Subject: Approval with regards to wildlife clearance of "JDFPL -4G Projects from Kela Devi Wildlife Sanctuary for laying of underground OFC between Mandrayal to Kutalpur in Karauli District (Rajasthan)" (FP/RJ/OFC/4739/2019).

Sir,

With reference to the above mentioned subject, SC-NBWL in its 68th meeting held on 30.05.2022 had conditionally recommended the proposal of laying of underground optical fiber cable between Mandrayal to Kutalpur in Karauli District (Rajasthan).

In pursuance of the same, Chief Wildlife Warden, granted in-principle approval for the project vide letter no. 1617 dated 05.07.2022 subject to compliance of conditions and mitigative measures imposed by SC-NBWL.

In compliance of the conditions mentioned in the in-principle approval, user agency has deposited 2% of the proportional project cost of the project falling within the protected area i.e. an amount of Rs 99060/- in RPACS account along with undertaking for compliance of the remaining conditions, which have been certified by DCF RTR-II Karauli vide his letter no. 3743 dated 06.10.2022 and the same has been forwarded by Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) & Field Director, RTR, Sawaimadhopur vide his letter no 4621 dated 11.11.2022.

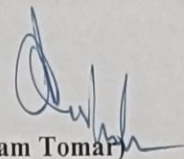
The Chief Wildlife Warden, Rajasthan, hereby accords final sanction for wildlife clearance under Section 29 of the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972, subject to:

1. Compliance of all conditions as listed in the in-principle approval letter no. 1617 dated 05.07.2022 and other directions issued from time to time;
2. Submission of satisfactory annual compliance report;
3. Submission of documents providing final project cost by User Agency;
4. In case of cost overrun, the balance amount of 2% of proportionate project cost may be deposited by User Agency in RPACS account;

In case, it is found that any of the conditions imposed by the various agencies as part of wildlife clearance have not been complied with, this permission shall be liable to be cancelled.

The issue of this sanction does not bar any proceedings against the User Agency under any other relevant Act, rules, guidelines, court judgments etc. for any other issues.

The final sanction for wildlife clearance should not be considered as NOC for commencement of work, if FCA clearance is required for the project and conditions as laid out in FCA clearance are complied with.

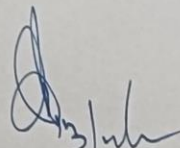
