

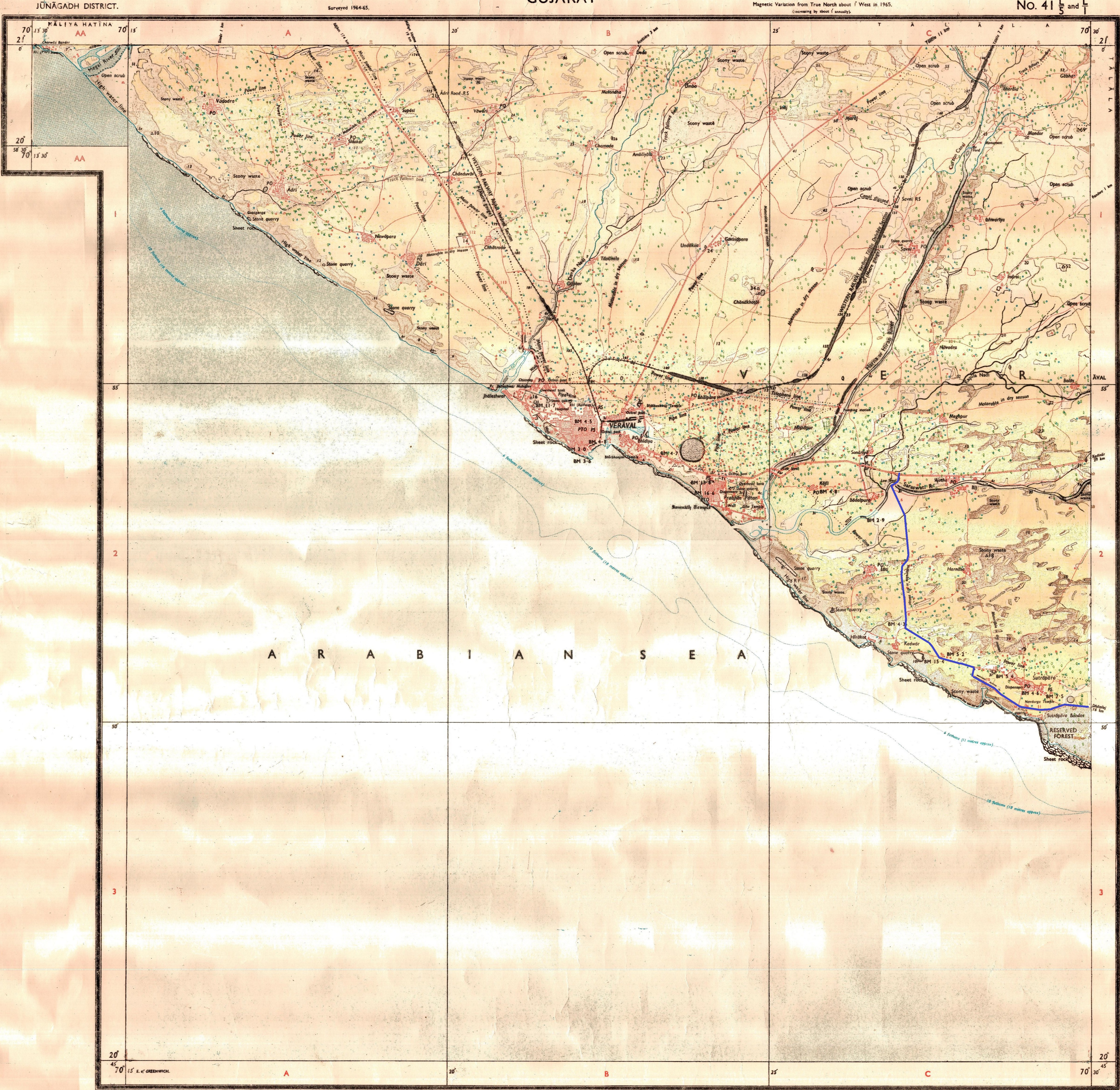

Water features are shown in blue where they generally contain water.
Cultivated areas are coloured yellow.
The exterior boundaries of areas of Reserved or Protected Forests are shown by green ribbons.
Contours are approximate.
A relative height, 20, represents the approximate height, in metres, between the top and bottom of a steep slope.
Wooded areas are coloured green. Scattered trees and other vegetation are in green, but prominent surveyed trees are in black.
*Not applicable.
The kilometre stone numbers along railways are shown in short type, e.g., 5' whereas milestone numbers are shown in upright type, e.g., 5'.
Tanks in this area usually contain water from July to September.
In areas where no tubewell exists, cultivation is periodic and dependent on rainfall.
The six-joint ten-barrier lines have been taken from Admiralty Chart, No. 1474, (INDIA-WEST COAST, KOTDA BLUFF TO MANGROL), dated December 1962, with correction to 1965.
The territorial waters of India extend into the sea to a distance of twelve nautical miles measured from the appropriate base line.
