

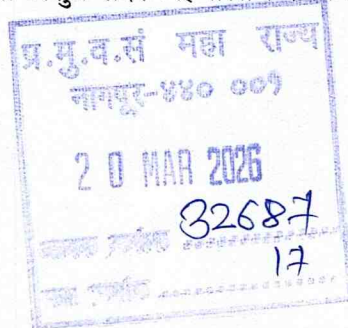

SOIL AND MOISTURE CONSERVATION PLAN

INTRODUCTION TO DIVISION/ RANGEWISE LOCATION SPECIFIC SMC PLAN:

It is important that a SOIL AND MOISTURE CONSERVATION PLAN should provide site specific prescription for the activities to be undertaken under each heading of the SMC Plan components.

Objective of Study

The broad objectives for preparation of Soil and Moisture Conservation are outlined as under:

- i) Checking soil erosion and land degradation by taking up adequate and effective soil conservation measures, both engineering as well as biological, in erosion prone areas (mainly under very severe and severe erosion intensity categories)
- ii) Rehabilitation of degraded forest areas through afforestation and facilitation natural regeneration.
- iii) Rehabilitation of degraded slopes and landslide areas.

Analysis of problem: -

Soil Erosion:

The lack of vegetative cover is a major contributing factor to accelerated soil erosion and environmental degradation in the tract. Ideally, dense tree cover or forests would provide the best protection against soil loss and environmental degradation. However, conditions in the tract are otherwise. Large areas are either barren or support only sparse tree cover. The lower reaches of the tract along the river are generally barren and devoid of tree growth, while good forest cover is confined to the upper reaches. These natural conditions therefore act as a limiting factor in addressing the problems of soil erosion and environmental degradation. Nevertheless, remedial measures can be undertaken to minimize their impact to some extent.

Treatment Measures:

SOIL AND MOISTURE CONSERVATION PLAN is the optimal use of Soil and water resources within a given geographical area so as to enable sustainable production. It implies changes in land use, vegetative cover, and other structural and non-structural action that are taken in SMC. The overall objectives of SOIL AND MOISTURE CONSERVATION PLAN are to;

- Increase infiltration into soil
- Control excessive runoff
- Manage & utilize runoff for useful purpose

Shrub Plantation: -

Grazing land Development: -

Grazing land development will be undertaken for treatment under silvo-pastoral model. Areas will be closed and staggered trenching of size 30x30 cm will be dug over the area to be treated. About 400 running meters of trenches will be dug per hectare. Improved variety of grass will be sown on the berm of the trenches. In the space between the reaches, fodder tree species shall be raised. Suggested species for grazing land development are *Heteropogon contortus* (Marvel grass / Spear grass), *Cenchrus ciliaris* (Buffel grass), *Cenchrus setigerus*.

Bothriochloa pertusa, *Dichanthium annulatum* (Marvel grass / *Palat grass*), *Eragrostis species*, *Cyndon dactylon* *Desmostachya bipinnata*, *Digitaria sps.* etc.

Engineering measures: -

- i) Moisture Retention measures
- ii) Drainage Line Treatment

Land use/ Land cover

Based on the interpretation of IRS Resourcesat-2 LISS III and subsequent ISFR 2023 assessment data, the forest cover of Maharashtra State for the year 2025-26 stands at 50,858 sq. km, accounting for approximately 16.50% of the State's total geographical area. Of this forest cover, about 19.4% falls under Very Dense Forest, 42.4% under Moderately Dense Forest, and 38.2% under Open Forest classes. This represents a net increase of approximately 60 sq. km in forest cover compared to the preceding forest assessment cycle (ISFR 2021). In addition, Maharashtra has a substantial tree cover of about 14,525 sq. km outside recorded forests, contributing to the overall greening of the State. Forest and tree cover combined, however, remain below the 33% target envisaged under the National Forest Policy.

- Very Dense Forest: All Lands with tree cover of canopy density of 70% and above
- Moderately Dense Forest: All lands with tree cover of canopy density between 40% and 70% above
- Open Forest: All lands with tree cover of canopy density between 10% and 40%
- Scrub: All forest lands with poor tree growth mainly of small or stunted trees having canopy density less than 10%
- Non-Forest: Any area not included in the above classes

All the classes except non forest classified by FSI were used as it is and the non-forest area was further classified into grazing land, agricultural land, settlement, barren land and water body. These classes are defined as below:

- Agriculture Land: These are the lands primarily used for farming and for production of food, fiber, and other commercial and horticultural crops.
- Settlement: It is an area of human habitation developed due to non-agricultural use and has a cover of buildings, transport and communication, utilities in association with water, vegetation and vacant lands. It consists of urban as well as rural areas.
- Grazing: These are the areas of natural grass along with other vegetation, predominantly grass like plants and non-grass-like herbs (except Lantana species which are to be classified as scrub). It includes natural/ semi-natural grass/ grazing lands.
- Barren Land: These are rock exposures of varying lithology often barren and devoid of soil and vegetation cover.
- Water body (River): Rivers/streams are natural course of water flowing on the land surface along a definite channel/slope.

Katol & Narkhed Ranges of Nagpur Division – The project falls under the jurisdiction of the Narkhed and Katol Ranges. The specific beats affected by the diversion of 0.34 ha shall be treated under this plan. Out of the total 0.34 ha land, 0.26 ha is forest land under the jurisdiction of the Forest Department, and 0.08 ha is Zudpi land under the Revenue Department. Hence, the Soil Conservation Plan is being proposed for the 0.26 ha of protected forest land only.
