CIRCLE, NIRMAL FOR LAYING OF PIPE LINE IN SEGMENTS-22/3 (SIRPUR) FOR
PROVIDING SAFE DRINKING WATER UNDER TELANGANA DRINKING WATER
SUPPLY PROJECT IN ADILABAD DISTRICT.**


On 06.09.2016 inspected the area proposed for diversion of Forest land for 4.684 Ha for laying of pipe line in Segments-22/3 (Sirpur) for providing safe drinking water under Telangana Drinking Water Supply Project in Sirpur Mandal of Adilabad District. The said area proposed for diversion does not form part of national parks, wild life sanctuaries, biosphere reserve, tiger reserve & elephant corridor etc., The proposed site for diversion is part of notified Corridor area of "Kawal Tiger Reserve". There are no rare, endangered and unique species of flora and fauna found in the forest area proposed for diversion. There are no protected Archaeological / Heritage site / defense establishment or any other important monument in the forest area proposed for diversion. The tree growth falling in the proposed land for diversion has been enumerated on the field.


This project will provide safe drinking water @100 lpcd to the house holds at their door steps in Sirpur Mandal, which will improve not only the health but also the living standards of the people of the area. In addition to above, substantial economic gain in terms of reduced health hazards and reduced work burden on women folk will be achieved.

Hence, it is recommended for considering the proposal.
