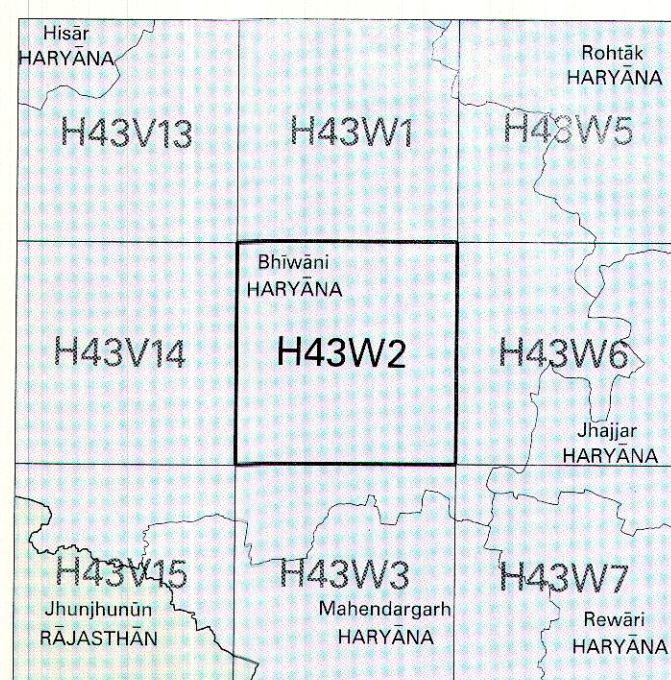

Tanks shown in this area usually contain water from July to December.

Unmanned roads and cart-tracks in this sheet are generally motorable in dry season. Permission to use those along canals is required from the irrigation authorities.

Canal distance stones are 300 metres apart and every fifth stone is shown.
