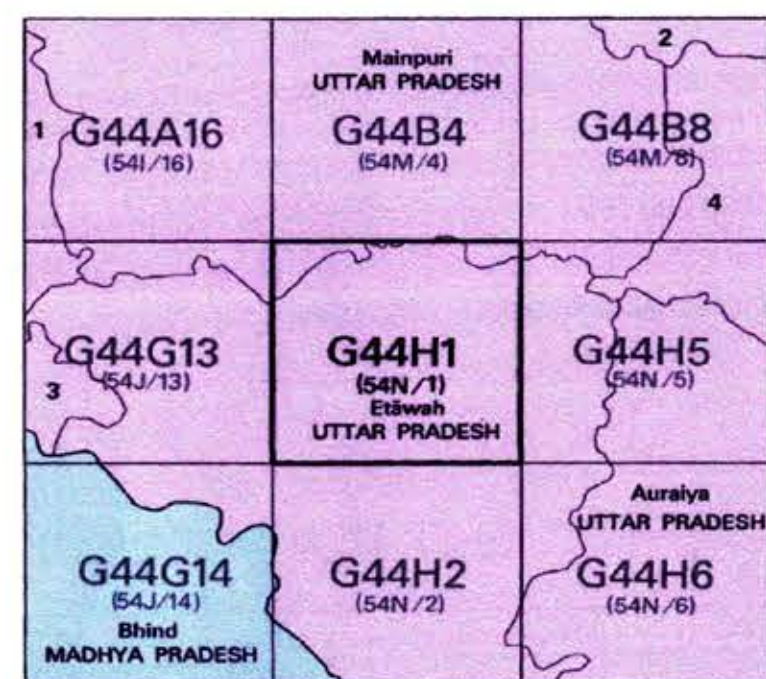


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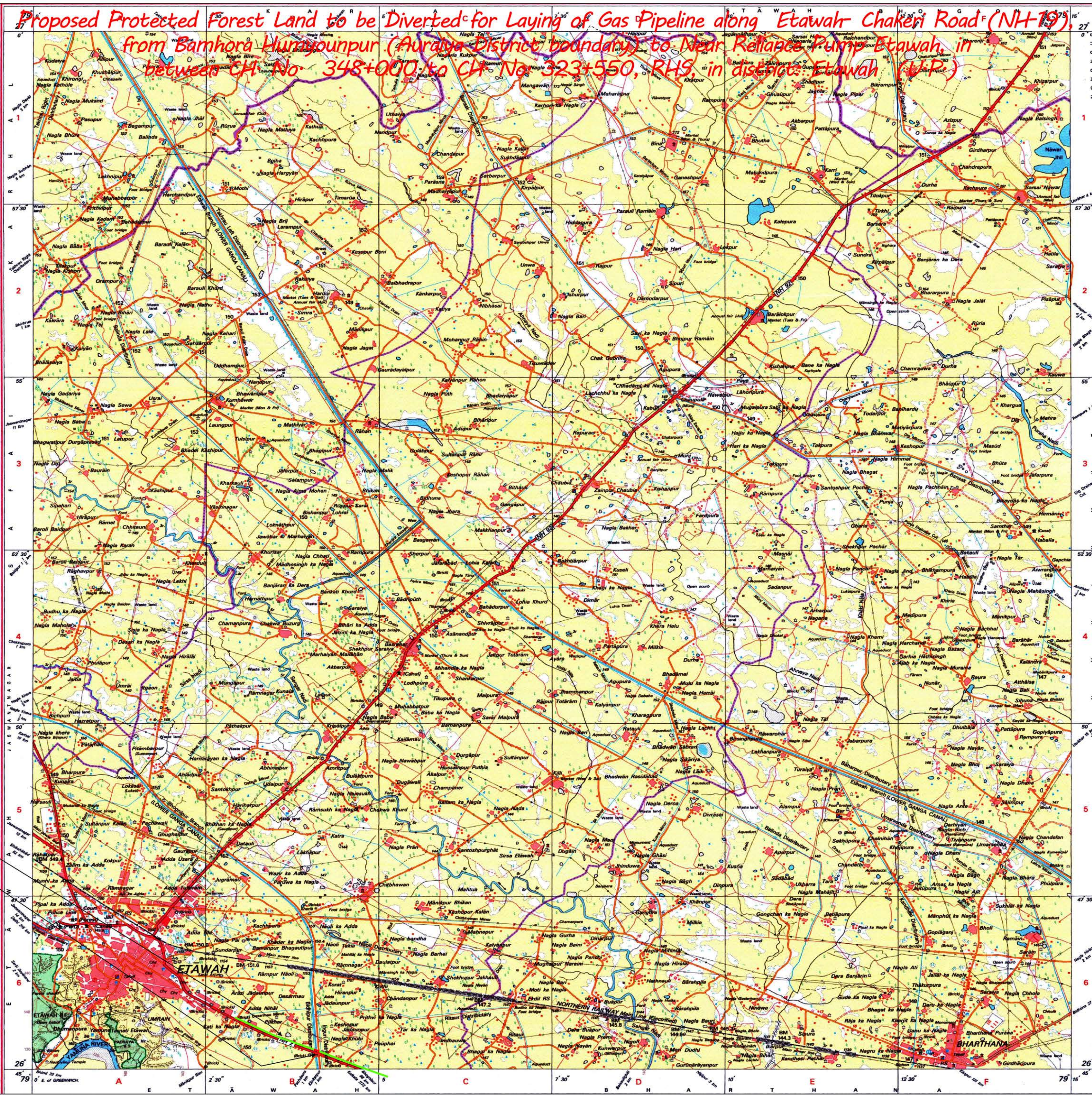
CONVENTIONAL SYMBOLS

- Express highway: with toll; with bridge; with distance stone. Roads, metalled: according to importance. Roads, double carriageway: according to importance. Unmetalled road, Cart-track, Pack-track with pass, Foot-path. Streams: with track in bed; undefined. Canal. Dams: masonry or rock-filled; earthenwork. Weir. Submerged rocks. Shallow, Swamp. Reeds. Wells: lined; unlined. Tube-well. Spring. Tanks: perennial; dry. Embankments: road or rail; tank. Broken ground. Railways, broad gauge: double; single with station; under constr. Railways, other gauges: double; single with distance stone; C.M.F. Contours with sub-features. Rocky slopes. Cliffs. Sand features: (Tilted) (Zigzag) (Hills) (Depressions) (Shifting). Towns or Villages: inhabited; deserted. Fort. Huts: permanent; temporary. Tower. Antiquities. Temple. Chhatra. Church. Mosque. Idgah. Tomb. Graves. Lighthouse. Lightship. Buoy: lighted; unlighted. Anchorage. Mine. Vine on trellis. Grass. Scrub. Palm: palm; other. Plantain. Conifer. Bamboo. Other trees. Areas: cultivated; wooded. Surveyed tree. Boundary, international. 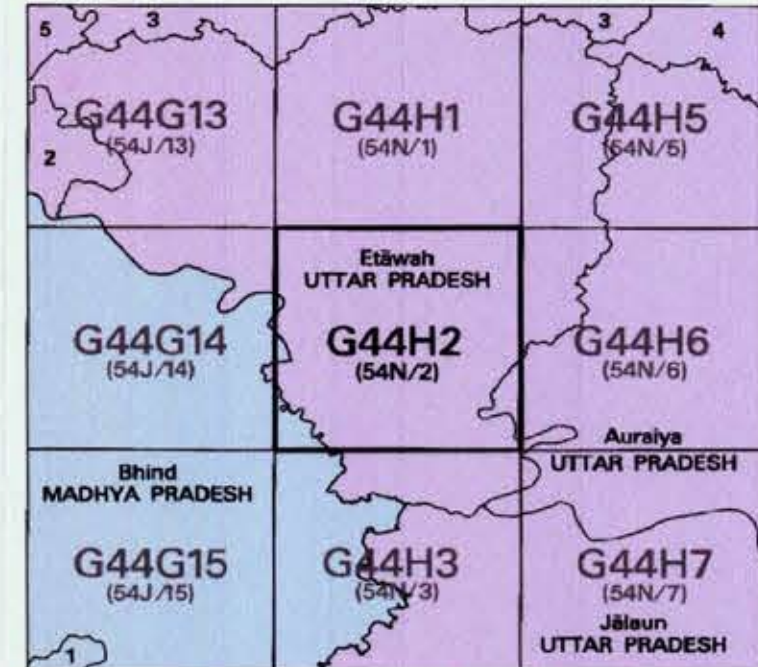

NOTES
Heights are in metres and above Indian mean sea level. Contours are approximate. A relative height, Δ , represents the approximate height, in metres, between the top and bottom of a steep slope. Tanks, shown dry, in this area, usually contain water from July to December. Tube wells and wells are numerous throughout the sheet; only the important ones have been shown. Unmetalled roads in this sheet are generally motorable in dry season. The kilometre station numbers along roads, railways and canals are shown in black type, e.g., '5' whereas milestone numbers are shown in upright type, e.g., '5'. Areas under cultivation due to layers of waste are shown as 'Waste land'. Perennial streams in this sheet are generally fordable from October to June at places indicated as such.

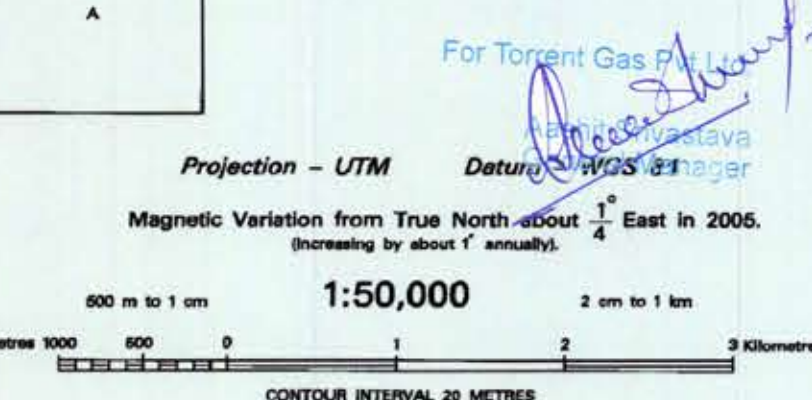

REFERENCE

Notes: Heights in metres and above Indian mean sea level. Contours are approximate. The kilometre stone numbers along railway and roads are shown in slight type. 5' whereas milestone numbers are shown in upright type, e.g. 5'. Cart-tracks and unmetalled roads in this sheet are generally motorable in dry season. Permission to use those along canals is required from the irrigation authorities. Tanks, shown dry in this area, usually contain water from July to December. Wells are numerous throughout the sheet; only the important ones have been shown. Perennial streams in this area are generally fordable from October to June at the places indicated as such. Areas unfit for cultivation due to levels of acidic soils are shown as Waste land. A relative height, e.g. 30', against a well, indicates its total depth in metres.
