No. 337. His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to declare, under the provisions of section 16 of the Madras Forest Act (V of 1882), that from the 15th January 1890 the area, the boundaries of which are set forth in the schedule appended to this notification, shall be constituted "reserved forest."

corner of survey No. 105 of Tirutieri and about 3½ chains from the Chingleput trunk road a straight line east by south to cairn No. 2 about 2½ chains south of the point at which the southern boundary (from the east) of the said survey No. 105 turns north; then a straight line in the same direction to cairn No. 3 about 2½ chains south-east of south-west corner of survey No. 107 of Tirutieri and about 5 chains west of the Pareri village western boundary; then a straight line due east to cairn No. 4 about 2 chains due south of the south-east corner of the last-named survey number (107), then a straight line running in a north-easterly direction to cairn No. 5 on the eastern boundary of Pareri about 10 chains north of the south-west corner of survey No. 211 of Jemelpakkam; from the above cairn a line due north along the eastern boundary of Pareri for about 10 chains to cairn No. 6; then a straight line north-east to cairn No. 7 at the second boundary stone (connected from the northern extremity) on the west border of survey No. 211 of Jemelpakkam.

East.- From the above point a straight line due south for about 15 chains to cairn No. 8 about a chain north of the westernmost corner of survey No. 213 of Jemelpakkam then a straight line south-west for about 4 chains to cairn No. 9 about a chain north of the north-west corner of survey No. 212; then a straight line due south for about 5 chains to cairn No. 10 at the south-west corner of that field; then on to cairn No. 11 at the north-west corner of survey No. 210 of Jemelpakkam; then along the western border of that field to cairn No. 12 at the point where that border meets the northern limit of survey No. 68 of Virapuram; then along the latter limit through cairns numbered 13, 14, 15 and 16 to cairn No. 17 at the point where the Virapuram tank supply channel cuts it.

South.- From the last-named point the north bank of the said channel as far as the north-west corner of field No. 71 of Virapuram passing cairns numbered 18, 19, 20 and 21; then passing cairn No. 22 along the western boundary of that field up to cairn No. 23 at the north-east corner of survey No. 82; then along the north limits of survey Nos. 82, 84 and 86 passing cairns 24 to 28; then along the western boundary of Virapuram passing cairns Nos. 29 and 30 to cairn No. 31 5 chains north of the Virapuram bandy track; from the above cairn a straight line north-west to cairn No. 32 at the north-east corner of survey No. 63 of Paranur.

West.- From the last-named point a straight line north-east for about 9 chains to cairn No. 33; then the Settipunnam eastern boundary, passing cairns Nos. 34 and 35 to cairn No. 36 at the south-west corner of a pond called Khoad Kuttai; from there a straight line north-east to cairn No. 1.

Remarks.- The following public rights of way are admitted:-

(1) Cart-track from Tennelpakkam to Virapuram about 32 chains through forest fields No. 40A of Pareri village and No. 70 of Virapuram.

(2) Cart-track from Settipunnam to Tennelpakkam A about 55 chains through forest fields No. 40A of Pareri, No. 108 of Tirutteri and No. 1 of Paranur.

(3) Cart-track from Senkundram to right of way No. 2, about 37 chains through forest fields No. 211C of Tennelpakkam, No. 70 of Virapuram, No. 40A of Pareri and No. 108 of Tirutteri.

(4) Foot-path from Settipunnam to No. 5 about 11 chains through forest field No. 108 of Tirutteri.

(5) Foot-path from Settipunnam to Nos. 4 and 2 about 7 chains through forest field No. 108 of Tirutteri.

Note:- Foot-paths are 4 feet wide and cart-tracks 12 feet. The former are open for people and cattle and the latter for people, cattle and carts.

2. The right to the usufruct over twenty-six luppai and two mango trees (assessed at Rs. 28-3-8), held in survey field No. 70 by claimants (No. 1) Sami Aiyengar and Strimvasa Aiyengar and other holders of the Samudayam patta of Virapuram village is admitted in their favour subject to any rules that may hereafter be passed by the Governor in Council under section 12 (v) of the Forest Act, and provided (1) that no sale, gift, grant, lease mortgage, or other alienation shall be made without the sanction of Government under section 17 of the Forest Act; (2) that no access shall be had to the trees without the permission of the Forest Officer, except during the months of July to October. Claimants can sell or barter the produce.

3. The claim to water of the feeder channel of Virapuram tank from KosaVenkuttai of Tirutteri village to the north-west corner-stone of field No. 71 of Virapuram about 500 yards long by 2 to 3 yards broad is admitted in favour of the villagers of Virapuram. They are allowed to clear and repair the channel when necessary on giving notice to the Forest Officer in charge before entering the forest for the purpose.

It runs generally north-east and leaves the east boundary of the block at the west side of survey No. 299 of Senkundram.

(2) Salt-track from Iruttteri to Temelpakkam. It enters the north boundary of the reserve about a chain south-west of the southernmost corner of survey No. 39 of Pareri village and running north-east for fourteen chains joins No. (1) path.

(3) Salt-track from Singaperumalkoil to Temelpakkam. It enters the north boundary of the reserve about three chains north of the south-east corner of survey No. 170 of Senkundram and joins No. (4) path about eleven and a half chains east by north of its point of entrance.

(4) Cart-track from Virapuram to Jemelpakkam. It enters the south boundary of the reserve about a chain north of the south-east corner of survey No. 214. of Jemelpakkam and leaves the east boundary about three chains south of the boundary figure north of the north-west corner of survey No. 221 of the said village.

(5) Cart-track from Chingleput to Kachadi-mangalam. It branches from (A) about Virapuram to Senkundram. It branches from No. (4) about seven chains west of its point of exit and joins No. (1) path south of Iamarakulam of Senkundram, where it is crossed by a channel.

(6) Cart-track from Chingleput to Kachadi-mangalam. It branches from No. (1) path near the south-east corner of survey No. 188 and leaves the east boundary of the reserve about two chains west-north-west of the south-west corner of survey No. 351 of Senkundram.

The above paths are four yards broad and open for people, cattle and carts.

Reprovals were sent to the Government of India under the Forests (Conservation) Act, 1980 for the transfer of 14.70ha. of the following forest lands in Chingleput district to the National Highways Department for widening and strengthening the road in Tambaram - Villupuram Section in N.H. 45:-

The area required by the National Highways Department were planted with Eucalyptus Miscellaneous species and cashew plants. The area in Thirutheri reserved forest contains a Forester's quarters and a well. The National Highways Department has agreed to identify the non-forestry land for compensatory afforestation of 30 ac. 20.25 ha. in Vannamalai and Palavelli village in S.F. Nos. 334 and 335.

2. The Government of India, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Department of Environment, Forests and Wild life in their letter seventh read above, have given their approval under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for release of 14.70 ha. of forest lands for widening and strengthening of road in Chingleput District subject to the following conditions:-

1. The legal status of the forest land shall remain unchanged.
2. The non-forest land identified for compensatory afforestation should be handed over to the forest department declared as Reserved Forest, Private Forest and necessary funds for afforestation provided before any use of forest land is permitted.
3. Planting of trees to be undertaken on both sides of the road.
4. In order that the construction labour and staff while working on the project in the forest area may not cause destruction to the forests for meeting their fuel wood needs, the user agency will establish fuelwood depots and will provide the fuelwood to them free of cost or its cost deducted from their salary and wages.

3. The Government accept the proposal of the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests for the transfer of forest land to the National Highways Department, Tamilnadu. Accordingly the Government permit the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Madras to transfer 14.70 ha. of the following forest lands in Chingleput District to the National Highways Department for widening and strengthening the road in Tambaram and Villupuram Section in N.H. 451

Subject to the following conditions:-

- (i) The legal status of the forest land shall remain unchanged;
- (ii) The non-forest land, identified for compensatory afforestation should be handed over to the forest department declared as Reserved Forest/ Private forest and necessary funds for afforestation provided before any use of forest land is permitted.
- (iii) Planting of trees to be under taken on both sides of the road.
- (iv) In order that the construction labour and staff while working on the project in the forest area may not cause destruction to the forests, for meeting their fuelwood needs, the user agency will establish fuelwood depots, and will provide the fuelwood to them free of cost or its cost deducted from their salary and wages.
- (v) The tree growth and the other standing growth in the area in question will be exploited by the Forest Department before handing over the area to the National Highways;
- (vi) The said exploitation can be made by the Forest Department only after handing over the compensatory land of (50 acres) 20.25 ha. to the Forest Department as already agreed to by the National Highways; and
- (vii) The National Highways should pay a sum of Rs.1,52,000/- as compensation as detailed below.
 - 1) Rs.52,000/- for afforestation of the new area of (50 acres) 20.25 ha. to be transferred to the Forest Department.

11) Rs. 1,00,000/- for the construction of the quarters and digging well in view of the dismantling the Forester's Quarters and well.

5. The principal Chief Conservator of Forests is also requested to send necessary afforestation proposals, collection of compensation amount etc. to the Government immediately.

(3) Branch-cart-track from No. 1 to Hanumandal. It branches from right of way No. 1 about one and a half chains south-east of the north-east corner of survey No. 4 of Paratur, leaves the south boundary about two and a half chains north-west of the north side of Mankunnu; again enters the south boundary about a chain south-west of the said Mankunnu and finally leaves the south boundary of the reserve about four & chains north-west of the south-west corner of survey No. 113 of Virapuram village.

(4) Footpath from Paratur to Virapuram. It enters the south boundary of the reserve about half a chain east of the north east corner of survey No. 5 of Paratur and leaves the boundary the block at the exit of right of way No. 1.
