The area selected for Compensatory Afforestation purpose is 18 ha in Talarimaha PRF and 16.7 ha in Paburia PRF. It is suitable for plantation, free from encroachment. Plantation under Bald hill plantation mode @1600 plant/ha over 18 ha of Talarimaha PRF and plantation under ANR with Gap plantation @600 plants/ha in Paburia PRF will be taken up with barbed wire fencing. The area is covered under revised Working plan of this division. Hence ideal from management point of view.

Considering all aspects involved in forest diversion, Economic growth of the area and Socio – Economic condition of the locality and to have rapid movement, diversion of 7.722 ha of Forest land of Kandhamal District u/s 2 (ii) of Forest (Conservation) Act,1980 is recommended for Up- Gradation of Existing 2 lane road to 2 lane with Paved shoulder 1.5m on both sides of the existing Road (NH-157). This will allow speedy movement in this left wing affected district and also help in socio- economic growth of the area/ district. Movement from western Odisha to Coastal area will be less time consuming.
