1. Whereas under section 4 of the Punjab Land Preservation Act, 1900 there is a provision of imposing temporary regulations, restrictions or prohibitions in areas governed under the Act.
2. Whereas Punjab Government while giving effect to the provisions of the Punjab Land Preservation Act 1900, imposed certain temporary regulations, restrictions or prohibitions with regard to Clearing, breaking and cultivation of the land, quarrying of stones, burning of lime, cutting of trees or timber or collection or removal of any forest produce, the admission, herding, pasturing or retention of any cattle etc. in detailed areas as contained in the schedules of the Punjab Government, notifications in respect of villages given in Table below (total area of these villages also given in annexure III) :-

3. (a) Whereas the State Government filed an affidavit dated 21.02.1997 detailing action taken for cessation of all non-forest activities in forest areas (both government and private) in the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India concerning the interim orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Writ Petition (Civil) 202/1995 and a copy of the report regarding the details of government/private forests (name, location, area, legal status), details of areas once forests but presently degraded/denuded and details of plantation (government/private) were enclosed with the affidavit as Annexure-Ci

(b) The State Government in the affidavit dated October 1999 submitted that the Expert Committee constituted by the State Government included cultivated/habitation areas closed under Punjab Land Preservation Act, 1900 in the list of forest areas only because these areas were included in the Annual Administrative Reports of the Department as "Areas closed under the PLPA, 1900" and the State Government informed and apprised the Hon'ble Supreme Court of the views and in-principal decision of the State Government to delete all those areas closed under PLPA, 1900 which were under cultivation and habitation from the list of forest areas as contained in Annexure-G enclosed with the aforesaid affidavit dated 21.02.1997.

4. Whereas on 9.9.2005, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in IA No. 976 in IA No. 727 ordered Ministry of Environment & Forests to consider the proposal of the State of Punjab as contained in communication dated 4th July, 2000 in accordance with the rules, procedure and guidelines laid down under Forest Conservation Act, 1980 and the lands to be considered would be such lands which are under bona-fide agricultural use.

(PART I)

(a) Whereas in compliance of the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 7.9.2005, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India vide F.No. 8-19/2006-FC dated 16th March 2006 conveyed in-principal approval to de-list 65,670.26 ha. Cultivated and habitation areas closed under Punjab Land Preservation Act, 1900 from the list of forest areas for bona-fide agricultural use and other livelihood needs subject to the following conditions:

- (i) The State Government shall ensure that no commercial activity is permitted on such de-listed land.
- (ii) The de-listed land shall be used only for bona fide use for agriculture and for sustaining the livelihood of the people/owner of the land.
- (iii) A detailed list of such lands showing the land use and status of such land before 25.10.1980 and after that, up to 12.12.1996, shall be furnished to this Ministry before final approval.

(b) Further, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India vide F. No. 8-19/2006-FC dated 24th July, 2009 conveyed approval for delisting of 55339.95 ha. Cultivated and habitation area closed under Punjab Land Preservation Act, 1900 subject to the following conditions:

- (i) The State Government shall ensure that no commercial activities are permitted on such de-listed land;
- (ii) The de-listed land shall be used only for bona fide use of agriculture and for sustaining the livelihood of the people/owner of the land.
- (iii) If inadvertently, any notified or otherwise forest areas are found to have been included in the present list of areas being considered for de-listing, such areas shall not be deemed to have been de-listed from the list of forest areas of the State.

6. Therefore, keeping in view the above, in as far as areas of villages covered under notifications as contained in Table-I above are concerned, the Governor of Punjab is pleased to delist/denotify the land measuring 7731.02 ha. Cultivated and habitation area of these Villages closed under section 4 PLPA, 1900 comprised in the Khasra numbers as detailed in columns related to the year 1996 in Annexure-I, and also from the list of forest areas, as contained in Annexure-G enclosed with the affidavit dated 21.2.1997 of the State Government in Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in Writ Petition (Civil) No. 202 of 1995. Consequently, the restrictions, regulations and prohibitions imposed under Section 4 of PLPA, 1900 shall cease to be applicable in the delisted areas as detailed in Annexure 1 of this notification.

7. The above deletion is subject to the final judgment in Civil Appeal No. 4682-4683 of 2005 of B.S. Sandhu Government of India and Others, Civil Appeal No. 4798 of 2005 of Bhartiya Kisan Union TH. Vice President Vs. State of Punjab and others, Civil Appeal No. 4799-4800 of 2005 of Suresh Sharma and others Vs. B.S. Sandhu and others, Special Leave Petition (Criminal) No. 7647 of 2009 with Criminal Misc. No. 17535 of 2009 of Harsh Kumar Sharma vs. Central Bureau of Investigation & others and SLP No. 9461 of 2006 IIT College of Engineering, Pojewal Vs. State of Punjab pending before Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

8. This de-listed area will be administered in accordance with the decisions taken in the meeting held under Chairmanship of Worthy Chief Secretary, Punjab on 26.04.2010 as contained in the proceedings issued vide Punjab Government Memo No. 39/578/2005-Forest-3/2945 dated 04.05.2010 (copy enclosed at Annexure- II).

9. Where as in respect of the areas that were closed vide Notification No. 43(43) Ft-3-84/1313 dt. 31-01-1985 except those which stand delisted by Government of India and hence included in annexure-I of this notification, Governor of Punjab, having satisfied after due enquiry about desirability to provide for the conservation of sub-soil water and the prevention of erosion and also likely to become liable to erosion, that the regulations, restrictions or prohibitions here-in-after specified, are necessary for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of the said act, the Governor of the Punjab in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the said Act, is pleased to prohibit the following acts in such areas for a period of 20 years from the date of notification.

- i) The cultivation, clearing or breaking up (by using heavy machinery, that is, JCBs, bulldozers, earth movers etc. or otherwise) land areas included as per main para above, unless the breaking up of such land areas for cultivation or otherwise is done after obtaining permission of the Divisional Forest Officer, Dasuya.
- ii) The quarrying of stone, sand and soil or the burning of lime at places where such stone or lime had not ordinarily been so quarried or burnt prior to the publication of the said notification, except with the permission of the Divisional Forest Officer, Dasuya.
- iii) The cutting and lopping of trees or timber or the collection or removal or subsection to any manufacturing process of any forest produce other than grass, flower, fruit and honey, save for bonafide domestic or agricultural purposes provided that the owners of the land may sell

trees or timber after first obtaining a permit to do so from the Divisional Forest Officer, Dasuya Forest Division. Such permits will prescribe such conditions for sale as may from time to time appear necessary in the interest of the forest conservancy.

- v) The setting on fire to trees, timber or forest produce and
- vi) The admission, herding, pasturing or retention of goats and camels provided that in cases where sickness necessitates the keeping of goats for milk, Divisional Forest Officer, Dasuya Forest Division, may issue a permit at his discretion for the retention of a limited number of stalled goats to be specified for a specified period.
