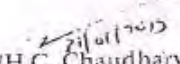
Sir,

Details of reclamation of OB Dumps and plantation made, in forest land diverted in RG-3 Area.

OB dump management:

RG OC-1: The present dump height is 100 m. & 120 m. The existing OB dump site(s) within ML area(old OC-I void area) will be maintained to the maximum height of 120m only consisting of each 4 benches of 25m and one bench is 20.0m with an ultimate dump slope of 28°. OB dump stability is being monitored regularly. Different size of overburden material is being dumped. Spreading of top soil on OB dumps will be taken up after final completion of dump. Grass plantation is being done on the dumps and 7 Nos. of rock fill dams were constructed in gulley's to compact the dump slopes.

RG OC-2: Ultimate dump slope will be maintained at an angle of 28 degrees height of the each deck is being maintained at 30 meters. Slope stability study is being carried out by CIMFR and CISRO. Monitoring of the dump slope stability is being done during the Monsoon and post monsoon seasons.

Further, for both the OC-1 and OC-2 projects Garland drain is provided around the over burden (OB) with settling tanks at the intersection of natural drains with the garland drain. On each deck, deck drain have been provided for proper coursing of rain water from uppers deck to lower decks to avoid formation of gullies and to prevent erosion of soil due to sudden run off of rain water on the slopes. Results are encouraging. Damage to the dump as well as dump slopes is reduced. Survival rate of plantation is improved.

Top soil management: Top soil is preserved for spreading on hard over burden dump for taking up plantation. Dumping top soil in heaps on the top of the dump is giving good results as rain water accumulates in the gap between the heaps of soil and facilitates better growth of the plant.

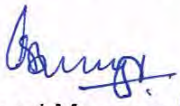
Total top soil preserved and spread in dumps of RG OC-1 is 1.41 M.Cu.m. and 1.6M.Cu.m respectively

Total top soil preserved and spread in dumps of RG OC-2 is 54.02 M.Cu.m. and 3.2 M.Cu.m. respectively

Plantation: Large scale plantation has been taken up during rainy season each year. All the finished dumps have been stabilized with plantation. Counter plantation has been practiced over slopes to arrest soil erosion. Green belts have been developed around the mine and dumps. Avenue plantation has been raised along the permanent haul roads, approach roads and coal transportation roads. Plantation has been carried out in premises of offices, workshop, stores, CHP and at view point. Total plantation covered in RG OC-1 and RG OC-2 is 172.80Ha and 355.84Ha respectively

1. **Bio-Engineering Works:** Special efforts are put in at OC-1 and OC-2 projects to improve the OB dumps stability by constructing various types of Bio-engineering structures. Bio-engineering structures like toe walls all around the external OB dump, settling ponds, check Dams, Rock fill Dams, Gabion Structures, Crib Structures, Drains on top of the dumps etc., had given positive results in OB dump stability of RG OC-1 and OC-2
- 2 **Water management:** the drainage pattern of the project is planned to course the rain water in the catchment area to the nearby Bokkalavagu used by the local villagers for agricultural purpose. Mine discharge water is being let out to the natural courses only after allowing suspended solids to settle in the settling ponds to avoid situation of Bokkalavagu.

Workshop effluents are being treated in the Effluent Treatment Plant (ETP) before letting out. A separate storage tank is arranged to use recycled water for the purpose of dust suppression.

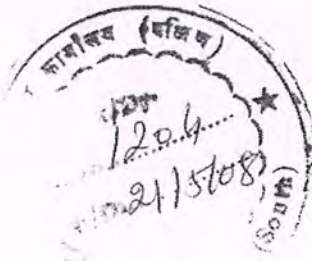

Sir.

I am directed to refer to State Government's letter No. 9683 / FOR.I (1) / 2005 dated 25.11.2005 on the subject cited above seeking prior approval of the Central Government under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. After careful consideration of the proposal by the Forest Advisory Committee constituted under Section-3 of the said Act, in-principle approval for the said Mining Lease was granted vide this Ministry's letter of even number dated 13.04.2006 subject to fulfillment of certain conditions. The State Government has furnished compliance report in respect of the conditions stipulated in the in-principle approval and has requested the Central Government to grant final approval.

2. In this connection, I am directed to say that on the basis of the compliance report furnished by the State Government vide letter No. 9683 / FOR.I (1) / 2005 -4 dated 21.11.2007, approval of the Central Government is hereby granted under Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 412.4 ha of forest land for underground mining of which 247 ha of for surface use for GDK-9, 10 & 10 A inclines in Ramagundam-II and OC- Project-I expansion, in favour of M/s SCCL in Andhra Pradesh subject to fulfillment of the following conditions:

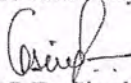
1. Legal status of forest land shall remain unchanged.
2. a Compensatory afforestation shall be raised and maintained by the State Forest Department at the project cost.
- b Fencing, protection and regeneration of the safety zone area (100 metres strip all along the outer boundary of the mining lease area as recommended by the State Government) shall be done at the project cost. Besides this, afforestation on degraded forest land, to be selected elsewhere, measuring one and a half times the area under safety zone, shall also be done at the project cost.

- c Wherever possible and technically feasible, the User Agency shall undertake afforestation measures in the blanks within the lease area, as well as along the roads outside the lease area diverted under this approval, in consultation with the State Forest Department at the project cost.
 - d The non-forest land identified for raising Compensatory Afforestation shall be notified by the State Government as RF under Section-4 or PF under Section-29 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 or under the relevant Section(s) of the local Forest Act, as the case may be, within a period of six months. The Nodal Officer (Forest Conservation) shall report compliance in this regard.
- 3 Following activities shall be undertaken by the User Agency at the project cost:
- (i) Proper mitigative measures to minimize soil erosion and choking of streams shall be prepared and implemented.
 - (ii) Planting of adequate drought hardy plant species and sowing of seeds to arrest soil erosion.
 - (iii) Construction of check dams, retention / toe walls to arrest sliding down of the excavated material along the contour.
 - (iv) The areas shall be reclaimed keeping in view the international practice of stabilising the dumps by grading / benching so that angles of repose (normally less than 28 at any given place) are maintained.
 - (v) The top soil management plan should be strictly adhered to.
- 4 The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the proposal.
- 5 The approval under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 is subject to the environmental clearance under the Environmental Protection Act, 1986.
- 6 The user agency will make arrangement for free supply of coal to labourers and staff working on the project site so as to avoid any pressure on the adjacent forest areas.
- 7 The period of permission for lease under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 will be for 20 years subject to possession of valid lease by User Agency under the MMDR Act, 1957.
- 8 Demarcation of mining lease area will be done on the ground at project cost using four feet high reinforced cement concrete pillars with serial numbers, forward & back bearings and distance from pillar to pillar.
- 9 Mining/reclamation schedule shall be implemented by the user agency at their cost as per Environmental Management Plan / phased programme.
- 10 The user agency shall take up afforestation and soil moisture conservations works inside

the forest area in 100 m radius from the permitted lease area in consultation with the forest department. Wherever the forest density is less than 0.4, gap plantation should be taken up.

11. The user agency shall also take up study on soil erosion / soil flow from the over-burden areas with the help of GIS in consultation with the forest department.
12. The user agency shall take up the de-silting of the village tanks within five km area from the mine lease boundary as a Corporate's social responsibility so as to mitigate the impact of siltation of such tanks if any.
13. In case of underground mining, the user agency shall take up plantation over the surface area wherever the forest density is less than 0.4. Gap planting should be taken up in the areas where density is between 0.4 and 0.7. The user agency will protect the area till the life of the underground mining in consultation with Forest Department.
14. Any other condition that the State Govt. or the Chief Conservator of Forests (Central), Regional Office, Bangalore may impose from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection or development of forests.

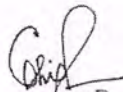

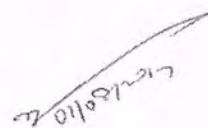
Sub: Diversion of 147.42 hectares of forest land in favour of SCCL for expansion of their Ramagundam OCP-II in RG-III area located in Adrial RF of Karimnagar East Division in Karimnagar district of Andhra Pradesh.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to Government of Andhra Pradesh's Letter No. 9659/ FOR.I (1)/2010 dated 28.01.2011 on the above mentioned subject, wherein prior approval of the Central Government for the diversion of 147.42 hectares of forest land in favour of SCCL for expansion of their Ramagundam OCP-II in RG-III area located in Adrial RF of Karimnagar East Division in Karimnagar district of Andhra Pradesh was sought, in accordance with Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. After careful consideration of the proposal by the Forest Advisory Committee constituted under section-3 of the afore-mentioned Act, stage-I approval for diversion of the said forest land was accorded by the Ministry vide its letter of even number dated 19th July 2012 read with corrigendum of even number dated 23rd July 2013, subject to fulfillment of certain conditions. The State Government has furnished compliance report in respect of the conditions stipulated in the stage-I approval and has requested the Central Government to grant final approval.

2. In this connection, I am directed to say that on the basis of the compliance report furnished by the State Government of Andhra Pradesh vide letter No. 9659/FOR.I (1)/2010 dated 29th May 2013, approval of the Central Government is hereby granted under section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 147.42 hectares of forest land in favour of SCCL for expansion of their Ramagundam OCP-II in RG-III area located in Adrial RF of Karimnagar East Division in Karimnagar district of Andhra Pradesh, subject to fulfilment of the following conditions:

- (i) Legal status of the diverted forest land shall remain unchanged;



- (ii) Compensatory afforestation over the non-forest land equal in extent to the forest land being diverted shall be raised and maintained by the State Forest Department from funds realized from the user agency;
- (iii) The non-forest land which is transferred and mutated in favour of the State Forest Department for the purpose of compensatory afforestation, shall be declared as Reserved Forest under Section-4 or Protected Forest under Section-29 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 or under the relevant Section(s) of the local Forest Act. The Nodal Officer, Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 must report compliance within a period of 6 months and send a copy of the original notification declaring the non-forest land under Section 4 or Section 29 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927, as the case may be, to the Central Government for information and record;
- (iv) Following activities shall be undertaken by the User Agency at the project cost:
 - (a) A plan containing appropriate mitigative measures to minimize soil erosion and choking of streams shall be prepared and implemented;
 - (b) Planting of adequate drought hardy plant species and sowing of seeds in the appropriate area within the mining lease to arrest soil erosion;
 - (c) Construction of check dams, retention / toe walls to arrest sliding down of the excavated material along the contour;
 - (d) Stabilize the overburden dumps by appropriate grading/benching so as to ensure that that angles of repose at any given place is less than 28°; and
 - (e) Strict adherence to the prescribed top soil management.
- (v) The State Government shall realize the additional amount of NPV, if so determined, as per the final decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and transfer the same to the ad-hoc CAMPA under intimation to this Ministry;
- (vi) The User Agency shall obtain the Environment Clearance as per the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, if required;
- (vii) The User Agency through the State Forest Department shall undertake fencing, protection and afforestation of the safety zone area (7.5 meter strip all along the outer boundary of the area identified to undertake mining), at the project cost;
- (viii) The User Agency through the State Forest Department shall undertake afforestation on degraded forest land, one and half time in extent to the area used for safety zone;
- (ix) The State Government shall create and maintain penal compensatory afforestation on additional non-forest land twice in extent to the 118.57 hectare forest land located in the Upperlakesoram Reserve Forest which was utilized for creation of compensatory afforestation treating it as non-forest land, from funds realized from the user agency;
- (x) The additional non-forest land double in extent to the 118.57 hectare forest land located in the Upperlakesoram Reserve Forest which was utilized for creation of compensatory

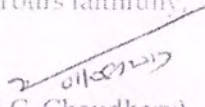
afforestation treating it as non-forest land, which has been transferred and mutated in favour of the State Forest Department creation of penal compensatory afforestation shall be notified as Reserved Forest under Section-4 or Protected Forest under Section-29 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 or under the relevant Section(s) of the local Forest Act. The Nodal Officer, Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 must report compliance within a period of 6 months and send a copy of the original notification declaring the non-forest land under Section 4 or Section 29 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927, or under the relevant Section(s) of the local Forest Act, as the case may be, to the Central Government for information and record;

- (xi) State Government shall create and maintain penal compensatory afforestation from funds realized from the user agency over degraded forest land twice in extent to the portion of the 448.90 hectares of forest land in the Upperlakesoram Reserved Forest Block kept under possession by the SCCL without obtaining approval under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, after excluding the 118.57 hectares of forest land which was utilised by the SCCL for creation of compensatory afforestation (CA) considering it as non-forest land for which penal CA has separately been stipulated [i.e. $2 \times (448.90 - 118.57) = 330.33 = 660.66$ hectares]
- (xii) The period of diversion of the said forest land under this approval shall be for a period co-terminus with the period of the mining lease proposed to be granted under the Mines and Minerals (Development & Regulation) Act, 1957, or Rules framed there under, subject to a maximum period of 30 years;
- (xiii) The user agency shall undertake de-silting of the village tanks and other water bodies located within five km from the mine lease boundary so as to mitigate the impact of siltation of such tanks/water bodies, whenever required;
- (xiv) The user agency shall undertake mining in a phased manner after taking due care for reclamation of the mined over area. The concurrent reclamation plan shall be executed by the user agency from the very first year, and an annual report on implementation thereof shall be submitted to the Nodal Officer, Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, Government of Andhra Pradesh and the Chief Conservator of Forests (Central), Ministry of Environment & Forests, Regional Office (Southern Zone), Bangalore. If it is found from the annual report that the activities indicated in the concurrent reclamation plan are not being executed by the User Agency, the Nodal Officer or the Chief Conservator of Forests (Central) may direct that the mining activities shall remain suspended till such time, such reclamation activities are satisfactorily executed;
- (xv) No labour camp shall be established on the forest land;
- (xvi) The User Agency shall provide firewood preferably alternate fuel to the labourers and the staff working at the site so as to avoid any damage and pressure on the adjacent forest areas;

- (xvii) The boundary of the mining lease and safety zone shall be demarcated on ground at the project cost, by erecting four feet high reinforced cement concrete pillars, each inscribed with its serial number, forward and back bearing and distance from pillar to pillar;
- (xviii) The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the proposal;
- (xix) Any other condition that the Regional Office (Southern Zone), Bangalore of this Ministry may stipulate, from time to time, in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife;
- (xx) The user agency shall submit annual report on status of compliance to conditions stipulated in this approval to the concerned Regional Office of this Ministry and the State Government of Andhra Pradesh; and
- (xxi) The User Agency and the State Government shall ensure compliance to provisions of the all Acts, Rules, Regulations and Guidelines, for the time being in force, as applicable to the project.

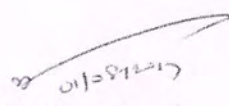

I am directed to refer to your letter No. 34930/Er.I/84-3 dated 15.1.86 on the above mentioned subject seeking prior approval of the Central Government in accordance with Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and to say that the proposal has been examined by the Advisory Committee constituted by the Central Government under Section-3 of the aforesaid Act.

2. After careful consideration of the proposal of the State Government and on the basis of the recommendation of the above mentioned Advisory Committee, the Central Govt. hereby conveys its approval under Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for release of 412.40 ha. of forest land in Khammam District for open cast mining and subject to the following conditions:-

- i. Legal Status of the forest will remain unchanged.
- ii. Compensatory plantation will be raised over equivalent non-forest land at the cost of the project. The non-forest land identified for this purpose should be handed over to the Forest Department and notified as Protected Forests before the release of forest lands now being diverted by these orders.
- iii. Mined over area should be reclaimed within a period of five years.
- iv. In order that the labour and staff while working on the Project in the forest area may not cause destruction to the forest area for meeting their fuelwood needs, the Project Authority will establish fuelwood depots, and will provide the fuelwood.
