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1. INTRODUCTION:

The total geographical area of Telangana State is 114840 Sq KM and the total forest area is 28809.08 Sq. Kms. which constitute to 25.19%., whereas the total geographical area of the Kaghaznagar division is 1,64,100 Ha. covering the forest area of 91719.31 Ha. in five Ranges constituting about 55.90%. The Kaghaznagar division lies between 19° 11' 30" and 19° 37'30" north latitudes and 79° 22' 30" and 79° 59'0" east longitudes.

The Kaghaznagar Division consisting of five Ranges, namely - Kaghaznagar, Sirpur, Karjelly, Penchikalpet & Bejjur Ranges.

The Forest area in the Ranges are being utilized as the Corridor for Kawal Tiger Reserve for attracting the Tigers from Thadoba Tiger Reserve of Maharashtra State and Indiravathi Tiger Reserve of Chattisghar State.

4. Period of the Scheme:

The Conservation Plan period is (3) years

5. Objectives:

1. Protection and improvement of the eco-system through mitigative measures.

2. Improvement of water resources through Soil & Moisture Conservation measures by catchment area treatment on watershed principles.

3. Habit improvement through improvement of fodder availability and protection from fire.

4. Publicity and awareness – conservation education to the stakeholders for protecting Flora and Fauna.

Therefore, it is mandatory for addressing the problems expected consequential for "Construction of BT Road from Sirpur to Methandani via Cheelapally, Limbuguda, from KM. 0/0 to 24/0 of Reserve Forest Garlapet in Compt No. 87,47, 49, 48, 54, 53, 57, 31 and 39 in Wildlife area in order to achieve the objectives the operations of Gap plantations and SMC works are proposed to improve the vegetation status in the area. Since it is a wildlife area, the wildlife protection and habitat improvement works like fodder development, fire protection and publicity and proposed.
