

REHABILITATION & RESETTLEMENT

INTRODUCTION:

Talcher coalfield, located in Brahmani river valley to the north of Mahanadi river, spreads over 80km along strike (east-west) and about 26km along dip-rise (north-south). The coalfield has been divided into several mining blocks. Bhubaneswari is one of them located in the south-eastern part of the coalfield and north of Lingaraj mining block.

Advance Action Proposal (AAP) for Bhubaneswari OCP (10 Mty) was approved by the Govt. in October,1995 for a capital of Rs.5.79 crores for land acquisition and initial development of necessary infrastructures. Subsequently, Project report for Bhubaneswari OCP (10 Mty) was sanctioned by Govt. in January 2005 for a capital of Rs.336.68 crores including the amount for AAP and initial exploration. Considering the geological structures of neighbouring blocks, this project was carved out of Bhubaneswari geological block and portions of Ananta Extn. block and Subhadra block.

The PR of Bhubaneswari OCP (20.0 Mty) was sanctioned by MCL Board in its 92nd meeting held on 22nd December 2007 for coal and OB outsourcing variant. Mining plan for Bhubaneswari OCP (20 Mty) was proposed and has been approved in June 2011.

Mining plan for Bhubaneswari OCP (Normative capacity 20 Mty and peak capacity 25 Mty) has been prepared based on the parameters as per sanctioned PR of Bhubaneswari OCP (20 Mty) and approved by MOC, Govt. of India, New Delhi vide Letter No.34012/(4)/2011-CPAM, dated 16th July, 2013.

The Mining Plan & Mine Closure Plan of Bhubaneswari OCP 28.0 Mty has been approved by the MCL Board in its 196th Board Meeting held on 07-11-2017.

Environmental Clearance (EC) for Bhubaneswari OCP (10 MTY) was granted vide no J-11015/45/96-IA.II(M) Dt.6/6/2003 and EC for Bhubaneswari OC Expn. project (20 Mty) was obtained vide letter No.J-11015/128/2007-IA.II(M), MoEF, Govt. of India, dated 30th November, 2012

Bhubaneswari OCP Expn. Project (25 Mty) obtained the environment clearance (EC) vide letter no.J-11015/280/2013-IA.II(M) dated 19/02/2014 and EC for Bhubaneswari OCP Expn. Project (28 Mty) vide letter J-11015/280/2013/- IA-II(M)pt Dt.16/02/18 was granted under 7(ii) of EIA Notification 2006 for granting environmental clearance for expansion of coal mining project involving one time Production Capacity Expansion of up to 25% & 40% respectively in the existing operation came on.

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The total land involved for entire life of the project is 658.724 Ha (525.82 Ha Non forest + 132.904 Ha Forest). However, as per directives of MoEF&CC vide EC letter no. J- 11015/280/2013-IA.II(M) Dt. 19/02/2014, forest land involved for 25 years of operation was assessed and accordingly FC was granted for 112.521 Ha in 2004 against the proposal of 132.904 Ha. So, present EC is granted for 638.341 Ha (525.82 Ha Non forest + 112.521 Ha Forest) of ML area and it was also directed to approach the MoEF&CC for the balance 20.383 Ha forest land after consumption of granted forest land (i.e. 112.521 Ha) in the mine area.

The Mining Plan & Mine Closure Plan of Bhubaneswari OCP 30.0 Mty has been approved by the MCL Board on Dt 25.04.2022 for inclusion of balance 20.383 Ha forest land within 658.724 Ha ML area and for enhancement of EC capacity to 30 MTPY under 7(ii) of EIA Notification 2006 for granting environmental clearance for expansion of coal mining project involving one time Production Capacity Expansion of up to 50%.

Bhubaneswari OCP has been identified as one of the projects in Emergency Coal Production Plan of CIL.

Since, there is no additional land involved, no additional Resettlement & Rehabilitation of Project Affected Families is proposed. The balance 20.383 Ha of forest land is part of the 132.904 Ha forest land proposal.

LOCATION:

Bhubaneswari mining block comprising of an area of an area of 5.8 sq.km is surrounded by NH 23 and Sakhigopal block in the east, Lingaraj and Ananta Expansion project in the south, Subhadra block in the west & Arkhapal block in the north. The area is connected by all weather metalled road to Bhubaneswar which is at a distance of about 170km. The limiting geographical co-ordinates of the block are as follows:

COMMUNICATION AND PHYSIOGRAPHY OF THE AREA:

The proposed block is well connected by road and rail. Details are given below in table:

Details of Project Affected Families:

The core zone of the project comprising of excavation zone, infrastructure area, OB dump sites, safety zone for blasting, etc., covers partly and/or fully the land from nine (9) villages namely Jilinda, Hensmul (Sharasahi), Hensmul (Talasahi), Naraharipur, Khandualbhal, Kandhal, Madanmohanpur, Langijoda and Anadipur. Total 9 nos of villages are likely to be affected due to mining & its related activities of proposed project. Total PAF's involved are 1142. These families have been resettled and rehabilitated socially, culturally and economically as per latest R & R Policy of Govt. of Orissa, May, 2006.

20.383 Ha of revenue forest land is part of 658.724 Ha Mine Lease area of Bhubaneswari OCP (10 MTPY) Project and Rehabilitation & Resettlement of these three villages are part of the earlier R&R Plan, hence no additional R&R involved. Copy of Rehabilitation & Resettlement of Project Affected Families submitted against the 132.904 Ha Forest proposal is enclosed in Annexure-I.

In balance 20.383 Ha of revenue forest only three villages namely Naraharipur, Langijoda and Anadipur are being affected. Rehabilitation & Resettlement of Langijoda and Anadipur villages were already completed.

Initially resettlement package was 50,000/- but it was enhanced to 5,32,00/0-(including Rs 3,00,000/- for cash in lieu of plot) and incentive of Rs. 1,00,000/- for early shifting also included in the package.

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Cost towards R&R compensation has been provisioned as ₹ 20.00 Lakhs per family in onetime payment basis as recommended in the 26th Meeting of the Technical Sub – Committee of MCL Board on 27.08.2019.. Adequate capital provision for development of R&R Site has been kept.

Present Status of Rehabilitation & Resettlement:

All civic amenities in the rehabilitation colony were provided as per the Rehabilitation package. The resettlement and rehabilitation of project affected families (PAFs) were carried out as per the latest Norms of Govt. of Odisha. The major displaced families were resettled at 'Baghamara R&R Site and Self relocated sites and remaining PDFs of Hensmul(Talasahi) will be shifted to R&R Site located in front of Balanda College as per the layout given in Annexure-II. The village wise details of displaced families are given in Table-2.

The status of Rehabilitation & Resettlement is as follows:

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RESETTLEMENT AND REHABILITATION OF PROJECT AFFECTED FAMILIES

8.1 Introduction:

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This chapter deals with the following points:

 - Package for resettlement and rehabilitation

8.2 Details of Project Affected Families:

Bhubaneswari OCP area comprising of excavation zone, OB dump area infrastructure site and blasting zone covers 12 villages namely, Nakulbaspur, Ambamunda, Balungan Khamar Kandhal, Anadipur, Hensmul, Jillinda, Naraharipur, Langijoda, Madanmohanpur, Alhadnagar (uninhabited) and khandualbahal (uninhabited). Out of the above villages, about 671 families from 3 villages namely Hensmul, Jillinda and Naraharipur shall face involuntary displacement due to mining and its associated activities. These displaced families shall be resettled at a site located in a non - coal bearing area along with the land less families which derive their livelihood from the land to be acquired from the above affected villages. Further, the families from whom land shall be acquired, shall be rehabilitated economically. The details of project affected families are given in Appendix – VIII.

8.3 Package for Resettlement and Rehabilitation

8.3.1 Land for resettlement colony

Land requirement for resettlement colony is 117.57 ha. The rehabilitation site is identified at village Paranga of Angul Tehasil Details of the land earmarked for the purpose are mentioned in the letter no. 8876 dt.29.12.94 of Tehasildar, Angul enclosed herewith.

8.3.2 Compensation

8.3.3

- Compensation for land to be acquired shall be paid at suitable rates.
- Full compensation for the housing, wells, ponds, trees, etc. shall also be paid.
- In all circumstances, compensation must be paid before actual displacement.
- Payments for compensation shall be made through a/c. payee cheques.



8.3.4 Dctails of Package:

A comprehensive resettlement and rehabilitation package (social, cultural and economic), shall be offered to the project affected families as per R&R policy of CIL/the latest norms of Govt. of Orissa/India. copy enclosed herewith. A tentative rehabilitation plan has been formulated (Plate No. XIII). The details of package are given in Table – I, Appendix – VIII.

The social infrastructure facilities like proper approach road, street lighting, drinking water facilities, community centre, school etc. shall be provided in the resettlement colony. In case where the coal company decides for fresh recruitment of skilled or non skilled technical personnel in non executive cadre, the displaced person shall be given preference in employment. For economic rehabilitation of project affected persons, facilities like financial assistance for self employment & vocational training shall be extended.

8.3.5 Measures for Social & Cultural Rehabilitation

- The resettlement site shall be named suitably.
- If any place of worship like temple, church etc. are acquired, the same shall be provided on the replacement basis.
- A community of particular caste, creed and religion shall be allowed to resettle in a particular are in the resettlement colony to foster the communal harmony.
- Training facilities shall be extended to the woman folk to give adequate access to income generating opportunities for raising their social status.
