All lease pillars are posted and intact. 16-17 households have been staying Nuagaon village for last min 30 years who needs to be rehabilitated. M/s Rungta Mines Transmission line is passing through left corner of the lease whose proposal for rerouting from outside the lease has already received Stage-II clearance. ESL Vedanta Mines is adjacent to present lease sharing common boundary but in Sundergarh district and Bonai Forest Division.
