

FIELD INSPECTION NOTE OF THE FOREST DIVISIONAL OFFICER, GUDURU (W.L.M.)
ON 05.07.2017 IN CONNECTION WITH THE PROPOSED DIVERSION OF RESERVE
FOREST LAND FOR LAYING OF OPTICAL FIBER CABLE NETWORK

As per the proposal for diversion of forest area received and request made by M/s. Reliance Jio Infocomm Limited, I have inspected the site on 05.07.2017 for laying of Optical Fiber Cable along the road within the existing Right of Way in Compt.Nos. 1059, 1058, 1060, 1062, 1063, 1087, 1086, 1085, 1084, 1089, 1102, 1081, 1103, 1105, 1106, 679, 677, 674 of Chintaguda Reserve Forest which is falling in the Pakhal Wild Life Sanctuary area of Kothaguda Range along with concerned Forest Range Officers, Kothaguda and Gangaram. The User Agency has requested for diversion of 0.664 Ha of Forest land for laying of Optical Fiber Cable.

The proposed alignment is a linear patch project passing through the Pakhal Wild Life Sanctuary area with an extent of 0.664 Ha. The User Agency, M/s. Reliance Jio Infocomm Limited has got the area demarcated on the ground.

I have inspected the site along with the Forest Range Officer, Kothaguda along with concerned staff and it was observed that the above forest area is Wildlife Sanctuary area and bush growth is found in the path of linear project proposed for diversion in Chintaguda Reserve Forest of Kothaguda Range. The prominent species existing in the Pakhal Wildlife Sanctuary area are Chennangi, Palakodisha, Teak, Ullanda, Thirumanu, Billudu, Somi, Bontha, Sandra, etc.,.

The wildlife in the surrounding forest areas are Wild boar, Spotted Deer, Chousinga, Hare, Peacocks, Sambar, etc.,

Other alternatives for this linear project were evaluated, but this proposed project is the shortest and technically feasible compared to others. This is the barest minimum area that is required for laying of Optical Fiber Cable Network.

The User Agency has submitted their undertakings to implement the following conditions:

The proposals for diversion of forest land to an extent of 0.664 Ha in Guduru (W.L.M.) Division of Mahabubabad District for laying of Optical Fiber Network cable in the Pakhal Wildlife Sanctuary area and within the existing right of way with 0.40 Mtrs. Width and there are no trees falling in the proposed area and no flora and fauna will be damaged for the project.

Hence, the proposals for laying of Optical Fiber Network in Compt. Nos. 1059, 1058, 1060, 1062, 1063, 1087, 1086, 1085, 1084, 1089, 1102, 1081, 1103, 1105, 1106, 679, 677, 674 of Chintaguda Reserve Forest of Kothaguda Range is recommended with the following conditions.

1. The Legal status of the Wildlife Sanctuary area proposed to be diverted does not change.
2. Any other conditions imposed by Forest Divisional Officer, Guduru (W.L.M.) from time to time shall be followed by the User Agency.

The Proposals for diversion of 0.664 Ha of Wildlife Sanctuary area for laying of Optical Fiber Network is recommended.

The User Agency has requested for diversion of 0.698 Ha of Forest land for laying of Optical Fiber Cable.

The proposed alignment is a linear patch project passing through the Reserve Forest with an extent of 0.698 Ha. The User Agency, M/s. Reliance Jio Infocomm Limited has got the area demarcated on the ground.

I have inspected the site along with the Forest Range Officer, Gangaram along with concerned staff and it was observed that the above forest area is Reserve Forest area and bush growth is found in the path of linear project proposed for diversion in Pandem Reserve Forest of Gangaram Range. The prominent species existing in the Reserve Forest are Chennangi, Palakodisha, Teak, Ullanda, Thirumanu, Billudu, Somi, Bontha, Sandra, etc.,.

The wildlife in the surrounding forest areas are Wild boar, Spotted Deer, Chousinga, Hare, Peacocks, Sambar, etc.,

The Proposals for diversion of 0.698 Ha of Reserve Forest land for laying of Optical Fiber Network is recommended.
