A proposal has been received by this office from the Executive Engineer PWD(R&B) B.C. Road Division Bhadarwah for diversion of 0.225 ha. of forest land under FCA-1980, for non forestry purpose. The subject envisages the use of forest land for construction of road Neota to Manwah Dispensary Km 9th and 10th under NABARD.

1. The site inspection of the land involved in the proposal has been done by me on dated 27-09-2020
2. On the inspection of the site, it is found that the land required by the user agency is a forest area measuring 0.225 ha.
3. The requirement of Forest land as proposed by the user agency in column No. 2 of Part-I is unavoidable and is barest minimum required for the project.
