2	Brief Project Report	This project falls in the south district of Sikkim state. This road will connect Wok village which is approximately 28 kilometers from Namchi towards the south direction and Chemchey village which is 15 kilometers away from Namchi towards the north direction. The above mentioned project is a new cutting road which links between Chemchey to Upper Wok Village. This road length is 10 Kilometers and it runs and it covers most of the remote areas within this region. This road will benefit the people of Chemchey, lachinhang and upper Wok village. The time needed to reach Damthang from Wok will be than become much lesser and also much shorter. This will benefit the public in many ways as it will provide easy transportation for the sick and old. In these villages, farming is the only source of income, so this road will facilitate them to transfer their products to the nearest market place quickly and avoid the risk of storing it for long period. Other than this there are also many other advantages from the construction of this road.

14	Brief observation of the inspection team	It has been observed that the Hill cutting work is done only for the carriageway, i.e six(6) meters of formation. So much of the tree felling could be avoided. The forest area is open falls under the category of Khasmal and Gorucharan. No reserve forest has been touched by this alignment. In one part within the forest area a very huge rock can be seen and falls within the road alignment and a very extensive cutting is required. The numbers of trees can be minimized only if the felling is done until and unless it is very necessary.
