Short narrative of the proposal.

This proposal envisages diversion of 323.49 ha forest land under Section 2 of Forest Conservation Act for Purnadih OCP mine of Central Coalfields Limited The aforesaid forest land includes 170.89 ha of notified forest and 152.60 ha of GMKJJ.

No objection Certification in respect of 152.60 ha GMKJJ has issued earlier from DC, Chatra. A copy of the same is enclosed along with hard copy submission of proposal. However all these GMK land Jungle Jhari has been settled and converted in to tenancy land. A list of indicated date of possession by raiyat with land details is enclosed in hard copy in the proposal.

So far FRA is concerned as per clause 3 (e) of the Gazette Notification dated 14th March 2014, the DC, Chatra is to issue the FRA Certificate and forward directly to the Office of the Conservator of Forest, Chatra. DC Chatra has to issue FRA certificate for entire forest land including GMK JJ. The prospecting of the mineral has been done way back when permission was not required under Forest Conservation Act 1980.

As per directive of Ministry of Coal, Govt. of India, the mining plan has been formulated by CMPDI, Ranchi, a subsidiary of Coal India Limited and approval of mining plan has been done by CCL Board. Copy of the same are off loaded online.

Regarding R&R Plan and Scheme of the Project, this is to state CCL is a Govt. of India undertaking under Ministry of Coal, Govt. of India. The Mining plan/Project Report of its mines are prepared by another Govt. of India company- CMPDIL and is approved by the board of Directors of CCL. The rehabilitation of project affected person is based upon the R&R policy of CIL and the expenditure is to be incurred for rehabilitation of project affected person along with benefit like infrastructure for R&R site/colony, economic compensation in lieu of land, employment benefit etc are an integral part of the Project report. The revised R&R policy 2012 is based on the deliberation of the inter ministerial committee set up vide O M 490191/2011/PRIW/I dated 1.07.2011 of ministry of coal, new Delhi and has been approved by CIL board on its 279th meeting held on 12th and 13th march 2012. Thus it does not require additional approval for Ministry of Tribal Affairs.
