Diversion of revised area 0.054 ha. (original area 0.108 ha.) Reserved Forest land under section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for Construction of approach road to Creative English School at Village Katraj, Tal. Haveli, Dist. Pune in the State of Maharashtra (FP/MH/ROAD/31541/2018)

The Additional Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Nodal Officer has submitted proposal for diversion of 0.108 ha Reserved Forest land under section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for Construction of approach road to Creative English School at Village Katraj, Tal. Haveli, Dist. Pune in the State of Maharashtra.

The details of revised area of forest land proposed for diversion are as under: -

2. The proposed land required for this approach road is 0.054 ha from Survey No.39 at Village Katraj, Tal Haveli, Dist. Pune as the school area is adjoining to forest land and there is no other approach road goes to Kondhwa BK Area under Pune Municipal Corporation Pune

Area. There is no other alternative other than proposed road passing through Forest land. Hence the User Agency has submitted proposal under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for prior approval of the Central Government.

3. The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Pune has certified that:-

- 3.1) No alternate alignment is possible and the forest land required is minimum.
- 3.2) The area belongs to Eco-value class-III having density is 0.1 (Open Forest).
- 3.3) There are 75 trees of various species and trees is involved in implementation of the Project. The Girth wise break up is as under-

- 3.4) The area involved in the project does not form part of any existing National Park, Wildlife Sanctuary, Nature Reserve etc.
- 3.5) Proposed project is not likely to affect any monumental site of cultural, historical, religious, archeological or recreational importance.
- 3.6) There is no violation of Forest (Conservation) Act 1980.
- 3.7) Proposed project is 42 Km. from Tamhini Wildlife Sanctuary, Tamhini.
- 3.8) Proposed Compensatory Afforestation over 1.00 ha. degraded Forest land in Gut No.94 at Village Sarafwadi, Tal Indapur, Dist. Pune it is contiguous, suitable for afforestation and management purpose and it is free from encroachment and an encumbrances.
- 3.9) The non-forest area covered under the project is not under the provision of Maharashtra Private Forest (Acquisition) Act 1975 by virtue of application of Section 35 of Indian Forest Act 1927 and are not recognized as deemed reserved forest as well as not included. in the area identified as "forest" as per dictionary meaning of forest as intimated to the expert committee appointed under interim judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 12/12/1996
- 3.10) Three alternatives have been examined in detail and have to come to conclusion that the alternative No. 1 is most suitable for forestry point of view, i.e. minimum area involved and there is minimum felling of trees involved.

4. The User Agency has submitted undertakings:-

- 4.1 to defray the cost of Net Present Value.
- 4.2 to defray the cost of Compensatory Afforestation.
- 4.3 to submit compliance under FRA-2006.

- 5. The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Pune has recommended the proposal for approval under Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
- 6. Additional Principal Chief Conservator of Forests & Nodal Officer, Maharashtra State, Nagpur, has recommended the proposal subject to the conditions, given in his recommendations, under Section-2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. His recommendations are enclosed in the proposal.
- 7. The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (HoFF), Maharashtra State, Nagpur has recommended the proposal subject to the conditions, given in his specific recommendations, under Section-2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. His specific recommendations are enclosed in the proposal.
- 8. It come to the notice of the State Government many individuals and institutions apply for diversion of forest land for approach road passing through the forest land, many times in area, having high density vegetation or area prone to erosion. User Agencies used to propose the width of the road ranging from 3 to 18 Meter, as per the prevailing conditions under MRTP Act, 1966.

In order to avoid large-scale damage to the valuable forest resources and to comply with the basic principle of forest diversion as envisioned in the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, recently Government of Maharashtra has taken conscious policy decision with respect to length & width of the approach roads in forest area, under section 154 of MRTP Act, 1966 vide Government Resolution dated 09.01.2024. State Government has directed Planning Authorities as under:-

- a) Roads in forest areas having length of maximum 150 meter and width of 4.5 meter shall be considered as approach roads.
- b) If the width of the main road is less than 4.5 meter at the junction point of approach road connecting to it, forest department will allow the diversion of forest land only within the limit of existing main road at the junction point.
- c) Provided that, considering the factors such as site specificity, necessity and public importance of the project, Forest Department will have discretionary powers, it can decide / recommend / reject the cases for diversion of forest land for approach roads requiring more length and / or width specified above.

Government of Maharashtra has decided to allow the diversion of forest land for site specific approach road projects only within the limit of 4.5 meter width. However, Additional Principal Chief Conservator & Nodal officer had already submitted the proposal for diversion of 0.108 Ha. forest land for the approach road vide letter dated- 05.07.2022.

The instant proposal was kept in abeyance, as the policy decision was under consideration of the Government. Considering the time lapse already incurred and to avoid the further delay, State government is recommending the diversion of 0.054 Ha. forest land considering the 4.5 Meter width only though, the document submitted by the user agency

and authorities are for entire 0.108 Ha. Proposal may be considered for Stage-I approval as there is only reduction in the width of road.

User Agencies and authorities will submit revised documents at the time of Compliance of the Conditions in Stage-I approval, if required.

9. In the circumstances explained in aforesaid paragraphs and enclosures, the State Government recommends that 0.054 ha. forest land may be allowed to be diverted under Section-2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, subject to conditions proposed by the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (HoFF), Maharashtra State, Nagpur and Addl. PCCF & Nodal Officer, Nagpur. The matter may kindly be placed before the Government of India for its approval under Section-2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
