

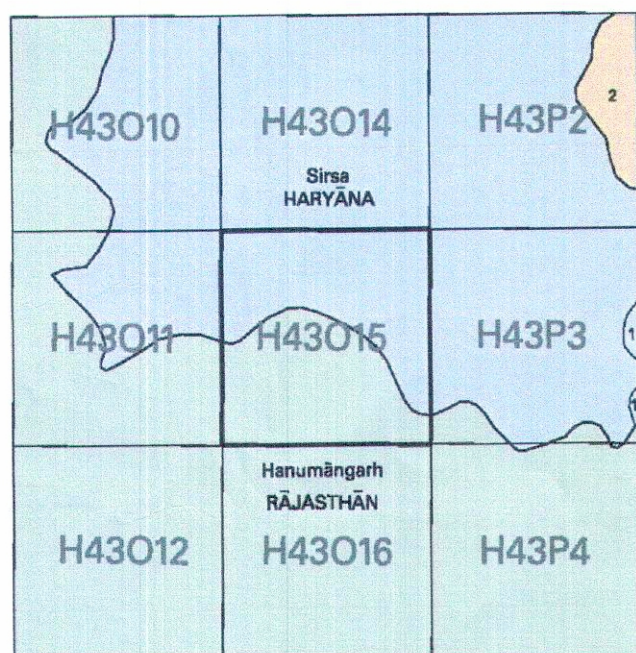

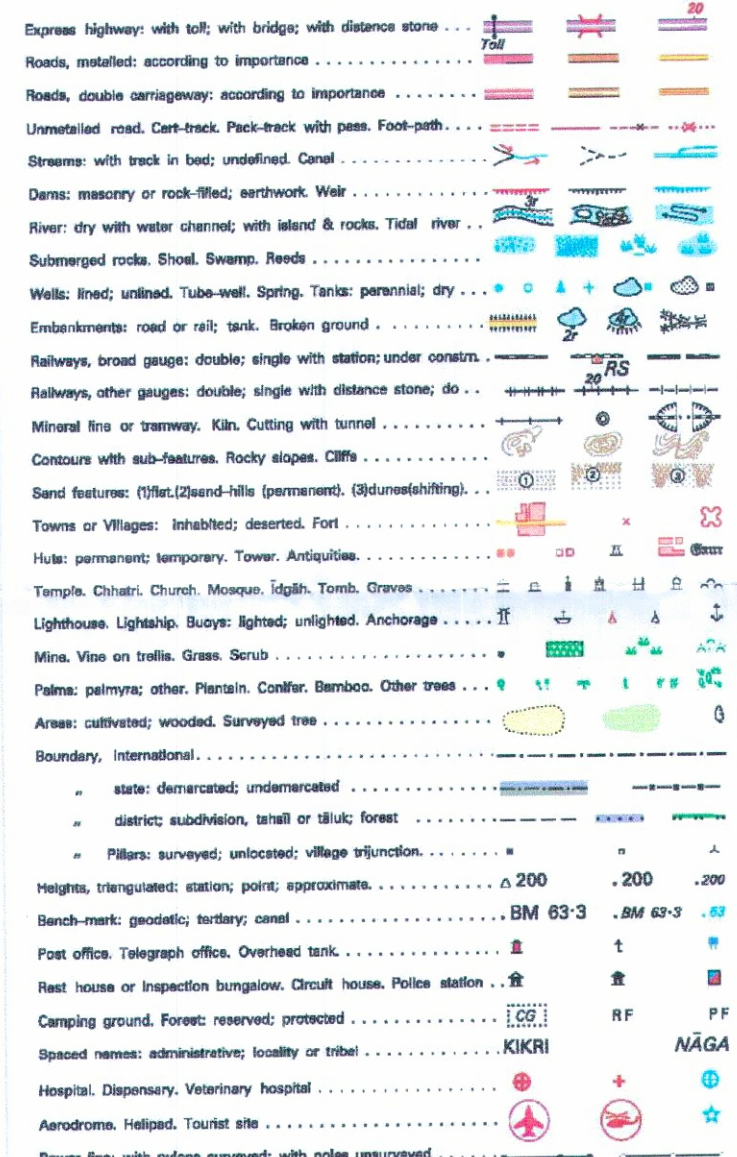


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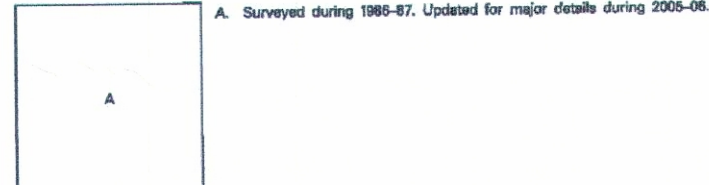
CONVENTIONAL SYMBOLS



NOTES :-

Tanks shown dry, in this area usually contain water from July to December. Tube-wells are numerous throughout the sheet, only the important ones have been shown. Unmetalled roads and cart-tracks in this sheet are generally motorable in dry season. Permission to use these roads and cart-tracks is required from the Irrigation authorities. Distance stones along canals are 1000 feet apart whereas on southern and northern banks there are 200 and 300 metres apart respectively and every existing fifth stone is shown. A relative height, e.g., 2r marked on a canal indicates the height of top of the canal embankment above adjacent country. Most of the unlined well symbols indicate covered tanks, called tanks which usually contain surface collection of rain water.

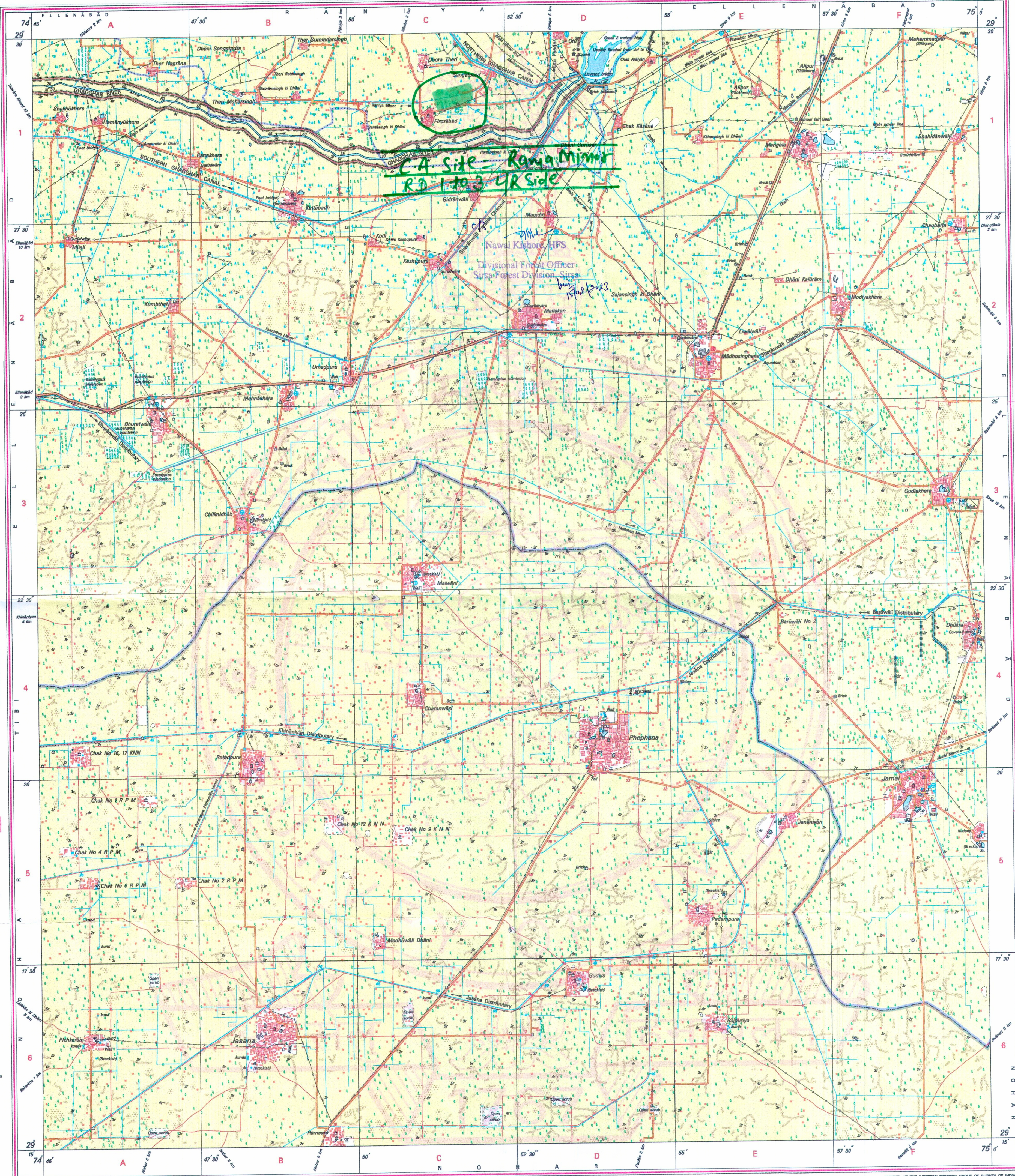
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
