Sukinda Mines (Chromite) of M/s IMFA Ltd. is an ongoing mining project for exploitation of chromite ore confined over M.L area of 116.76 ha. comprising forest land 115.05 ha. and non-forest land 1.71 ha. as per Sabik RoR as on 25.10.1980. The mining lease deed with respect to 116.76 have been duly executed and the mining operation is continuing under the provision of MMDR ammendement Act 2015. The User Agency has already paid the N.P.V over 115.05 ha. forest land (as per Sabik RoR i.e as on 25.10.1980) involved in the project. The User Agency has also paid the proportionate cost of wildlife management plan over the M.L area of 116.76 ha. Besides the User Agency has also obtained mandatory clearance like Environment clearance, consent to operate from State Pollution Control Board etc. In view of the above circumstances and as per the guideline dt.10.03.2015 of Govt. of India, MoEF&CC and letter No.5415/F&E dt 30.03.2015 of Govt. of Odisha, the proposal for diversion of 115.05 ha. revenue forest land i.e as on 25.10.1980 as submitted by the User Agency is recommended for approval under section 2 of Forest (Conservation) Act 1980.
