Ajmer, the 25th March 1950

DECLARATION.

No. 479/50-Admn(ii).—The waste and hilly lands described below being required for the purposes of a State Forest are hereby under the orders of the Chief Commissioner taken up for such purposes and the present declaration is made and published under Section 3 of the Ajmer Forest Regulation 1874 (VI of 1874) :—

1. AJAISER-BUDHWARA BLOCK.

This tract is comprised of parts of following villages with their areas as under :—

It is demarcated by 159 Kacha Pillars, total chainage being 23 miles 65 chains.

North.—The demarcation line starts from pillar No. 1, situated on the eastern boundary of village Surajkund and runs towards south eastern direction for a distance of about 26.50 chains upto Pillar No. 4, situated at the junction point of villages Surajkund and Kharekri. From pillar No. 4, the line runs towards east along northern boundary of village Kharekri for a distance of about 30.00 chains upto pillar No. 7, situated on the junction point of villages Pushkar, Hathikhera and Kharekri, then towards south east for about 42.00 chains upto pillar No. 10, finally towards east again for about 30.50 chains upto pillar No. 13. From pillar No. 13, the line then turns towards south western direction through village Kharekri in a zig zag manner for a distance of about 14.75 chains upto pillar No. 25, then towards south east for about 8.00 chains upto pillar No. 26, finally towards south west again for about 43.00 chains upto pillar No. 29. From pillar No. 29, the line then turns towards south eastern direction still through village Kharekri for a distance of about 96.25 chains upto pillar No. 38, situated on the boundary of villages Kharekri and Ajaiser. From pillar No. 38, the line then goes towards north eastern direction through village Ajaiser for a distance of about 46.00 chains upto pillar No. 41, then towards south east for about 16.00 chains upto pillar No. 42, finally towards north east for about 92.25 chains upto pillar No. 48. From pillar No. 48, the line first goes towards south east for about 5.75 chains upto pillar No. 51, then towards north for about 9.50 chains upto pillar No. 53. From pillar No. 53, the line goes towards north eastern direction still through village Ajaiser for a distance of about 58.75 chains upto pillar No. 57, then towards north east for about 17.50 chains upto pillar No. 58, situated on the north eastern boundary of village Ajaiser. From pillar No. 58, the line then runs along boundary of village Ajaiser towards north eastern direction for about 13.00 chains upto pillar No. 59, then towards south east along the same village boundary for about 31.25 chains upto pillar No. 61.

East.—From pillar No. 61, the demarcation line runs towards south western direction along eastern boundary of village Ajaiser for about 226.50 chains upto pillar

No. 80, situated at the junction point of villages Ajaiser and Amba-Masina.

South.—From pillar No. 80, the line then goes along eastern boundary of village Amba-Masina towards north western direction for a distance of about 12.00 chains upto pillar No. 81, then towards west through village Amba-Masina for about 12.00 chains upto pillar No. 82. From pillar No. 82, the line first goes towards north west for about 18.00 chains upto pillar No. 83; then towards west for about 24.50 chains upto pillar No. 84. From pillar No. 84, the line turns towards south western direction for a distance of about 67.25 chains upto pillar No. 88, situated on the common boundary of villages Amba-Masina and Bhaonta. From pillar No. 88, the line goes towards north western direction through village Bhaonta, in a zig zag manner for a distance of about 37.00 chains upto pillar No. 93, then towards south west for about 55.00 chains upto pillar No. 97, finally practically towards west for about 29.50 chains upto pillar No. 98. From pillar No. 98, the line turns towards south west still through village Bhaonta for a distance of about 75.25 chains upto pillar No. 105, then towards west in a zig zag manner for about 32.50 chains upto pillar No. 108, situated on the common boundary of villages Bhaonta and Nuriawas. From pillar No. 108, the line then enters village Nuriawas and runs towards north western direction through it for a distance of about 10.25 chains upto pillar No. 109, then towards south west for about 27.25 chains upto pillar No. 112. From pillar No. 112, the line goes towards west for about 14.50 chains upto pillar No. 113, then towards north west for about 13.50 chains upto pillar No. 114, situated on the common boundary of villages Nuriawas and Budhwara.

West.—From pillar No. 114, the demarcation line goes towards north eastern direction through village Budhwara for a distance of about 84.00 chains upto pillar No. 123, crossing boundary of villages Picholian and Budhwara at pillar No. 119. From pillar No. 123, the line runs towards south east for about 12.50 chains upto pillar No. 124. From pillar No. 124, the line then goes towards east for about 18.00 chains upto pillar No. 126, then towards north east in a zig zag manner for about 237.00 chains upto pillar No. 145, situated on the common boundary of villages Bhagwanpura and Picholian. From pillar No. 145, the line still goes towards north eastern direction but through village Bhagwanpura for a distance of about 45.00 chains upto pillar No. 149, situated on the common boundary of villages Surajkund and Bhagwanpura. From pillar No. 149, the line goes towards north western direction along southern boundary of village Surajkund for about 24.00 chains upto pillar No. 151. From pillar No. 151, the line then goes towards north eastern direction through village Surajkund for about 99.50 chains upto pillar No. 1, the original starting point.

2. KAREL-NAND BLOCK.

This tract is comprised of parts of following villages with area as under :—

It is demarcated by 231 Kacha pillars, total chainage being 28 miles 45 chains.

North.—The demarcation line starts from pillar No. 1, situated on the western junction point of Karel and Marwar and runs towards east along village boundary for about 19.00 chains upto pillar No. 3.

East.—From pillar No. 3, the line turns towards south through village Karel for about 91.00 chains upto pillar

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26, situated at the south western corner of Bibi Chila Garden. From pillar No. 26, the line again turns towards north eastern direction running along western boundary of Bibi Chila Garden for a distance of about 1.00 chains upto pillar No. 27. From pillar No. 27, the line goes towards north western direction through village Ajmer for about 5.50 chains to meet pillar No. 12 of Ajmer Somalpur Block.

South.—From pillar No. 12 of Ajmer Somalpur Block to pillar No. 5 of Taragarh State Forest the boundary of this block under reference remains same.

West.—From pillar No. 5 of Taragarh State Forest to pillar No. 5; the starting point of this block under reference, the boundary of this block remains same.

3. BABAICHA BLOCK.

This tract is comprised of part of village Babaicha only with area as under :—

It is demarcated by 48 kacha pillars, total chainage being 6 miles 67 chains.

North.—The demarcation line starts from pillar No. 1, situated at the north western corner of village Babaicha and runs firstly towards south eastern direction along northern boundary of village Babaicha for a distance of about 7.50 chains upto pillar No. 2, then towards north eastern direction along the same village boundary for about 57.50 chains upto pillar No. 10 with a slight turn at pillar No. 5, towards south east, then towards same direction viz., north east from pillar No. 6. From pillar No. 10, the line goes towards south east through village Babaicha for about 3.00 chains upto pillar No. 11.

East.—From pillar No. 11, the line goes towards south west through village Babaicha for about 18.25 chains upto pillar No. 14. From pillar No. 14, the line goes towards south eastern direction for about 7.50 chains upto pillar No. 15, then towards south west for about 15.00 chains upto pillar No. 16. From pillar No. 16, the line goes towards north western direction still through village Babaicha for about 9.00 chains upto pillar No. 17. From pillar No. 17, the line first goes towards south eastern direction through village Babaicha for about 18.75 chains upto pillar No. 19, then towards south western direction for a distance of about 25.00 chains upto pillar No. 21. From pillar No. 21, it turns towards east for about 16.25 chains upto pillar No. 22, then towards south west for a distance of about 23.25 chains upto pillar No. 24. From pillar No. 24, the demarcation line then turns towards south east still through village Babaicha for a distance of about 13.75 chains upto pillar No. 25, then towards south western direction in a zigzag manner for a distance of about 109.75 chains upto pillar No. 35, situated at the southern boundary of village Babaicha.

South.—From pillar No. 35, the line takes its course towards north western direction along southern boundary of village Babaicha for a distance of about 23.00 chains upto pillar No. 37, situated on the south western corner of village Babaicha.

West.—From pillar No. 37, the line turns towards north eastern direction along western boundary of village Babaicha for a distance of about 57.75 chains upto pillar No. 41, then towards north along the same village boundary for about 62.75 chains upto pillar No. 45. From pillar No. 45, the line turns towards north eastern direction along the same western boundary of village Babaicha for a distance of about 68.50 chains to meet pillar No. 1, the original starting point.

20. HANSIAWAS-ARARKA BLOCK.

This tract is comprised of parts of following villages with areas as under :—

It is demarcated by 46 kacha pillars, total chainage being 8 miles 65 chains.

East.—The demarcation line starts from pillar No. 37 of Babaicha Block situated on north western corner of village Hansiawas and runs towards south eastern direction through village Hansiawas for about 23.50 chains upto pillar No. 1, from where, it first turns towards south west for about 21.50 chains upto pillar No. 2, then towards south eastern direction for about 24.25 chains upto pillar No. 3. From pillar No. 3, the line goes towards south western direction still through village Hansiawas for about 55.25 chains upto pillar No. 8, situated on the southern boundary of village Hansiawas. From pillar No. 8, the line enters village Ararka and runs towards west for about 9.50 chains upto pillar No. 9, then towards south western direction for a distance of about 139.00 chains upto pillar No. 20. From pillar No. 20, the line turns towards south east for about 16.50 chains upto pillar No. 21. From pillar No. 21, the line first goes towards south western direction still through village Ararka for about 31.50 chains upto pillar No. 24, then towards south east for about 25.75 chains upto pillar No. 26, situated on the southern boundary of village Ararka.

South.—From pillar No. 26, the line turns towards north western direction along southern boundary of village Ararka for about 54.50 chains upto pillar No. 30, situated on the south western corner of village Ararka.

West.—From pillar No. 30, the line then takes its course towards north eastern direction along western boundary of village Ararka for a distance of about 217.75 chains upto pillar No. 42, situated on the north western corner of village Ararka. From pillar No. 42, the line then runs along western boundary of village Hansiawas towards same direction viz., north eastern direction for a distance of about 86.25 chains to meet pillar No. 37 of Babaicha Block, the original starting point of this block.
