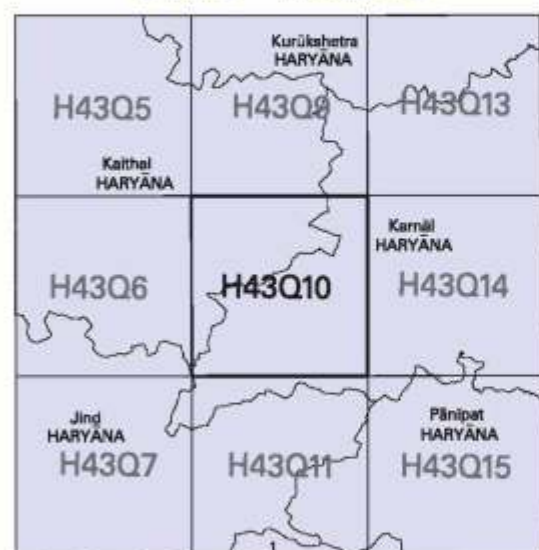

 Heights are in metres and above Indian mean sea level.
 Tube-wells are numerous throughout the sheet only the important ones have been shown.
 A relative height e.g. R_1 represents the approximate height in metres, between the top and bottom of a steep slope.
 Unmarked roads and cart-roads in this sheet are generally motorable throughout the year. Permission to use those along canals is required from the irrigation authorities.
 Canal defence stones are 1,000 feet apart and every fifth stone is shown.
 2,000-acre rectangularisation stones of Shikhar Dam Project Survey are shown as tertiary bench-marks thus: Q^2 B.M. 232.3

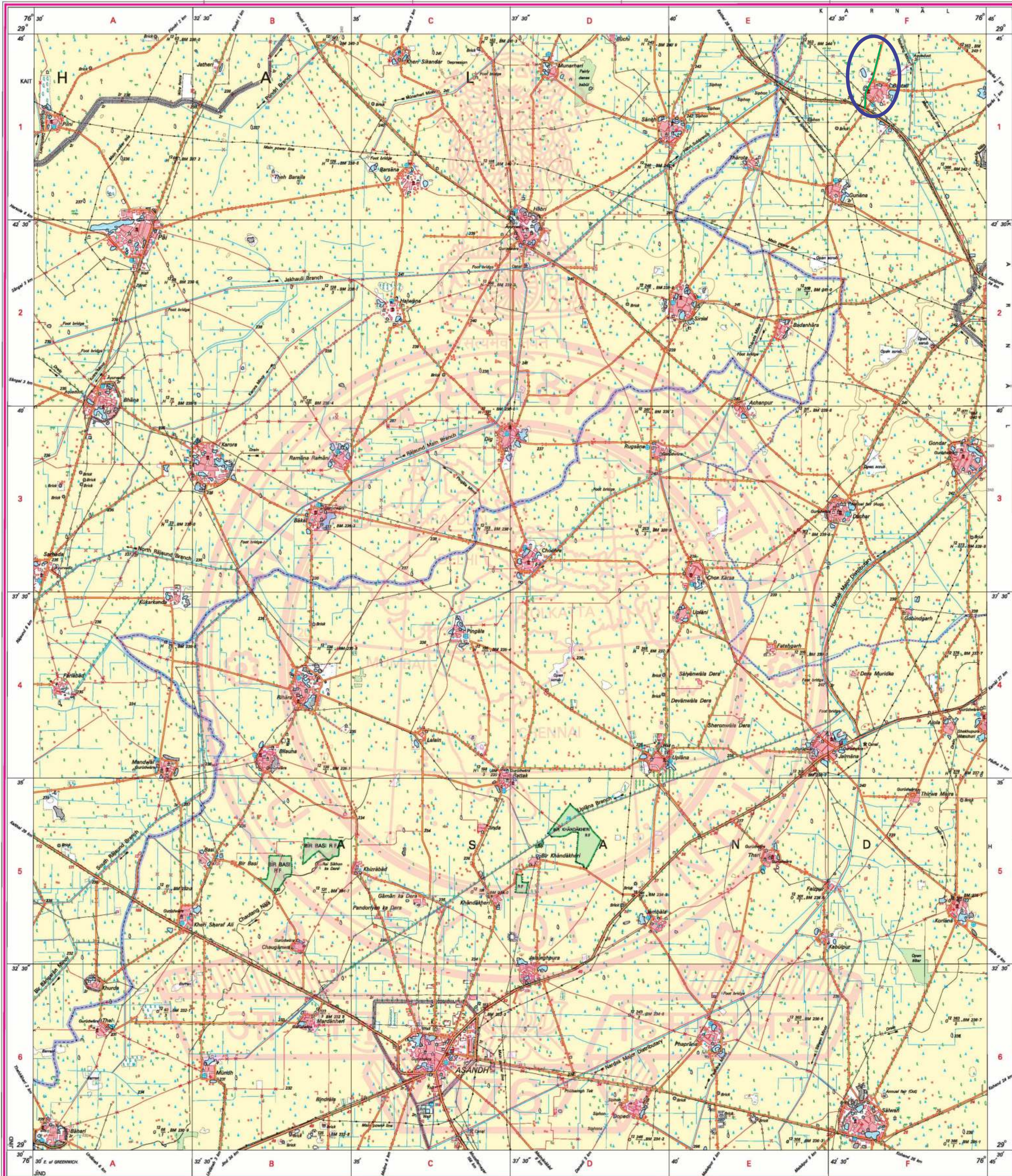
