(ii)	<p>There is discrepancy in the area proposed forest for diversion. As per proposal submitted the area is 342.870 ha whereas the software-calculated area as per DSS analysis is found to be 334.069 ha. Similarly, it has been mentioned that the project boundary area of dip-side is 1848.379 ha (Lease area 1781.591 ha) and its software-calculated area is found to be 1812.49 ha.</p> <p>The same needs verification and submission of correct KML files accordingly.</p>	<p>As per the current Forest Diversion Proposal (FDP), the proposed forest area to be diverted is 342.870 ha. The submitted KML for the forest diversion proposal is having an area of 342.78 ha.</p> <p>The KML showing the same is attached herewith in form of CD (Kindly refer Annexure-3 (a)).</p> <p>Further, the KML submitted for the project boundary area is showing the total area 1847.17 ha (Lease area 1781.3 ha). 		<p>The KML showing the same is attached herewith in form of CD (Kindly refer Annexure 3(b)).</p> <p>Moreover, it is to clarify that the Allotted area is as per the land records and the Map area is as per DGPS surveyed area.</p>		
(iii)	As per the mining plan, the total project area is 1848.379 ha and total forest land involved is 618.644 ha. The Ministry has accorded Stage-II approval for 276.655 ha and Stage-I approval has been accorded for 15.071 ha forest land. As per above details the non-diverted forest land remaining within the coal block is 326.918. However, the instant proposal has been submitted for 342.87 ha. The same needs to be verified and the total forest area within the project may be corrected accordingly.	<p>1. As per the approved Mining Plan (Rev III); the area details are as follows: Total project area – 1848.379 ha Total Forest area – 618.644 ha</p> <p>2. MoEF&CC accorded stage II approval for 276.655 ha wherein 76.19 ha area is considered as “treated forest as per dictionary meaning” and the same is also mentioned in Stage II approval accorded by MoEF&CC. The copy of same is attached as Annexure 4. Further, the area of 76.19 ha “treated as forest as per dictionary meaning” mentioned in Stage II approval is non-forest Government land which was considered only for calculation purpose of NPV due to natural growth of forest over the area, while the actual forest area which has been transferred by forest department to OCPL for diversion purpose is only 200.465 ha.</p>

Later on, OCPL has applied for the diversion of 15.701 ha forest area (i.e. left out patches) required to accommodate the OB dump etc. and obtained Stage I approval (copy attached as Annexure 5) from MoEF&CC vide letter dt. 20.10.2021.</p> <p>4. Further, MoEF&CC accorded Stage II approval to Odisha Power Generation Corporation Limited (OPGC; parent company of OCPL) for the diversion of 159.616 ha of forest land (copy attached as Annexure 6) for the purpose of Railway Siding (MGR network from Manoharpur Coal mine to end use power plant); out of which OPGC has transferred 57.078 ha forest area to OCPL to develop the infrastructure area (copy attached as Annexure 7).</p> <p>5. Hence, the forest land available for diversion/already diverted is = 200.465 ha + 15.701 ha + 57.078 ha = 273.244 ha</p> <p>6. Thus the remaining forest area left for diversion is 345.40 ha (618.644 ha – 273.244 ha); but after verification of the land records it was observed that the total forest area comes out to 342.87 ha only. The authenticated land schedule duly certified by Tahasildar, Hemgir and DFO, Sundargarh is attached herewith as Annexure 8.</p> <p>7. A copy of letter issued by DFO, Sundargarh Forest Division along with land details to the CEO, ORSAC for authentication is enclosed as Annexure 9.</p> <p>8. 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(xi)	As per DSS analysis, agriculture land, solid structure and road is visible in the forest area proposed for diversion which needs clarification.	<p>The total forest area proposed for diversion is 342.87 ha; out of which 166.28 ha is revenue forest and 176.59 ha reserve forest.</p> <p>Further the agricultural land, solid structure & road visible in the forest area is because of the village Kathfali and Parmanandpur which are falling in the proposed coal block area having the agricultural land, solid structure & road due to connectivity for villagers. Before extraction of coal from the proposed area, the said villages will be displaced. The land acquisition process for the same has already been initiated by the user agency under Coal Bearing Areas (Acquisition and Development) Act, 1957. The copy of gazette notification issued by Ministry of Coal (MoC), Govt. of India (GoI) in this regard is attached as Annexure 15.</p>
(xii)	Since, a combined mining plan has been formulated for Manoharpur and dip side Manoharpur, therefore there is a possibility of change in land use in case of already diverted area and the area for which Stage-1 approval has been issued by the Ministry. Therefore, a comparative analysis of the approved land use as per earlier diversion proposals and the proposed land use as per combined mining plan shall be submitted.	<p>Forest area accorded Stage II approval by MoEF&CC for diversion – 276.655 ha Forest area for which Stage I approval is accorded by MoEF&CC – 15.701 ha</p> <p>A table showing the comparative analysis of approved land use as per earlier diversion proposals (i.e. 276.655 ha and 15.701 ha) and the proposed land use as per combined mining plan is attached as Annexure 16.</p>

(xiv)	The area contains road, power line and nalla which require diversion as per the mining plan, however, it is not clear whether these diversions are part of the proposal or whether other agencies such as PWD and State Water Resource Department will take the permission under FCA or related laws.	<p>The public road has already been diverted by OCPL and the same has been handed over to RD (Rural Development) department and copy of same is attached as Annexure 17. The power line has also been diverted (i.e. 11 km) by OCPL and handed over to WESCO and copy of same is attached as Annexure 18. Further, the approval for diversion of Garia nalla and Iapani nalla has been obtained by OCPL from Dept. of water Resources (DoWR), Bhubaneswar and the copy of same is attached as Annexure 19.</p>
(xv)	The status of the safety zone in already approved and mined out area needs to be clarified by the State.	The manoharpur mine is in its fifth year of operation and the mine is extended towards the block boundary only in the north direction. Accordingly, all the measures including fencing and plantation has been carried out in the safety zone area falling within the existing mine operation.
(xvi)	It has been mentioned in the Mining plan that forestland requirement was modified and finalized in the latest approved Mining Plan as 273.288 Ha against 200.465 Ha as per earlier mining plan and out of this additional forest land, approval of diversion of 57.08 Ha of forest land has already been obtained separately by OPGC for MGR & same has been transferred in favour of OCPL. The details of the said proposal along with the reasons/justification for submission of proposals in piecemeal shall also be submitted.	<p>The forest clearance for the Manoharpur Coal Mine has been obtained vide letter F.No.8-63/2011-FC dated 20.08.2014 and transferred to OCPL vide letter dt. 30.11.2015 for 276.655 Ha.</p> <p>To cater the power requirement of mine, CHP and other associated infrastructure and also to have the consistent power supply, it has been planned to source the power from NTPC Darlipali power station apart from the supply from Remja Grid of OPTCL.</p> <p>Accordingly, the proposal for diversion of 5.777 Ha has been submitted by OCPL on 11.01.2019, which is required for the construction of 33 KV power transmission overhead line from NTPC Darlipali to OCPL sub station for catering the power requirement of Manoharpur mine.</p> <p>Stage-I for diversion of 5.777 ha forest area obtained vide letter dt. 31.07.2020 is attached as Annexure 21. The compliance to Stage I conditions submitted for Stage II approval has been forwarded to higher quarter and the same is under process.</p>

The component wise breakup for 64.14 Ha has been submitted at Page no. 27 of the FDP. Further, the copy of same is attached as Annexure 22 .
(xix)	As per the proposal 64.14 ha area has been proposed for Allied Infrastructure out of which 51.64 ha is for OB dump. The justification for proposing these non-site specific activities on forest land shall be submitted.	Justification for use of forest land for Allied Infrastructure including OB dump has been certified by CMPDI and the copy of same is attached as Annexure 23 .

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(xx)	As per the Cost benefit analysis uploaded in Part-1, the CB ratio has been estimated to be 1:56 which seems to be on higher side. The same may be rechecked and the CB ration as per the CB parameters/format specified in the guidelines be submitted.	The revised cost benefit analysis based on CB parameters/format specified in the guidelines and duly certified by DFO, Sundargarh is attached as Annexure 24 .
