Subject: Final approval of the proposal for use of 11.4156 ha (3.5568 ha forest land and 7.8588 ha non-forest land) from Jamwaramgarh Wildlife Sanctuary for widening and strengthening of Mahngi to Dudhli Mod Via Bhawani, Bhawani Khurd, Saipur, Andhi, Sriramnagar, Virasna, Gaonli, Newal Maksundanpura, Chawandiya, District-Jaipur, Rajasthan. Sir,

With reference to the above mentioned subject, SC-NBWL in its 82nd meeting held on 12.03.2025 had conditionally recommended of the Proposal for use of 11.4156 ha (3.5568 ha forest land and 7.8588 ha non-forest land) from Jamwaramgarh Wildlife Sanctuary for widening and strengthening of Mahngi to Dudhli Mod Via Bhawani, Bhawani Khurd, Saipur, Andhi, Sriramnagar, Virasna, Gaonli, Newal Maksundanpura, Chawandiya, District-Jaipur, Rajasthan

In pursuance of the same, Chief Wildlife Warden, granted In-principle approval for the project vide letter no. 539 dated 08.05.2025 subject to compliance of conditions and mitigative measures imposed by SC-NBWL.

In compliance of the conditions mentioned in In-principle approval, user agency has deposited, an amount equivalent to the cost of implementing the measures to mitigate impact of the activities proposed in the project in the Protected Area i.e. an amount of Rs 37,00,000/- in RPACS account along with undertakings for compliance of the remaining conditions that requires continuous compliance, which have been certified by Deputy Conservator of Forest (WL), Jaipur Rural vide letter no. 3563 dated 30.06.2025 and the same has been forwarded by Conservator of Forests & Field Director Sariska Tiger Reserve Alwar vide letter no. 4060 dated 04.07.2025.

The Chief Wildlife Warden, Rajasthan; hereby accords **Final Sanction/Approval** for wildlife clearance under Section 29 of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, subject to compliance of the following conditions: -

1. All conditions as listed in the In-principle approval letter no.539 dated 08.05.2025, and other directions issued from time to time;
2. Submission of satisfactory annual compliance report;
3. Documents providing final project cost by User Agency;
4. In case of cost overrun, the balance amount of cost of implementing the measures to mitigate impact of the activities proposed in the project in the Protected Area may be deposited by User Agency in RPACS account.

In case, it is found that any of the conditions imposed by the various agencies as part of wildlife clearance have not been complied with, this permission shall be liable to be cancelled.

The issue of this sanction does not bar any proceedings against the User Agency under any other relevant act, rules, guidelines, court judgments etc. for any other issues.

The final sanction for wildlife clearance should not be considered as NOC for commencement of work, If FCA or any other clearance is required for the project, the same should be obtained before commencement of work.
