





Sub: Clarification on the provisions of guidelines given under para 1.22 of the Consolidated Guidelines issued under the Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980 and Rules, made thereunder – reg.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to letter no. A/MOEFCC/24/281 dated 16.10.2024 received from Federation of India Mineral Industries, FIMI requesting for uniform guidelines for fixing charges of Wildlife Management Plan(WLMP) and Soil and Moisture Conservation Plans(SMCP) , prepared and implemented in compliance of approvals granted under the Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980. In this connection, it is to inform that the matter has been examined in the Ministry in light of submissions made by the FIMI. After examination of the same, the following is clarified:

- i. The Guidelines at para 1.22 of the Chapter-1 of Consolidated Guidelines issued on 29.12.2023 by the MoEF&CC provides for an optional arrangement for the User Agencies and States to forward the compliance of in-principle approval to the Central Government in such cases where due to unavoidable circumstances, there is delay in the preparation of Wildlife Management /Soil and Moisture Conservation Plans and its submission along with the compliance of in-principle approval granted earlier. In such cases, the User Agency can make an upfront payment of 2% of the project cost towards the cost of implementation of Wildlife Management and 0.5% in lieu of the cost of implementation of Soil and Moisture Conservation Works for submitting the compliance of in-principle approval.
- ii. However, in cases where there is no delay and the WLM/SMC Plan has been prepared by the User Agency before submission of compliance of in-principle approval, the provision of upfront payment of 2% and 0.5% shall not be applicable. In such cases, the User Agency needs to make the payment towards the actual cost of implementation of the WLMP/SMCP, as provided for in the estimate of the approved WLM/SMC Plans.
- iii. Further, measures to be suggested in the Wildlife Management or SMC Plan should be based on the requirement of site i.e. site-specific interventions need to be taken in the area to mitigate the impact of the diversion of forest land. The same should be incorporated in the WLMP and SMC Plans. The values of 2% and 0.5% provided in para 1.22 of the Consolidated Guideline are only indicative values and they cannot be considered as a standard

benchmark for preparing the WLMC or SMC which should be based on the specific field requirements . Therefore, it is appropriate for the States/UTs to prepare these Plans based on the actual cost of the interventions required to be made at the site and not based on the indicative financial outlay totalling to 2% (for WLMP) or 0.5% (for SMCP) of the total project cost.

In view of the above, I am directed to request the State Government/UT Administrations to take into consideration the above clarifications while arriving at the cost of WLMP and SCMP.

Sub: Charging of an lump sum amount of the project cost towards the cost of implementation of the Wildlife Management Plan and lump sum amount of the project cost towards the cost of implementation of Soil and Moisture Conservation Plan –reg.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to above mentioned subject and to inform that issue related to preparation of Wildlife Management Plans, Soil Moisture Conservation Plans was considered by the Forest Advisory Committee in its meeting held on 11th May, 2022 wherein Committee inter-alia observed that preparation of such plans by the premier/reputed institutes consumes substantial time is resulting into considerable delay in the process which is ultimately delaying the commencement of different developmental projects. Committee further opined that implementation of mitigating measures should invariably be commenced with the commencement of non-forestry use of forest land and under no circumstances, such mitigating measures should be delayed beyond 2 years to ensure commencement of rejuvenation of ecosystem services lost from the forest area allowed for non-forestry use at the earliest possible time. After detailed deliberations and discussion in the matter, the Committee recommended that a lump sum amount towards the cost of implementation of Wildlife Management Plan and Soil and Moisture Conservation Plan should be charged in cases where preparation of such Plans is likely to take more time as compare to submission of other compliance for obtaining Stage-II approval.

Based on the recommendation of the Forest Advisory Committee (FAC) and acceptance of the same by the competent authority of the MoEF&CC, the Central Government provides the following provisions to deal with situations where preparation and finalization of Wildlife Management Plan and Soil and Moisture Conservation Plan is delayed for various reasons not attributable to State/User agency:

- i. The State Government should submit Wildlife Management Plan, along with detail cost of its implementation into the account of CAMPA along with the Stage-I compliance. However, in cases where it is not possible for the State to submit the compliance due to delay in preparation of such plan, a lump sum quantum of following amount may be realized from the User agency and submitted along with the Stage I Compliance:
 - a. 2% of total project cost towards the cost of implementation of the Wildlife Management Plan and/or 0.5% of the project cost towards the cost of implementation of Soil and Moisture Conservation Plan, as the

case may be, shall be charged from the user agency and deposited into the account of CAMPA and the same may be intimated to the MoEF&CC for the purpose of obtaining approval under the FC Act, 1980.

- b. The provisions provided in the WLMP or SMC Plan shall be approved by the competent authority in the State and accordingly, the deficit amount, if any, from the money already realized to the tune of 2% and/or 0.5% of project cost, shall be paid by the user agency, and same shall be deposit in the CAMPA account prior to actual working on the Forest area.
- ii. The State Government shall ensure that details of the finalized WLMP, SMC Plan and disposition of monies, payment of deficit amount, etc. shall be intimated to and concurred by the concerned IRO of the Ministry before actual breaking/Non forestry use of the forest land.
- iii. State Government shall ensure that under no circumstances, implementation of such mitigating measures envisaged in WLMP and SMC or other similar Plans/Schemes should be delayed beyond a period of 2 years to ensure commencement of rejuvenation of ecosystem services lost from the forest area allowed for non-forestry use of forest land at the earliest possible time.

3. The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change has examined the proposal seeking environmental clearance for **Development Drilling and Testing of Hydrocarbons in 5 wells in Dipling (10.14 sq km area) and 4 wells in Sapekhati (9.44 sq km area) in Charaideo (previously known as Sivsagar) district, Assam** by M/s. Ramayana Ispat Pvt. Ltd.

4. All Offshore and onshore oil and gas exploration, development & Production are listed at S.N. 1(b) Of Schedule of Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Notification under Category 'A' and are appraised at Central Level by Expert Appraisal Committee (EAC).

5. The details of products and location of proposed Well Co-Ordinates are placed at **Annexure-III**.

6. Standard Terms of Reference have been obtained vide IA-J-11011/564/2017-IA-II (I) dated 25th January 2018. It was informed that no litigation pending against the project. The initial scope of project is for 15 onshore developmental wells and testing in Dipling, Sarojini and Sapekhati Block in Charaideo (previously known as Sivsagar) District, & Dibrugarh district, Assam. However, the final proposal stands only for development drilling of 9 wells in Dipling and Sapekhati Field falling in Charaideo District and Testing of Hydrocarbons in Two fields Dipling (10.14 sq km area) and Sapekhati (9.44 sq km area) in Charaideo (previously known as Sivsagar) district, Assam by M/s. Ramayana Ispat Pvt. Ltd.

7. Public Hearing for the proposed project has been conducted by the Assam Pollution Control Board on 08/08/2018 at Sapekhati Tai Cultural Centre, Sapekhati, Dist-Charaideo, Assam. The public hearing was chaired by Additional Deputy Commissioner, Charaideo District. The main issues raised during the public hearing and their action plan are placed at **Annexure-IV**.

8. Total land area required is 27.5 hectares (2.5 ha/well). Greenbelt will be developed for GGS and EPS in total area of 1.1979 hectares i.e., 33% of total project area. The estimated project cost is Rs. 625 Crores. Capital cost of EMP would be Rs. 3.52 Crores and recurring cost for EMP would be Rs. 1.21 Crores per annum. Industry proposes to allocate Rs. 1.4 Crores towards Extended EMP (Corporate Environment Responsibility). Total Employment will be 310 persons as direct & indirect.

9. PP informed that there are no national parks, wildlife sanctuaries, Biosphere Reserves, Tiger/Elephant Reserves, Wildlife Corridors etc. within 10 km distance. Two reserve forests, Dayang Reserve Forest, and Nambor Reserve Forest, are present within 10 km boundary of the PML blocks. Forest clearance is already obtained for 2 wells. Nambor wildlife sanctuary is present towards northwest direction of the block. The nearest PMLs are Kasomarigaon PML (additional area III) and East Lakhbari PML, which are 11.86 km and 10.55 km in Northwest from the ESZ boundary of the Nambor WLS respectively. The Nambor wildlife Sanctuary is located at a distance of 13 Km in Northwest direction from the nearest well (ELDD). ESZ notification for same is still not published. No activity is planned within the default ESZ of 10 km of Number wildlife sanctuary. Dhansiri river flows in the western side of all the PMLs, from south to north direction. The nearest PML is Golaghat District PML (Cluster 1), which is almost 4 km from the Dhansiri river. Dayang River and Rengma River, a tributary of Dayang River through are the main rivers flowing through PML area, while two other minor rivers, Ghiladhari and Sesapani runs within the PML area.

PP has also clarified that there were originally 5 wells in Forest area of the Dipling Block. Out of the 5 wells, 3 well locations were changed to non-forest area by PP. Further, out of the 3 well locations in Forest area for Dipling Block and 1 well location in Forest area of Sapekhati Block, it was decided to drop one well locations of Dipling Block and one well location of Sapekhati Block. Accordingly revised Form 1 is attached herewith for above mentioned 5 locations in Dipling block and 4 locations in Sapekhati Block. The revised proposal was placed in EAC meeting held on 04.09.2023.

10. Ambient air quality monitoring was carried out at 13 (thirteen) locations during 5th December 2022 to 27th February 2023 and the baseline data indicates the ranges of concentrations as: PM10 (43.8-62.1 g/m³), PM2.5 (19.1-36.7 g/m³), SO₂ (5.6-9.8 g/m³) and NO₂ (17.5-28.4 g/m³). AAQ modelling study for point source emissions indicates that the maximum incremental GLCs after the proposed project would be 0.03 g/m³, 0.058 g/m³ and 0.0.117 g/m³ with respect to PM10, SO₂ and NO_x. The resultant concentrations are within the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS).

11. Total fresh water requirement is 25 KLD per well of which will be met from tube-wells to be drilled at the drill site or by transporting water from nearby sources. Effluent of 4.5KLD per well will be treated through Mobile Effluent Treatment Plant of capacity 10 KLD. Domestic waste water is being/will be treated in STP (Capacity of STP in KLD/MLD) - (Domestic waste water generated during drilling (about 4 KLD) will be treated through septic tanks followed by soak pits). The plant will be based on Zero Liquid discharge system and no effluent/treated water will be discharged outside.

12. Power requirement will be 4.3 MW and will be met from proposed Diesel Generator sets (4x1430KVA) and during well testing/flaring one auxiliary 250 KVA DG Set will be in operation. DG set will be used as standby during power failure and stack height (16 m) will be provided as per CPCB norms to the proposed DG sets.

13.Details of Processemissions generation and its management:

The emission would be generated from activities such as flaring, functioning of DG sets, etc. The management of emission is given in the following points

- All vehicles used for transportation of raw material and personnel would have valid Pollution under Control Certificate (PUC). Vehicular exhaust would be complying with the CPCB specified emission norms for vehicular Emission.
- Adequate stack height would be provided to DG sets in accordance with CPCB standards.
- Exhausts of diesel/Gas generators would be positioned at a sufficient height to ensure dispersal of exhaust emissions; engines would not be left running.
- Preventive maintenance of GEG/DG sets would be undertaken;
- Flaring would be undertaken in accordance with the CPCB Guidelines for Gaseous Emissions for Oil & Gas.

14.Details of solidwaste/Hazardous waste generation and its management:

- **Hazardous waste will be generated from Drilling operations are**
 - Sludge containing oil (Generation is dependent on type and duration of testing operations and well kick / blowout situations (10 m³)) - Disposed to ASPCB/ CPCB registered waste oil reprocessor.
 - Used/ spent oil (2-3 KL/well) -
 - Wastes/ residues containing oil - Disposed on-site in HDPE lined pits located on site as per S No. 72 C.1.a Schedule I Standards for Emission or Discharge of Environmental Pollutants from Oil Drilling and Gas Extraction Industry of CPCB as modified in 2005.
- **Solid waste will be generated from Drilling operations are**
 - Drill cutting generated from Water based Mud, not contaminated with oil (80-250 m³/well) - Drill cuttings

will be disposed off in a well designed pit lined with impervious liner located on site as per S No. 72 C.1.a Schedule I Standards for Emission or Discharge of Environmental Pollutants from Oil Drilling and Gas Extraction Industry of CPCB as modified in 2005.

- Drilling mud (1500 m3/ well) - Drilling mud will be analysed through MoEF&CC/ASPCB authorised laboratory and then disposed on-site in HDPE lined pits located on site as per S No. 72 C.1.a Schedule I Standards for Emission or Discharge of Environmental Pollutants from Oil Drilling and Gas Extraction Industry of CPCB as modified in 2005.
- Packaging wastes (250-500 kg/well) - Proper segregation and storage of recyclable waste in designated bins onsite. Recyclables will be periodically sold to local waste recyclers.
- Kitchen waste (10-20 kg/day) - will be stored in compost pits on a daily basis or disposed-off nearby municipal disposal site via local vendors.
- Recyclable waste like papers, plastics (150-200 Kg/well) - Proper segregation and storage of recyclable waste in designated bins onsite. Recyclables will be periodically sold to local waste recyclers.
- Left over chemicals and materials, scrap metal, sludges etc. (250-300 Kg/well) - Scrap metal and recoverable material to the salvages before dispose of balance material the registered vendors

15.Details of EMP are placed at Annexure-V.

16.The proposal was considered by the EAC (Ind-II) held during 25th- 27th February, 2020, on EAC meeting held on 26.06.2023, in EAC Ind-II meeting held on 18.07.2023 and (Meeting ID: EC/AGENDA/EAC/619956/8/2023) held on 04th September, 2023 in the Ministry, wherein the project proponent and the accredited Consultant ABC Technolabs India Pvt. Ltd, (NABET Certificate No. NABET/EIA/1922/RA0155 and validity 20th July 2023), presented the case. The Committee recommended the project for grant of environmental clearance.

17.The Committee noted that the EIA/EMP report is in compliance of the ToR issued for the project, reflecting the present environmental concerns and the projected scenario for all the environmental components. The Committee has found the baseline data is within NAAQ standards. The Committee has deliberated the action plan proposed by the project proponent to arrest the incremental GLC due to the project. The Committee has also deliberated on the CER plan and found to be addressing the issues in the study area. The EAC has deliberated the proposal and has made due diligence in the process as notified under the provisions of the EIA Notification, 2006, as amended from time to time and accordingly made the recommendations to the proposal. The Experts Members of the EAC have found the proposal in order and have recommended for grant of Environmental Clearance.

18.The Committee noted that the EIA/EMP report is in compliance of the ToR issued for the project, reflecting the present environmental concerns and the projected scenario for all the environmental components. The Committee has found the baseline data is within NAAQ standards. The Committee has deliberated the action plan proposed by the project proponent to arrest the incremental GLC due to the project. The Committee has also deliberated on the CER plan and found to be addressing the issues in the study area. The EAC has deliberated the proposal and has made due diligence in the process as notified under the provisions of the EIA Notification, 2006, as amended from time to time and accordingly made the recommendations to the proposal. The Experts Members of the EAC have found the proposal in order and have recommended for grant of Environmental Clearance.

19.The environmental clearance granted to the project/activity is strictly under the provisions of the EIA Notification 2006 and its amendments. It does not tantamount/construe to approvals/consent/ permissions etc. required to be obtained or standards/conditions to be followed under any other Acts/ Rules/ Subordinate legislations, etc., as may be applicable to the project. The project proponent shall obtain necessary permission as mandated under the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 and the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, as applicable from time to time, from the State Pollution Control Board, prior to construction & operation of the project.

20. Based on the proposal submitted by the project proponent and recommendations of the EAC (Industry-2), Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change hereby accords environmental clearance for **Development Drilling and Testing of Hydrocarbons in 5 wells in Dipling (10.14 sq km area) and 4 wells in Sapekhati (9.44 sq km area) in Charaideo (previously known as Sivsagar) district, Assam by M/s. Ramayana Ispat Pvt. Ltd,** under the provisions of the EIA Notification, 2006, and the amendments therein, subject to compliance of the terms and conditions.

21. The Ministry reserves the right to stipulate additional conditions, if found necessary at subsequent stages and the project proponent shall implement all the said conditions in a time bound manner. The Ministry may revoke or suspend the environmental clearance, if implementation of any of the above conditions is not found satisfactory.

22. Concealing factual data or submission of false/fabricated data and failure to comply with any of the conditions mentioned above may result in withdrawal of this clearance and attract action under the provisions of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

23. Any appeal against this environmental clearance shall lie with the National Green Tribunal, if preferred, within a period of 30 days as prescribed under Section 16 of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010.

24. The above conditions will be enforced, inter-alia under the provisions of the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, the Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, the Hazardous Waste (Management, Handling and Transboundary Movement) Rules, 2016 and the Public Liability Insurance Act, 1991 read with subsequent amendments therein.

Additional EC Conditions

Specific Conditions:

1. As proposed by the Project Proponent, out of 15 wells, the proposal for drilling of 4 wells from EC application (where public hearing for Dibrugarh district was not conducted) in Saojini field in Dibrugarh District, Assam as well as one well location of Dipling Block and one well location of Sapekhati Block have been dropped. Now, PP has to apply separately for the consideration of environmental clearance for the remaining 4 wells located in Saojini field in Dibrugarh District and one well locations of Dipling Block and one well location of Sapekhati Block in Charaideo Distinct, in case, they want to drill the said wells. Hence, EC has been granted for 9 wells only in Dipling and Sapekhati Field falling in Charaideo District.

2. Implementation of Action Plan on the issues raised during the Public Hearing shall be ensured. The Project Proponent shall undertake all the tasks as per the Action Plan submitted with budgetary provisions during the Public Hearing.

3. The company shall comply with all the environmental protection measures and safeguards proposed in the documents

submitted to the Ministry. All the recommendations made in the EIA/EMP in respect of environmental management, and risk mitigation measures relating to the project shall be implemented.

4.No pipelines or its part shall be laid in the Forest land/Protected Area without prior permission/approval from the Competent Authority.

5.Total fresh water requirement shall not exceed 25 CMD and will be met from surface water. Prior permission shall be obtained from the concerned regulatory authority.

6.The project proponent will treat and reuse the treated water within the drilling site and no waste or treated water shall be discharged outside the premises. Mobile ETP coupled with RO shall be installed to reuse the treated water in drilling system. Mobile STP shall also be installed. The size of the waste pit shall be equal to the hole volume+ volume of drill cutting and volume of discarded mud if any. Two feet free board may be left to accommodate rainwater. There shall be separate storm water channel and rainwater shall not be allowed to mix with wastewater. Level of the Drilling site shall be constructed in such a way that outside rainwater shall not enter into the drilling site. Alternatively, if possible, pit less drilling be practiced instead of above.

7.PP shall ensure the compliance of standards stipulated for flaring in the Environmental (Protection) Rules, 1986. In case of elevated flaring, the minimum stack height shall be 30 m. Height of stack shall be such that maximum GLC never exceeds the prescribed ambient air quality limit.

8.The company shall construct the garland drain to prevent runoff of any oil containing waste entering into the nearby water bodies. Separate drainage system shall be created for oil contaminated and non-oil contaminated wastes.

9.As proposed, produced formation water is stored in formation water tanks shall be disposed to the abandoned wells of ONGC after necessary treatment. Separated water from phase separation system will be treated in an ETP and will be reused. Treated effluent shall meet the water quality standards for re-injection well as per the CPCB/SPCB guidelines. PP shall monitor water quality of treated effluent regularly and maintain records.

10.During production, storage and handling, the fugitive emission of methane, if any, shall be monitored using Infra-red camera/ appropriate technology.

11.The project proponent also to ensure trapping/storing of the CO₂ generated, if any, during the process and handling.

12.Approach road shall be made pucca to minimize generation of suspended dust.

13.The project proponent shall make all arrangements for control of noise from the drilling activity. Acoustic enclosure shall be provided for the DG sets along with the adequate stack height as per CPCB guidelines.

14.Drill cuttings separated from drilling fluid shall be adequately washed and disposed in HDPE lined pit. Waste mud shall be tested for hazardous contaminants and disposed according to HOW(M&TM) Rules, 2016. No effluent/drilling mud shall be discharged/disposed off into nearby surface water bodies. The company shall comply with the guidelines for disposal of solid waste, drill cutting and drilling fluids for onshore drilling operation notified vide GSR.546(E) dated 30th August, 2005.

15.Oil spillage prevention and mitigation scheme shall be prepared. In case of oil spillage/ contamination, action plan shall be prepared to clean the site by adopting proven technology. The recyclable waste (oily sludge) and spent oil shall be disposed of to the authorized recyclers.

16.The project proponent shall take necessary measures to prevent fire hazards, containing oil spill and soil remediation as needed. At fixed installations or plants use of ground flare shall be explored.

17.The project proponent shall develop a contingency plan for H₂S release including all necessary aspects from evacuation to resumption of normal operations. The workers shall be provided with personal H₂S detectors in locations of high risk of exposure along with self-containing breathing apparatus.

18. Blow Out Preventer system shall be installed to prevent well blowouts during drilling operations.

19. On completion of the project, necessary measures shall be taken for safe plugging of wells with secured enclosures to restore the drilling site to the original condition. The same shall be confirmed by the concerned regulatory authority from environment safety angle. In case of hydrocarbon not found economically viable, a full abandonment plan shall be implemented for the drilling site in accordance with the applicable DGH / Indian Petroleum Regulations. After completion of drilling of any well, the owner or operator shall restore the well site, remove or fill all pits used to contain produced fluids or industrial waste and remove all drilling supplies and equipment not needed for production.

20. PP proposed to allocate Rs. 1.40 Crores towards Extended EMP (CER) which shall be spent as submitted in CER plan. Further, all the proposed activities under CER shall be completed within 2 years of commencement of project activities in consultation with District Administration.

21. End of life lead acid batteries shall be disposed in compliance with the rules specified in Battery Waste Management Rules,

22. Occupational health surveillance of the workers shall be carried out as per the prevailing Acts and Rules. All workers & employees shall be provided with required safety kits/mask for personal protection.

23. Oil content in the drill cuttings shall be monitored and report & shall sent to the Ministry's Regional Office.

24. The project proponent shall prepare operating manual in respect of all activities, which would cover all safety & environment related issues and measures to be taken for protection. One set of environmental manual shall be made available at the drilling site/ project site. Awareness shall be created at each level of the management. All the schedules and results of environmental monitoring shall be available at the project site office. Remote monitoring of site should be done.

25. PP should establish in house (at project site) environment laboratory for measurement of environment parameter with respect to air quality and water (surface and ground). A dedicated team to oversee environment management shall be setup at site which should comprise of Environment Engineers, Laboratory chemist and staff for monitoring of air, water quality parameters on routine basis instead of engaging environment monitoring laboratories/consultants. Any non-compliance or infringement should be reported to the concerned authority

26. The Project Proponent shall undertake Occupational Health survey for initial and Periodical medical examination of the workers engaged in the Project and maintain records accordingly as per the provisions of the Mines Rules, 1955 and DGMS Circulars. Besides carrying out regular periodic health check-up of their workers, 20% of the workers engaged in active drilling operations shall be subjected to health check-up for occupational diseases and hearing impairment, if any.

27. Greenbelt will be developed for GGS and EPS in total area of 1.1979 hectares i.e., 33% of total project area with tree density @ 2500 trees per hectares, mainly along the plant periphery. Indigenous species shall only be developed as part of greenbelt and non-indigenous / alien species shall be replaced with native species. No invasive or alien or non-native tree species shall be selected for plantation. PP shall develop at least 20 variety of species as a part of greenbelt. Saplings 4-6 feet high shall be planted. Selection of plant species shall be as per the CPCB guidelines in consultation with the State Forest Department and native species shall be developed. Records of tree canopy shall be monitored through remote sensing map. Greenbelt development shall be completed before commissioning of the plant.

28. PP shall sensitize and create awareness among the people working within the project area as well as its surrounding area on the ban of Single Use Plastic in order to ensure the compliance of Notification published by MOEFCC on 12th August, 2021. A report along with photographs on the measures taken shall also be included in the six-monthly compliance report being submitted to concerned authority.

GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE

1. No further expansion or modifications in the plant, other than mentioned in the EIA Notification, 2006 and its amendments, shall be carried out without prior approval of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change/SEIAA, as applicable. In case of deviations or alterations in the project proposal from those submitted to this Ministry for clearance, a fresh reference shall be made to the Ministry/SEIAA, as applicable, to assess the adequacy of conditions imposed and to add additional environmental protection measures required, if any.
2. The energy source for lighting purpose shall be preferably LED based, or advanced having preference in energy conservation and environment betterment.
3. The overall noise levels in and around the plant area shall be kept well within the standards by providing noise control measures including acoustic hoods, silencers, enclosures etc. on all sources of noise generation. The ambient noise levels shall conform to the standards prescribed under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 Rules, 1989 viz. 75 dBA (day time) and 70 dBA (night time).
4. The company shall undertake all relevant measures for improving the socio-economic conditions of the surrounding area. CER activities shall be undertaken by involving local villages and administration and shall be implemented. The company shall undertake eco-developmental measures including community welfare measures in the project area for the overall improvement of the environment.
5. The company shall earmark sufficient funds towards capital cost and recurring cost per annum to implement the conditions stipulated by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change as well as the State Government along with the implementation schedule for all the conditions stipulated herein. The funds so earmarked for environment management/ pollution control measures shall not be diverted for any other purpose.
6. A copy of the clearance letter shall be sent by the project proponent to concerned Panchayat, Zilla Parishad/Municipal Corporation, Urban local Body and the local NGO, if any, from whom suggestions/ representations, if any, were received while processing the proposal.
7. The project proponent shall also submit six monthly reports on the status of compliance of the stipulated Environmental Clearance conditions including results of monitored data (both in hard copies as well as by e-mail) to the respective Regional Office of MoEF&CC, the respective Zonal Office of CPCB and SPCB. A copy of Environmental Clearance and six monthly compliance status report shall be posted on the website of the company.
8. The environmental statement for each financial year ending 31st March in Form-V as is mandated shall be submitted to the concerned State Pollution Control Board as prescribed under the Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986, as amended subsequently, shall also be put on the website of the company along with the status of compliance of environmental clearance conditions and shall also be sent to the respective Regional Offices of MoEF&CC by e-mail.
9. The project proponent shall inform the public that the project has been accorded environmental clearance by the Ministry and copies of the clearance letter are available with the SPCB/Committee and may also be seen at Website of the Ministry and at <https://parivesh.nic.in/>. This shall be advertised within seven days from the date of issue of the clearance letter, at least in two local newspapers that are widely circulated in the region of which one shall be in the vernacular language of the locality concerned and a copy of the same shall be forwarded to the concerned Regional Office of the Ministry.
10. The project authorities shall inform the Regional Office as well as the Ministry, the date of financial closure and final approval of the project by the concerned authorities and the date of start of the project.
11. This Environmental clearance is granted subject to final outcome of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Hon'ble High Court, Hon'ble NGT and any other Court of Law, if any, as may be applicable to this project.
