

MITIGATIVE MEASURES TO BE TAKENUP IN THE FOREST AREA PROPOSED TO BE DIVERSION OF FOREST LAND TO AN EXTENT OF 2.337 HA OF FOREST LAND FOR IMPROVEMENT OF EXISTING ROAD FROM BEJJUR TO SOMINI IN BEJJUR MANDAL OF GUDEM RF OF BEJJUR RANGE OF KAGHAZNAGAR DIVISION IN FAVOUR OF DISTRICT PANCHAYAT RAJ ENGINEER, KUMRAMBHEEM ASIFABAD DISTRICT.

1. INTRODUCTION:

The total geographical area of Telangana State is 114840 Sq KM and the total forest area is 28809.08 Sq. Kms. which constitute to 25.19%., whereas the total geographical area of the Kaghaznagar division is 1,64,100 Ha. covering the forest area of 91719.31 Ha. in five Ranges constituting about 55.90%. The Kaghaznagar division lies between 19° 11' 30'' and 19° 37'30'' north latitudes and 79° 22' 30'' and 79° 59'0'' east longitudes.

The Kaghaznagar Division consisting of five Ranges, namely - Kaghaznagar, Sirpur, Karjelly, Penchikalpet & Bejjur Ranges.

The Forest area in the Ranges are being utilized as the Corridor for Kawal Tiger Reserve for attracting the Tigers from Thadoba Tiger Reserve of Maharashtra State and Indiravathi Tiger Reserve of Chattisghar State.

In the above scenario the District Panchayat Raj Engineer, Kumrambheem Asifabad District submitted proposals for **construction of Road from Bejjur to Somini** in Bejjur in Gudem RF blocks. The proposed road proposal falling in Bejjur Range of Kaghaznagar Division (Area 2.773 Hac). The details are shown below:

It is falling in Wildlife area and it is necessary to take up the mitigative measures to counter the consequential problems, in order to protect the flora and fauna.

The Following are the Consequential problems of construction of Road in Forest

area:

- 1) Biotic interference.
- 2) Depletion of Forest Flora.
- 3) Poaching of Wild Fauna.
- 4) Forest Fires.
- 5) Encroachments
- 6) Soil Erosion

4. Period of the Scheme:

The Conservation plan period is 3 years.

5. Objectives:

- 1. Protection and improvement of the eco-system through mitigative measures.
- 2. Improvement of water resources through Soil & Moisture Conservation measures by catchment area treatment on watershed principles.
- 3. Habitat improvement through improvement of fodder availability and protection from fire.
- 4. Publicity and awareness conservation education to the stakeholders for protecting Flora and Fauna.

Therefore it is mandatory for addressing the problems expected consequential for construction of Road from **Bejjur to Somini** in Wildlife area in order to achieve the objectives the operations of Gap plantations and SMC works are proposed to improve the vegetation status in the area. Since it is a wildlife area, the wildlife protection and habitat improvement works like fodder development, fire protection and publicity are proposed.

The item of works, quantity and amount required are submitted hereunder:
