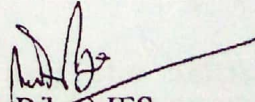
Dear Sir,

Apropos of your letter dtd. 22nd instant it is to furnish the Geo-co-ordinates of Namdapha Tiger Reserve as under:

Geo Coordinates: Starting in south at 96°27'0"E & 27°18'0" N and hugging with Indo-Myanmar International Border upto 96°49'0"E & 27°19'0" N. These Geo-coordinates have been derived from original Topo Sheets No. 92 A-7, A-11 and A-15. For further description of boundaries of Namdapha Tiger Reserve the copy of original notification of Namdapha Wildlife Sanctuary or that of Namdapha National Park may be referred to. The present day Namdapha Tiger Reserve was initially & Wildlife Sanctuary which was later in 1983 upgraded into a National Park and in the same year it attained the status of a Tiger Reserve with same boundary and within the same area. A copy of the notification of upgradation of Namdapha Wildlife Sanctuary into National Park is also enclosed herewith for your needful please.

NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 35 of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, the Lieutenant Governor of Arunachal Pradesh is pleased to declare the Namdapha Wildlife Sanctuary as described below and notified vide Government Notification No. FOR. 119/62 dated 2.10.82 ^{Handwritten: annex to P-2} as Namdapha National Park in which all the relevant provisions of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 or any other rules made thereunder and as amended from time to time shall apply for the purpose of protecting and developing wild life therein.

SCHEDULE

72 Gylus
Name of District : Tirap District, Arunachal Pradesh.
Name of the Sanctuary : Namdapha.
Approximate area : 1,80,782 hectares (695 Sq. miles).
Description of boundaries: *698 Sq miles*

North:- From the summit of Champhai Bum east along the boundary between TIRAP and LOHIT district i.e. the ridge dividing the water sheds of Kamlang and Diyun rivers to the INDO-BURMA International boundary near the source of the LATI river through Dapha Bum.

East:- From the above point south along the INDO-BURMA International boundary to the source of TILUNG Aka at point 12533, thence downstream to its confluence with Diyun river, *thence* for about half a mile to the confluence of a nameless stream at grid reference NS 416,804 at grid reference NS 410, 744 thence upstream to its source, thence in a North Westerly direction along the ridge of the hill to point 6472 at grid reference NS.380, 700 at Patkoi Range.

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South:-

From the above point at grid reference NS 380, 780 west along the INDO-BURMA International boundary to the source of a nameless stream that originates from its source at point 4557 at grid reference NS 975, 750 at Patkoi Range.

West:-

From the above source thence down-stream to its confluence with Namphuk, thence downstream along NAMPHUK river to the confluence of KORVAIWA, then upstream of main KORVAIWA to the confluence of its North Western channel which originates from its sources at about 1 mile 2 furlongs North of TENG BUM, thence upstream of this channel to its source thence in a westerly direction along the ridge dividing the watersheds of NANON and KURCHAI Hka to ANON BUM, thence across the ridge to the source of M'pen Hkato NANON BUM, thence across the ridge to the source of M'pen Hka, thence downstream along M'PEN Hka to MIAO-VIJAYNAGAR Road thence east along the Miao-Vijayanagar Road the PATIP Hka thence downstream PATIP Hka to its confluence with NOA-DEHING or DIYUN river thence along the left bank of NOA-DEHING or Diyun river to a point at grid reference NS 070, 971 thence across NOA-DEHING or DIYUN river to the confluence of a nameless stream which originates from the point 6490 at the North at grid reference NM 140, 028 thence upstream to its source thence West along the foot-path from HPUNG-AN at a bearing of 277° until it meets NAMDAPHA river in straight line at bearing of 290° to the sources of NSHONG Hka, thence downstream of NSHONG Hka until it meets PAKAN NAMDAPHA foot-path thence west along the PAKAN NAMDAPHA foot-path to LONGKAI stream, thence in a north westerly direction in straight line at a bearing of 325° to NAMSQ SORAL stream to its confluence with DEBAN river thence upstream of DEBAN river to the confluence of a nameless stream at reference NM 905, 104 which originates from its source at grid reference NM 901, 158 below CHAMPHAT BUM, thence up the nameless stream to its source, thence North straight to the starting point.

NOTE:-The boundaries of this National Park are described with reference to Survey of India Map Sheet Nos. 92 A/NU, 910/SW, 92A/NE & 92A/SE. Scale 1" = 2 miles (reprinted 1942).

This notification supersedes the earlier Notification No. FOR.119/62 dated 2.10.72.
