




1	Name of the Organization	:	Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Department - TELANGANA DRINKING WATER SUPPLY PROJECT
2	Aims and Objectives of the Proposed Project	:	This Project "TELANGANA DRINKING WATER SUPPLY PROJECT for Laying of pipe lines and Construction of other structures for providing safe drinking water to Mulug, Constituency, Warangal District Segment 20/2 – Mangapet " is designed to supply drinking water to Gram Panchayats, Urban Municipalities and to meet the needs of industries through distribution pipelines and balancing reservoirs. The scheme envisages lifting (pumping) water from sources and distribution in an optimised manner without affecting wildlife habitat. Diversion of 1.989 Ha. in Warangal North Division-0.388 Hectares, Warangal North ESZ Division – 1.601 Hectares of Forest land for 'Laying of pipe lines and Construction of other structures for providing safe drinking water to Mulug Constituency, Warangal District, Segment 20/2 Mangapet ".

I	Brief history of the Protected Area.	:	Eturnagaram Wildlife Sanctuary is one of the oldest sanctuaries of Telengana. It is spread at a distance of 806 sq.km in Warangal district. It is located at a distance of 90 km. from Warangal and 250 km. from Hyderabad. In Eturnagaram Wildlife Sanctuary one can find forests that contain southern tropical dry deciduous type of teak and its associates like Thiruman, Maddi, Bamboo etc. Eturnagaram Wildlife sanctuary is also rich in wildlife including, numerous endangered animals like Tiger, Sloth Bear, Four Horned Antelope, Chinkara, and Black Buck etc.
II	Current status of Wildlife	:	The sanctuary is abode for many species of Eturnagaram Wildlife Sanctuary is said to be one of beautiful places on the earth as has greener pastures. Especially during winter Animals like Tiger, Wild Dogs, Panthers, Storks, Foxes Hyena, Gaurs, Teals, Spotted Deer's, Pythons, Jackals, Ducks, Sloth Bears, Nilgai, and Sambars.

		:	The sanctuary flourishes with many varieties of flora as shown below. Adina Cordifolia (1), Albizia (1), Amla (1), Babul (1), Bamboo (5), Bambusa Arundinacea (1), Bombax Ceiba (1), Bridelia Retusa (1), Eichornia (1), Flacourtia (1), Garuga Pinnata (1), Lagerstroemia Lanceolata (1), Latifolia (1), Mahua (2), Mango (1), Palash (1), Picus (1), Sandalwood (1), Teak (5), Tendu (1), Terminalia (4), Typha (1), Vallisneria (1) etc.
III	Current status of pressures on protected Areas.	:	Pressures on sanctuary are multifarious including illegal lopping, grazing, forest fire, expansion of agricultural fields etc. The department is taking all measures to reduce the pressure and also taking up habitat improvement activities.
