CONVENTIONAL SYMBOLS

1. **What is the difference between a "strong" and a "weak" form of a vowel?**
 A strong form is a vowel that is pronounced with a full, clear sound, while a weak form is a vowel that is pronounced with a reduced, less clear sound.
2. **What is the difference between a "long" and a "short" vowel?**
 A long vowel is a vowel that is pronounced for a longer duration, while a short vowel is a vowel that is pronounced for a shorter duration.
3. **What is the difference between a "close" and an "open" vowel?**

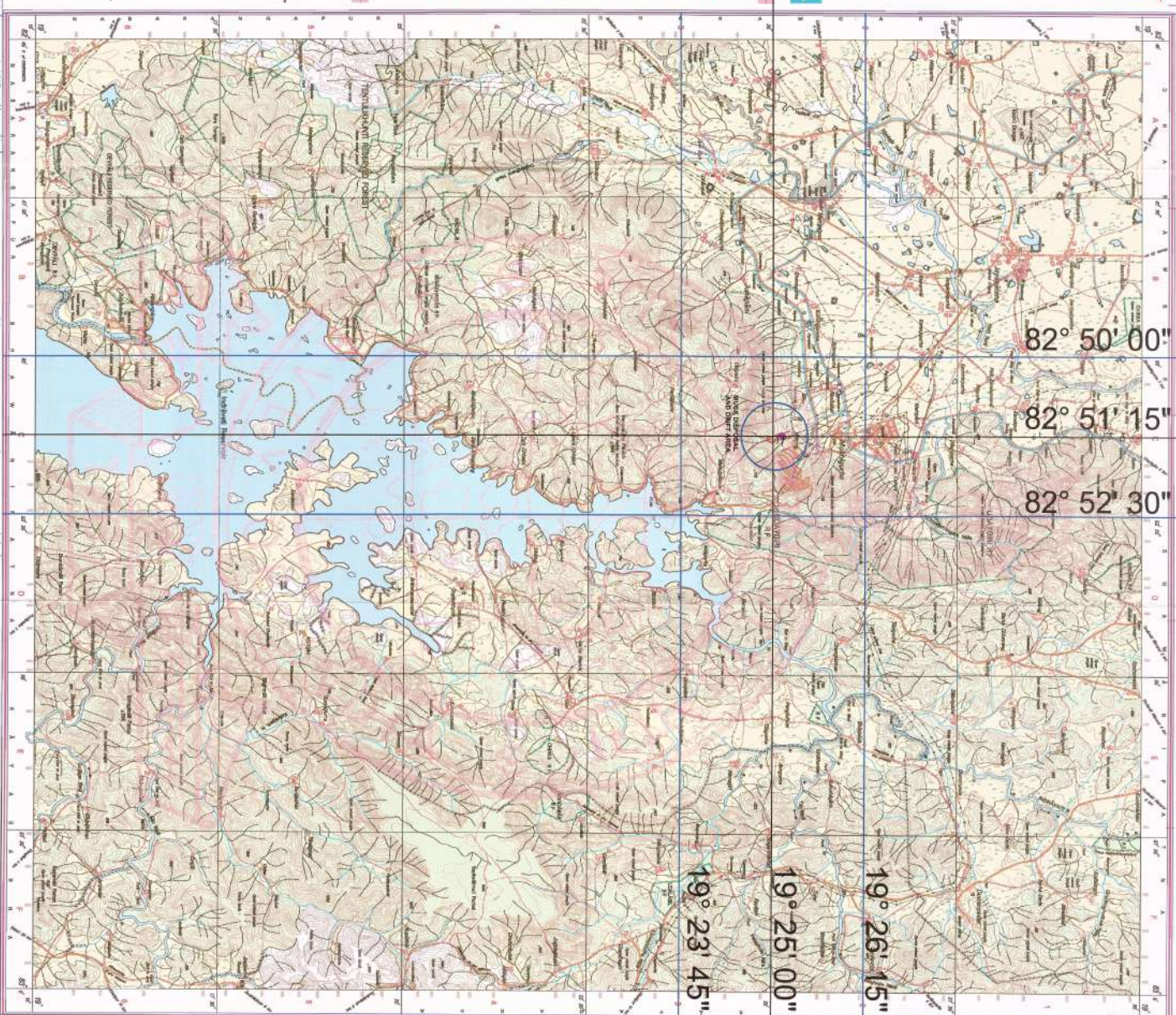
Figures are means and errors either from two trials. General are representative.
