9.	Condition of Vegetation and type of forest in the applied area.	<p>The forest land applied for diversion is situated in contiguous with Thakurani RF and has been depicted as “fairly dense forest mainly Sal” on concerned Toposheet. Therefore, the condition of vegetation has been treated at par with the adjoining Thakurani Reserved Forest. The adjoining Reserved Forests come under the group 3C/C2e(iii) Moist Peninsular Valley Sal. The prevailing vegetation consists of Sal and its associates. The principal associates of sal include <i>Terminalia alata</i>, <i>Lagerstroemia perviflora</i>, <i>Anogeissus latifolia</i>, <i>Terminalia belerica</i>, <i>Syzygium cumini</i>, <i>Mangifera indica</i>, <i>Schleichera oleosa</i>. <i>Adina cordifolia</i>, <i>Pterocarpus marsupium</i>, <i>Bombax ceiba</i>, <i>Bridelia retusa</i>, <i>Madhuca indica</i>. The middle story is represented by <i>Syzygium cumini</i>, <i>Ougeinia ougenensis</i>, <i>Careya arborea</i>, <i>Treama orientalis</i>, <i>Emblica officinalis</i>, <i>Cassia fistula</i> etc. The shrubs and undergrowth are characterized by <i>Indigofera pulchella</i>, <i>Ardisia solenacea</i>, <i>Flemingia chhapar</i>, <i>Helicteres ixora</i> and <i>Clerodendron viscosum</i> etc. The prevailing climbers include <i>Bauhinia vahlii</i>, <i>Combretum decandrum</i> and <i>Beutia parviflora</i>. The grasses over the forest floor include <i>Chrysopogon aciculatus</i>, <i>Imperata cylindrica</i>, <i>Dicanthium carricosum</i>, <i>Cynodon dactylon</i> etc.</p> <p>Eco Value Class has been treated as “Eco Value Class - I” based on proximate location – Thakurani Reserved Forest and the canopy density has been considered at par with the prevailing vegetation depicted as “fairly dense forest mainly Sal” on concerned Toposheet and kept at 0.5 since the applied Non-Forest land recorded as Forest as on 25.10.1980 is broken /used up to the extent of 83.012 ha.</p>
10.	Position of Wildlife	<p>The Thakurani Reserved Forest and Revenue Forest along with the non-forest land recorded as forest, involved in the mining lease, is the dwelling habitat for leopard, bear, barking deer, hyena, porcupine and etc. Occasional movement of wild elephants is used to be witnessed in the applied forest land and adjoining RF. The applied site falls under elephant habitat zone- 2 as mentioned by ORSAC, Bhubaneswar.</p>
11.	Whether the applied area involves any Eco-Sensitive Zone / National Park / Sanctuary.	<p>The applied area does not involve any Eco-Sensitive Zone / National Park / Sanctuary.</p>
12.	No. of trees to be felled and its impact on the eco-system.	<p>2554 Nos. of trees and 4086 Nos. of poles is to be felled. The probability of soil erosion is likely to increase following felling on the undulating topography of the applied area.</p>

Details of broken up land and reclamation done if any.	<p>The total Broken up Non-forest land recorded as Forest as on 25.10.1980, involved in the mining lease, is 83.012 ha.</p> <p>The User Agency has furnished an undertaking vide Annexure- to undertake reclamation of Mined out pits through back filling followed by afforestation as per the approved Reclamation Plan.</p>

15.	Position of rare and endangered species available and importance of the applied area from archeological point of view.	No rare or endangered species is available in the applied area for diversion, but occasional movement of wild elephants is used to be witnessed in the applied forest land and adjoining RF. The applied site falls under elephant habitat zone- 2 as mentioned by ORSAC, Bhubaneswar. There is no archaeologically important monument situated in the area.

Violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 if any and action taken thereon.	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Violation committed in respect of the Mining Lease during 2nd and 3rd RML</u></p> <p>The lessee has carried out mining activities in violation of section-2 of FC Act, 1980 in Revenue Forest and Reserved Forest from 1983 to 2009 with production of Iron Ore for crushing and subsequent use in Nuamundi during 2nd and 3rd RML without requisite clearance for the Pre-1980 broken up forest land under FC Act, 1980. In addition, working in non-forest land, involved in the mining lease, in absence of approval under FC Act, 1980 in respect of the forest land also amounts to violation of Para- 4.4 of the Hand Book of guidelines issued under FC Act, 1980 and thus, amounts to violation of FC Act, 1980 for the period under question.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Action Taken</u></p> <p>Forest Offence case vide OR No. 4BL of 2017-18 has been registered for violation of FC Act, 1980 in respect of Reserved Forest and prosecution is to be sanctioned and submitted in the Court of JMFC, Barbil. The Collector, Keonjhar has been requested to take legal action as deem proper under prevailing act and rules for the fore-stated violation in the Revenue Forest Land vide this office Letter No. 2304 dated. 07.04.2017. Action taken report is awaited.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Observation of Hon'ble Shah Commission and Action taken thereof</u></p>

Observation –

- ML area-403.3238 ha comprising RF-56.6373 ha, Rev Forest-142.5347 ha, Non forest(Govt.)-204.0750 ha and Non forest (Pvt)-0.0768 ha.
- Forest Diversion proposal submitted on 28.04.2010. Approval from MOEF not yet obtained.
- EC granted on 06.05.2005 raising the production to 2 MTPA and then on 26.11.2010 raising the production from 2 MPTA to 8 MPTA.
- Working in the Rev forest area from 1983-2003 and from 2003 to 2007 is illegal. Working in the Forest area has been stopped from 2007 by the DFO. Now the work is confined to Non forest area alone. DFO is to find out the extent of working in the Rev forest and intimate Collector for appropriate action.
- The lumps from the mines is transported to Jharkhand for crushing and subsequent use in Nuamundi.

Action taken – Action is being taken to ascertain the extent of forest land (Revenue and Reserved Forest) worked in violation of FC Act, 1980 during 2nd and 3rd RML and register appropriate legal action under appropriate act in respect of Revenue and Reserved Forest.
