NOTES

A relative height, h , represents the approximate height in metres, between the top and bottom of a steep slope.
Permission to use cart-tracks and unmetalled roads along canals is reserved from the irrigation authorities.
A relative height h , in h , marked along a canal, indicates the height of the canal embankment above the adjacent country.
Tanks shown dry, in this area usually contain water from July to March.
Tide-marks are necessary in Indian waters, only the important ones have been shown.
The courses of Ravi River, Beas River and Sutlej River are shown to indicate change owing to shifting of the river beds.
Position of International Boundary Pillars has not been shown in this sheet.
Height and contours have not been shown.
