- Sub: Renewal of 2.213 ha. (including 0.433 ha. of safety zone area) of forest land in Sy.No.78/1P of Padukonaje Village, Marpady Reserve Forest, Mangaluru Taluk, Kundapura Division, for building stone material quarry in favour of M/s. Padma Crushers, Bantwala Taluk, Dakshina Kannada District-reg. (Online Proposal No: FP/KA/QRY/7549/2014).

The Government of India vide its letter dated 09-11-2016 cite at reference (1) above has accorded Stage-II approval for diversion of 2.213 ha. (including 0.50 ha. of forest land already diverted & 0.433 ha. of safety zone area) of forest land in Sy.No.78/1P of Padukonaje Village, Marpady Reserve Forest, Mangaluru Taluk, Kundapura Division, for building stone material quarry in favour of M/s. Padma Crushers, Bantwala Taluk, Dakshina Kannada District under section 2 of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, for a period of ten (10) years w.e.f. 02-11-2010,

The Government of Karnataka had also issued the G.O. vide its ordered dated 11-01-2017 cited at reference (2) above. Accordingly, DCF, Kundapura executed an Agreement with M/s Padma Crushers at Jurisdictional Sub-Registrar, Moodbidri dated 09-03-2017. Now, the said lease period will expire on 01-11-2020.

Further, as per Government of India Guideline, renewal of lease application should be submitted one year before lapse of lease. Accordingly, Form-B PART-I Online application (for renewal of lease) along with compliance report submitted has earlier approved by Government of India and Government of Karnataka. The details are as follows:
