funded by Universal Service Obligation Fund to provide broadband connectivity

to over 200,000 gram panchayats of India.

NOFN is the largest rural connectivity project of its kind in the world.

❖ It aims to transform the country into a digitally empowered society and

knowledge economy.

❖ It seeks to link each of the 2.5 lakh village panchayats in the country

spread over 6600 blocks and 631 districts through broadband optical

fibre network in order to provide a minimum bandwidth of 100 Mbps.

On its completion, NOFN is expected to facilitate Broadband connectivity

to over 600 million rural citizens of the country.

NOFN, is being funded by the Universal Service Obligation Fund (USOF),

Department of Telecom, Ministry of Communications & IT.

❖ It will offer people with friendly services like e-governance, e-health, e-

education, e-banking, public internet access etc. It will also enable

delivery of various government services such as local planning,

management, monitoring and payments of Government schemes at

panchayat level.

Thus it will help to provide non-discriminatory telecom infrastructure, in

order to bridge the gap of digital divide in rural internet access.
