- 7.19 The period of diversion under this approval shall be co-terminus with the period of lease to be granted in favour of the user agency or the project life, whichever is less.
- 7.20 The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the project proposal.
- 7.21 It Shall mandatory to provide underpass for safe crossing of wild animals
 - (a) The underpass shall have a minimum size of width 4.00 mt and Height 3.00 mt.
 - (b) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence, then no need to construct new underpass subject to existing structure nearly complying above mentioned dimensions, as suggested in (a) above.
 - (c) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence but as per engineering requirement, it is required to reconstruct then that structure shall comply with the minimum dimensions as suggested in (a) above.
 - (d) Interval between such underpasses shall not be more than 2.00 km
- 7.22 The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agencies, department or person without prior approval of Government of India.
- 7.23 Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guidelines F.No.11-42/2017-FC, dated 29/01/2018.

- 7.24 Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife.
- 7.25 The compliance report shall be uploaded on e-portal (https://parivesh.nic.in/)

9.00 It is therefore, requested that Government of India may kindly be moved for approving the proposal for diversion of 0.72 ha. forest land for Rehabilitation & Upgradation of newly declared Badhera road NagziraKherda and Murtizapur to Kherda of NH-161 E section from Washim to Dastapur [Design Chainage 0.00 to 29.074] to Two lane with paved shoulder in Village Masola Tal. Mangrulpir Dist. Washim in the State of Maharashtra under section 2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
