With the expansion of FAP, Joda and acquisition of Silico Manganese plant the requirement of Manganese ore of all grades would increase up to 5 LTPA. Part of the requirement would be fulfilled from the Tiringpahar Iron & Manganese mines.

13. Site for Dumping of Overburden	The manganese ore deposit within the lease area is entirely pockety type for which huge overburden excavation is require. The pit development will carried out with stripping ratio of 1:13.7 (T: CuM) by which ~100 lakh cum of overburden will be generated. Overburden will be dumped over the non-mineralized area. Concurrent back filling will also be undertaken once the pit is exhausted. Considering these aspects, additional 25.602 ha of forest land is required for disposal of over burden. The details are given in Land use Plan (Plate No. IV) and Justification [Annexure -I(A)]

Project details

The mining lease was originally granted in favour of M/s Tata Steel Ltd., over an area of 643.710 ha for the period from 01.03.1930 to 29.02.1960 comprising of three blocks namely Guruda Block, Joruri Block and Tiringpahar Block for exploitation of iron and manganese ore, by the Maharaja of Keonjhar for 30 years. The 1st renewal was granted by the Govt. in Department of Mining & Geology over the same area for the period of 20 years from 01.03.1960 to 29.02.1980 in three blocks as mentioned above. The 2nd renewal was granted by the Government for the period from 01.03.1980 to 29.02.2000 in three blocks as mentioned above.

Annexure-I

Tata Steel Limited had applied 3rd renewal vide RML No.699 dated 05.01.1999 for Tiringpahar Iron & Manganese lease (Guruda Block) covering an area of 169.000 hectares confining to villages Guruda, Khandbondh, Palasa (Kha) and Jadibahal as per rule 24(A)(1) of Mineral Concession Rules-1960. The 3rd renewal was under active consideration of the Government.

As per Orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 02.05.2014 in I.A. No. 3763 of 2014 and 16.05.2014 in Common Cause (supra), the Company was asked by Deputy Director of Mines, Joda to stop mining operations in the Tiringpahar Iron & Manganese mine and accordingly Company stopped mining operations & communicated the same to the Deputy Director of Mines vide letter No GM/OMQ/42/16-A, dated 17.05.2014. The Company thereafter kept following up with the State Government to issue its Express Orders under Section 8(3) of the MMDR Act, 1957.

Subsequently, the State Government vide letter No III(MN) SM-45/2006/3278/SM dated 18.04.2015 extended the validity period of Tiringpahar lease up to 31.03.2030 under section of 8A of the MMDR Amendment Act, 2015.

Accordingly, Supplementary Lease Deed was executed on 08.05.2015 and Registered on 08.05.2015 in respect of Tiringpahar Iron & Manganese lease.

Anneyure-YIY

Tata Steel ltd applied for Surrendering the relinquished area over 474.710 ha. of the Mining Leases vide letter No. MPP/L&L/845/15 dated 30.11.2015, the Survey & demarcation of the Surrender area has been completed by ORSAC and the said application is under process.

The location of Tiringpahar Iron & Manganese lease falls in Survey of India Topo Sheet No. : 73 G/5 (New Topo Sheet No. F45N5) within latitude between 21° 54' - 00" N to 21° 57'-00" N and longitude between 85° 23' - 00" E to 85° 25' -00" E.

Tata steel is planning and implementing a growth plan, which is expected to increase the steel making capacities with corresponding increase of its Ferro Manganese Alloys production & Silico Manganese Alloy. The Steel Company has invested large amount to develop the mine and other infrastructural facilities.

The Project is situated under Joda Forest Section, Champua Forest Range of Keonjhar Forest Division, in the State of Orissa. The lease area is coming under Khesara Forest, DLC Land, non-forest land recorded as forest as on 25.10.1980 in Government records, as well as Non-Forest Land and tenanted land.

The lease has been obtained for both manganese and iron ore for primarily supplying to Company's Plants and conversion agents and final product to be utilized in company steel plant, for sale and export.

This mine is one of the major sources for supply of high grade Manganese Ore for use in our Ferro Manganese Plant at Joda and it also caters to the requirements of low grade Manganese Ore for Jamshedpur Works and other Ferro Alloys Plants. There is a proposal for expansion of this Plant for increased production. We are also producing other value added Ferro Alloy products by having conversion arrangements with other plants. Within the lease area of 169.000 ha, the forest land constitutes 133.174 ha (10.392ha KF + 58.522 ha DLC non-forest Govt. land termed as forest land as per DLC report+ 64.260 ha of non-forest land recorded as forest Government records as on 25.10.1980) and 35.826 ha of non-forest land. The MoEF, Govt of India under Stage-II Clearance granted approval for diversion of 52.348 ha forest area (including 11.650 ha. Broken up prior to 1980) & 1.958 ha. of Forest land approved for Safety Zone vide letter no. **F.No.8-80/2004-FC dated 28th. March'2007.**

Company had submitted a proposal for diversion of 13.798 ha of balance forest land and it was returned for online submission for the entire forest land. (State Sl No 431/10 dt 27.10.2010).

On our application, the Collector Keonjhar's letter No 2173/Rev dated 26.09.2015 allotted of 13.789 ha of Govt. Non-forest land for Compensatory Afforestation i.e. for the balance forest area required to be diverted excluding the safety zone and for the area over 64.260 ha of Non-forest land recorded as forest as on 25.10.1980, the CA land has been allotted by Collector, Dhenkanal vide letter No. II/53/16/1185 dated 20.07.2016.

Annexure-XIX

Pursuant to guidelines issued from MoEF & C.C vide F.No.8-87/1996-FC(pt.) dated 10.03.2015 & F.No.8-78/1996-FC(pt.) dated 09.03.2016, we had been following up with the office of Tahasildar, Barbil and finally vide letter No. 2871 dated 10.06.2016, the Tahasildar, Barbil forwarded the details of areas which were recorded as forest in Government record on 25.10.1980 but were treated as non-forest during processing and/or approval of diversion proposal to the DFO, Keonjhar. As per the said details the extent of areas which were recorded as forest in Government record on 25.10.1980 but were treated as non-forest during processing and/or approval of diversion proposal is 64.260 ha.

After receiving the details of the area the DFO, Keonjhar vide Letter No. 4543/Mining dated 17.06.2016 had requested Tata Steel Ltd to deposit an amount of Rs. 4, 69, 09,800/- towards NPV of the said area of 64.260 ha. The demand was paid on 21.06.2016.

Tata Steel Ltd vide Letter No.TP/L&L/587/2016 dated 9.9.2016 requested Collector, Keonjhar to issue necessary certificate under FRA-2006 for the forest land proposed to be diverted.

Annexure-XXI

Under this proposal, 80.826 ha forest land i.e 16.566 ha of balance forest land (7.610 ha Khesara Forest, 8.956 ha Forest area as per DLC report) and 64.260 ha of Non forest land recorded as forest in Government Sabik records as on 25.10.1980) has been sought for diversion. In this diversion 3.916 ha has been kept as Safety Zone including approved Safety Zone over an area of 1.958 ha.

iv)	Justification for locating the project in forest area		As can be seen from Geological Plan (Plate-V) intensive mineralized zone of Manganese and Iron ores occur both in forest land already diverted and virgin forest areas now requested for diversion and as such mining has to be done in the forest areas. The dumping of overburden linked with mining operation is planned in forest land to be diverted. However, certain essential activities which shall be temporarily required considering its proximity with the mining pits viz. storage of mineral and topsoil, mineral separation plant shall require fresh forest land (non-mineralized zone). Accordingly 80.826 ha of fresh forest land is required for diversion to fulfill the supply of manganese ore to lessee's Ferro Manganese Plant at Joda, Company's Steel Plants & other Plants in group. The Manganese Ore produced from this mine are being supplied to lessee's Ferro Alloys Plant, at Joda for production of Ferro Manganese Alloy & Silico Manganese Alloy which in turn is used for producing different grades of steel. There is a proposal for expansion of this Plant for increased production.
