**Subject:** Approval with regards to wildlife clearance of proposal no. FP/RJ/OFC/2694/2018 of 'laying optical fiber Reliance 4G Project within ROW from Pat Kalan to Umat Thoona for total length of 6.976 KM in Bassi Wildlife Sanctuary, District Chittorgarh, Rajasthan.

Sir,

With respect to above mentioned subject, the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Wildlife Division, Government of India vide letter No. F.No.6-175/2017/WL dated 19.02.2018 has delegated its power for sanctioning proposals on laying of drinking water pipeline and optical fiber cables along the right of way of the roads inside National Parks, Wildlife Sanctuaries and Tiger Reserves or any other Protected Area notified under the Wildlife (Protection) Act-1972 to State Board for Wildlife; subject to conditions specified in the referred letter. In pursuance of the said general directions of Government of India and approval accorded by State Board for Wildlife (by circulation) the in-principle approval was granted vide letter no. F. 8943 dated 22.03.2021.

In compliance of the conditions mentioned in the in-principle approval, user agency has deposited, 5% of the proportional project cost falling within the Protected Area, an amount of Rs 168819/- in RPACS account along with undertaking for compliance of the remaining conditions that requires continuous compliance, which have been certified by Deputy Conservator of Forest, (Wildlife) Chittorgarh and the same has been forwarded by Chief Conservator of Forest (WL) Udaipur vide letter No 1487 dated 26.08.2021.

Following conditions, in addition to the conditions laid down in the letter F.No.6-175/2017/WL dated 19.02.2018 requires continuous compliance.

1. No work shall be done before sunrise and after sunset in the project area.
2. No material of any kind should be extracted from the Protected Area and Eco-Sensitive Zone.
3. There will be no felling of trees and burning of fuel wood inside the Protected Area and Eco-Sensitive Zone.
4. The waste material generated should be disposed outside the Protected Area and Eco-Sensitive Zone.
5. There will be no labor camp within 1 km from the boundary of Protected Area.
6. The trench dug for laying the OFC should be filled and leveled after completion of the work.
7. No blasting will be carried out within 1 km from the boundary of Protected Area during the work.
8. There shall be no high mast/ beam/ search lights & high sounds within 1 km from the Protected Area boundary.



9. Signages regarding information about the wild animals in the area, control of the traffic volumes, speed etc. should be erected in the project area.
10. The user agency and project personnel will comply with the provisions of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.
11. Maintenance activity of any nature should be carried out only after seeking formal approval from competent authority of tiger reserve/PA.
12. The user agency and project personnel will comply with the provisions of Standard SOP/Guidelines issued by WII, Dehradun for linear projects.
13. Any permission / clearance required under FCA-1980 or other acts may be taken as per rules.
14. In condition of any increase in project cost during execution of the project, the difference amount should be deposited in RPACS account in addition to the amount deposited.

**Condition Imposed by SLSC of SBWL:-**

1. No generators or towers will be installed in the project area.

The Chief Wildlife Warden, Rajasthan, hereby accords approval under Section 29 of the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972, subject to submission of satisfactory annual compliance report of the conditions by User Agency. In case, any of the conditions imposed as parts of wildlife clearance have not been complied, this permission is liable to be cancelled.
