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CONVENTIONAL SYMBOLS

Expressed by means of a set of symbols, the following are the conventional symbols used in the Survey of India maps.

Boundaries: National, Provincial, District, Sub-Divisional, Taluk, Panchayat, Village, and other administrative boundaries.

Water: Rivers, Canals, Lakes, Ponds, and other water bodies.

Vegetation: Forests, Scrub, and other types of vegetation.

Buildings: Towns, Villages, and other built-up areas.

Infrastructure: Roads, Railways, and other man-made structures.

Topography: Contour lines, Spot heights, and other features representing the physical features of the area.

NOTES:-

Height and Contour lines are shown according to the following scale: 1:50,000. A value of 100 feet is represented by a single line, and a value of 200 feet by a double line. The contour interval is 20 feet.

The map is based on the Survey of India's 1:50,000 scale maps. It is not a true representation of the ground, but a simplified version of the same.

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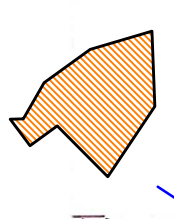

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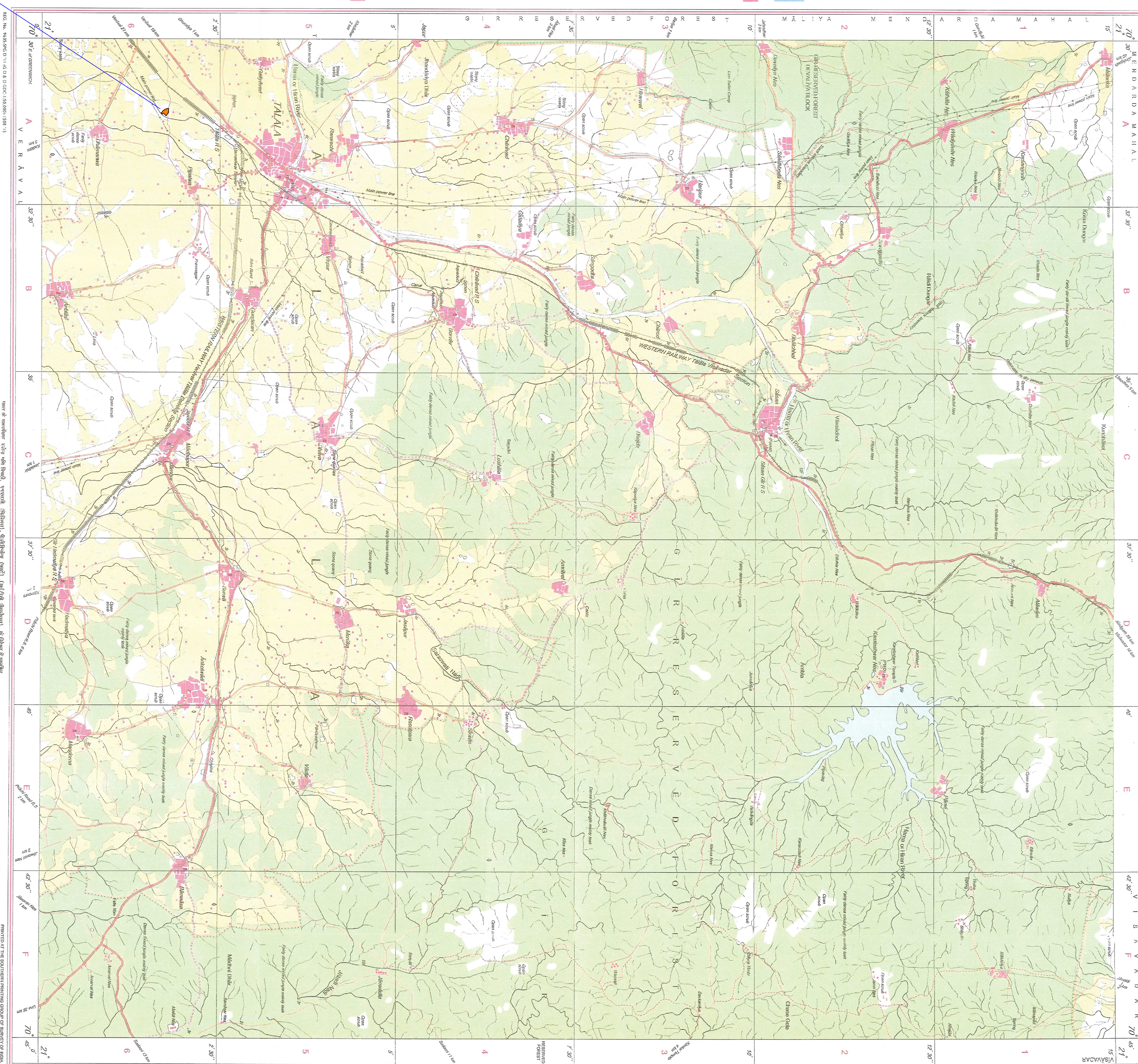
