Inspection notes of the Divisional Forest Officer, Narsipatnam on the Road Proposals received from the User Agency i.e., Executive Engineer Panchayati Raj, Paderu for the road proposed from NSD R&B road at 102/0 to Gadaba Neredupalli via Agraharam, Kumarapalli & Haripuram in G.K. Veedhi Mandal on 05.05.2015

Inspected the proposed road from NSD R&B road at 102/0 to Gadaba Neredupalli via Agraharam, Kumarapalli & Haripuram in G.K. Veedhi Mandal on 05.05.2015 accompanied with Forest Range Officer, Sileru and Asst. Executive Engineer, PR, G.K. Veedhi and staff. The said proposed road is kutcha road using by the villagers for their daily movement. As per the DGPS Survey the proposed road starts with GPS readings N:18.0083440707 E.082.1241786019 and ends at N:18.0440140545 E.082.1147591039. The proposed road width is 7 m. and out of 5,218.33 m. of total length of the road, 4,256.23 m. length is passing through Compt. no.1064 of Gudem R.L. and 1065,1071,1074 of Sileru R.L. with a diversion of 2.99 ha. The proposed road was also surveyed with hand GPS and the total length as well as the length of the road falling in RF is tallying with the DGPS surveyed map. There are 31 tree species and 8 bamboo clumps falling along the width of Road proposed which are enumerated and enclosed to the proposal. The density of the forests on the proposed width of the road is less than 0.1. There are podulands and cultivable lands on either side of the proposed road. The villagers of Agraharam, Kumarapalli, Korapalli, Chowdupalli, Peddagond, Rallagedda, Haripuram, Ramapuram and G.Neredupalliu have requested for this road for their day to day movement to hospitals and schools for their children and for marketing their agricultural products. There is no violation of work taken place and the required forest area is unavoidable and no endangered and unique species of flora and fauna and no protected archeological heritage importance in this locality.
