal Pradesh section the length of pipeline falling in forest area is 8.031 Km with an area of 12.05 ha while in Non-forest area the length is 10.839 Km (10.84) with an area of 16.26 ha. Therefore, the total area involved in Arunachal Pradesh section is 28.31 ha. area ^{over} length of 18.87 Km.</p> <p>The DFO Nampong has submitted an enumeration list of Nil trees as no tree felling is required to be done. He has also submitted an estimate for Rs- 49, 08,488/- for C.A. plantation of 24.10 ha (double the area of 12.05 ha Forest land) under Diyun Range. The CA map as per Annexure-IV of DFO letter dated 26/03/2021 is black & white and he is being asked to submit a colour copy to PCCF& NO (FCA)directly.</p> <p>The status of 41.58 Km length falling in Assam is not known to this office but UA has informed that it is being processed separately with Govt. of Assam.</p> <p>Since the Oil & Gas pipeline for transportation of produced hydrocarbon in Kumchai Oil field under Ningru petroleum mining lease (PML) is in National interest so the proposal is recommended for acceptance.</p>
