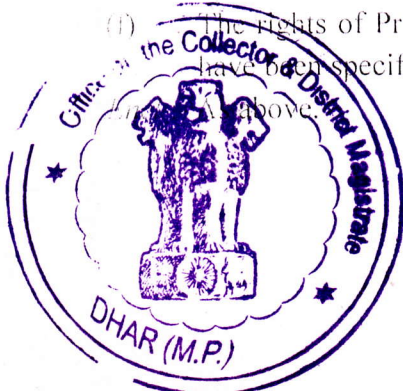

In compliance of the Ministry of Environment and Forests (MoEF) , Government of India's letter No. 11-9/98-FC (pt.) dated 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2009 wherein the MoEF issued guidelines on submission of evidences for having initiated and completed the process of settlement of rights under the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 ('FRA'- for short) on the forest land proposed to be diverted for non forest purposes. It is certified that 95.387 hectares of forest land proposed to be diverted in favour of Madhya Pradesh Water Resources Deptt. for Construction of Chunar Tank Project for Irrigation purpose in Dhar District falls within jurisdiction of Pipliyabhan village in Sardarpur Tehsil.

It is further certified that :

- The complete process for identification and settlement of rights under the FRA has been carried out for the entire 95.387 hectares of forest land proposed for diversion. A copy of records of all consultation and meetings of the Forest Rights Committee(s), Gram Sabha , Sub Division Level Committee(s) and the District Level Committee are enclosed as annexure I to annexure II.
- The proposal for such diversion (with full details of the project and its implications in vernacular/local language) have been placed before each concerned Gram Sabha of Forest-dwellers , Who are eligible under the FRA;
- The each of concerned Gram Sabha , has certified that all formalities/processes under the FRA have been carried out , and that they have given their consent to the proposed diversion and the compensation and ameliorative measures , if any, having understood the purpose and details of proposed diversion . A copy of certificate issued by the Gram Sabha of Pipliyabhan village is enclosed as annexure I to annexure II.
- The discussion and decisions on such proposals had taken pace only when there was a quorum of minimum 50% of the members of Gram Sabha present :
- The diversion of forest land for facilities managed by the Government as required under section 3(2) of the FRA have been completed and the Gram Sabhas have given their consent to it :
- The rights of Primitive Tribal Groups and Pre-Agricultural Communities , Where applicable have been specifically safeguarded as per section 3(1) (e) of the FRA.
