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The Prl. Chief Conservator of Forests (Head of Forest Force), Andhra Pradesh has informed that the DGPS surveyed raw data & maps received for diversion of Forest land in Compartment No. 102, Janapadu RF, Guntur Division for quarry lease for Lime stone (Minor) filed by Sri G. Pavan Kumar Reddy has been verified authenticated and the area assessed is 4.84 ha (i.e., 3.99 ha. For mining + 0.77 ha. For Safety Zone area + 0.04 ha. For Dumping area + 0.04 ha for Magazine Area) and requested the Conservator of Forests, Guntur to issue necessary instructions to the concerned Divisional Forest Officer to verify the same with the Gazette Notification of the RF block and release the authenticated maps to the user agency duly signing on the maps and collecting an amount of Rs.12,000/-.

Sri Gottimukkala Pavan Kumar Reddy resident of Piduguralla Town has filed an application before the District Collector, Guntur requesting for issue of RoFR certificate in Form-II for diversion of 4.84 Ha of forest land in Compartment No.102 of Janapadu Reserve Forest, Nekarikallu Section, Guntur Range for mining purpose

The Revenue Divisional Officer, Gurazala, has submitted a report basing on the report of the Tahsildar, Piduguralla holding that:

- The present proposal 4.84 Ha of Forest land situated in Compartment No.102 i. of Janapadu Reserve Forest for mining of Lime Stone in favour of Sri Gottimukkala Pavan Kumar Reddy S/o Rami Reddy resident of Piduguralla Town & Mandal.
  - A1 Notice was published on 05-06-2021 in the 4.84 Ha of Forest land situated il. in Compartment No.102 of Janapadu Reserve Forest calling for objections if any for mining of Lime Stone and no objections were not received within stipulated time.

- Village level committee also convened a meeting and passed a resolution granting no objection for diversion of the Forest land to an extent of 4.84 Ha situated in compartment No.102 of Janapadu Reserved Forest for mining of Lime Stone.
- iv. The Tahsildar, Piduguralla has stated that there is no interruption to conservation of reserve forest and to the flora and fauna and also there is no threat to the standard living and livelihood of tribals situated in the proposed forest land to an extent of 4.84 Ha situated in compartment No.102 of Janapadu Reserve Forest for mining of Lime Stone through forest land.

The Revenue Divisional Officer, Gurazala further stated that a meeting with the Revenue Authorities, Forest officials and Asst. Tribal Welfare Officer, Macherla and authorities of RoFR Sub Divisional level committee members and resolved to issue ROFR certificate in Annexure-I to the applicant Sri Gottimukkala Pavan Kumar Reddy for diversion of forest land to an extent of 4.84 Ha situated in compartment no.102 of Janapadu Reserve Forest for mining purpose.

As per Rule 6(3)(e) of Forest (Conservation) Rules, 2003 [as amended vide the Forest (Conservation) Amendment Rules 2014; Forest (Conservation) Second Amendment Rules 2014; and Forest (conservation) Amendment Rules 2016], the sub-divisional level and District Level RoFR Committee should be convened and to be resolved that the proposed area does not involve recognized rights of Primitive Tribal Groups and Pre-Agriculture Communities.

Thereby Sub-Divisional Level RoFR Committee convened a meeting on 30.07.2021 with the Revenue Authorities, Forest officials and Asst. Tribal Welfare Officer, Macherla and authorities of RoFR Sub Divisional level committee members and resolved to issue ROFR certificate in Annexure-I to the applicant Sri Gottimukkala Pavan Kumar Reddy for diversion of forest land to an extent of 4.84 Ha situated in compartment No.102 of Janapadu Reserve Forest for mining purpose.

Keeping the above all circumstances, now, the District Level Recognition of Forest Rights (RoFR) Committee resolved that the complete process of recognition and vesting of Forest Rights under the FRA has been carried out for the entire 4.84 Ha of Forest Land proposed for diversion and the proposed area does not involve recognized rights of Primitive Tribal Groups and Pre-Agriculture Communities and recommended for diversion of Reserve Forest land to an extent of 4.84 Ha situated in compartment No.102 of Janapadu Reserve Forest for mining purpose and to Issue Form-I Certificate by the District Collector as per Rule 6(3)(e) of Forest (Conservation) Rules, 2003 [as amended vide the Forest (Conservation) Amendment Rules 2014; Forest (Conservation) Second Amendment Rules 2014; and Forest (Conservation) Amendment Rules 2016].
