The Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change, Integrated Regional Office, Additional Office Block for GPOA, 1st Floor, Shastri Bhawan, Haddows Road, Nungambakkam, Chennai-600 006 has given In- Principal approval for a validity of 5 years subjecting to conditions for compliance by the user agency i.e., NHAI via parivesh portal. Further, also mentioned that, the approval given by IRO is prior approval of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India/CEC for felling of tree of spontaneous origin.

Accordingly, an interlocutory application was filed for obtaining permission from the CEC in Hon'ble Supreme court of India. Subsequently, an order has been obtained on 11-01-2023. (uploaded in website on 22-01-2023).

The Copy of the In-principal approval was forwarded to this office by the Wild Life Warden, Nagpattinam vide letter cited above under ref (3) for submission of four copies of detailed compliance report with support documents and photos for onward submission to the Nodal officer for Stage-II Clearance.

Application for impleadment is allowed for the purpose of directions.

I.A. Nos. 168320/2022 and 168313/2022 have been filed by the NHAI, Puducherry, seeking permission to remove 177 spontaneous trees in the Gopalasamudram, Reserve Forest Block, Kollidam River Bed in Sirkazhi Range of Nagapattinam District from Poondiyankuppam to Sattanathapuram Design Chainage Km: 106 + 200 to 106+568 for laying a fourlane road in Poondiyankuppam to Sattanathapuram section of NH-45A.

I.A. NO.191583/2022 is filed by the State of Tamil Nadu seeking permission to fell four trees in the Mahanyam Reserved Forest Area, Kancheepuram District for the upgradation of road between Mahaniyam to Padappai (Km 0/0 – 1/200).

These applications have been filed in view of the order passed by this Court on 12.12.1996, reported in <u>T.N. Godavarman</u> <u>Thirumulkpad</u> v. <u>Union of India</u>, (1997) 2 SCC 267, wherein a ban was imposed by this Court on felling of trees in all forest areas where there was a continuous growth.

It is to be noted that when the order was passed by this Court in 1996, the Compensatory Afforestation Fund Act, 2016, Forest Conservation Rules, 2022 and Compensatory Afforestation Fund Rules, 2018 were not brought into force.

We have heard Shri A.D.N. Rao, learned senior counsel, who appears as Amicus Curiae and Shri K. Parameshwar, learned counsel,



who also appears as Amicus Curiae and Shri Mahendra Vyas, Advocate, a Member of the CEC. We have also heard learned counsel appearing for the NHAI and for the State of Tamil Nadu.

The counsel for the NHAI as well as the State of Tamil Nadu submit that on account of a condition which requires permission of this Court to be obtained for felling of the trees for execution of public projects, at times, the projects are delayed for long periods, which substantially enhances the cost of the project. They further submit that after the 1996 order was passed, various statutory provisions have come into force, which take adequate care of the matters relating to environment.

Shri K. Parameshwar, learned Amicus Curiae, has also placed on record his note recommending certain conditions, subject to which the authorities may be permitted to grant permission for felling of the trees.

Shri Mahendra Vyas has expressed his concern that when the permissions are being granted by the Competent Authority, the authorities granting permission do not provide for steps to ensure mitigating measures for free flow of wildlife from one part of the forest to the other part, divided by road.

We may take note of the order passed by the Nagpur Bench of the Bombay High Court in a Suo Motu matter in the case of *The Court* on its own motion v. National Highway Authority of India, Nagpur and Others, wherein the Court, while considering the issue of widening of the National Highway No. 44 from Nagpur to Jabalpur, which passes through Pench Tiger Reserve, had directed various mitigation measures to be undertaken. The Court had issued certain



directions after consulting the Wildlife Institute of India (WII), the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) and the National Environmental Engineering Research Institute (NEERI). The said project was the first project which provided for mitigation measures for free flow of wildlife. The underpasses having adequate height and length, which would ensure the continuity of the forest, were directed to be constructed, so that there is no obstruction for free flow of wildlife from one part of the forest to the other part of the forest, divided by road.

Recently, in Maharashtra, a Greenfield Project, namely the Samruddhi Mahamarg has been constructed, which has also provided underpasses as well as over-passes for free flow of wildlife from one part of the forest to the other part of the forest, divided by the roads.

We are of the considered view that, the authorities should take care to ensure that mitigating measures, on the aforesaid lines, are provided for, while granting permission for construction or expansion of the roads.

As already stated hereinabove, when the order dated 12.12.1996 was passed by this Court, 2016 Act so also 2018 and 2022 Rules were not brought into force. Now, 2016 Act, so also 2018 and 2022 Rules address the concern of compensatory afforestation, whenever the permission for felling of trees is required to be granted.

The said provisions provide that before felling of trees, the permission of the Competent Authorities is to be taken and such permissions are to be granted only after the measures for compensatory afforestation are ensured.



It cannot be disputed that the development cannot be stalled, with the only requirement being that it should be sustainable and that at the same time, adequate measures for causing minimal damage to the environment must be undertaken.

We find that since now there are statutory enactments taking care of these requirements, requiring the State or any of the authorities to approach this Court every now and then for permission to cut the trees, would cause unnecessary delay in execution of the projects. In some of the cases, the applications are pending since 2018. It is common knowledge that delay in execution of the project enhances the cost, at times multi fold, thereby causing a dent to the public exchequer.

We are, therefore, of the considered view that in order to ensure that delay in projects is avoided and at the same time the environment concerns are addressed, the order dated 12.12.1996 passed by this Court needs to be modified so far as it concerns the State of Tamil Nadu.

We, therefore, direct that the order requiring permission of this Court for felling of trees in all forest areas in respect of any road projects initiated by the State Government, National Highway Authority of India or any other instrumentality of the State, which involves cutting of up to 500 trees is recalled, however, subject to the following conditions:-

1. Such felling shall be done only after necessary approval under the Forest Conservation Act, 1980, Forest Conservation Rules, 2022, Compensatory Afforestation Fund Act, 2016 and Compensatory Afforestation Fund Rules, 2018 are obtained from the Competent

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Authority under the said enactments.

2. The projects would be permitted only after the concurrence of the Integrated Regional Office (IRO), Chennai.

3. While granting such permissions, the authorities also should provide for necessary mitigation measures for ensuring free flow of the wildlife from one part of the forest to the other whenever such forest is divided by roads.

However, such modification shall not apply in respect of the roads which are required to be constructed or upgraded inside wildlife sanctuaries, national parks, tiger reserves and elephant corridors.

The applications are, accordingly, disposed of.

GOPALSAMUDIRAM RESERVE FOREST:

Gopasamudiram Reserve Forest is notified in the year 1981 vide G.O.Ms.No.5169/91 Dated.09.12.1981. It has an area of 170.66 Ha. The Reserve Forest is present in the right side flood plain of Coleroon River (11.323821 N 79.705551 E). At present most of the area is inside Coleroon River and balance area is covered with natural vegetation.

The fauna present in the area includes palm civet, monitor lizard, jackal, snakes, peacock, Indian mangoose, monkey, etc. The trees required to be felled for the project are spontaneous trees. The User Agency is instructed to fulfill the project with the following recommendations for mitigation measures:

Recommendation No.1:

The proposed road should be designed leaving a wildlife passageway underneath the road.

Wildlife Passage way will facilitate movement of wildlife in between the forest patches present east and west of the proposed road. As the road bisect the RF the wildlife passage way is essential under the road. The structure shall be included in the project design.

Recommendation No.2:

Construction of two Forest Ponds at eastern and western part of the RF.

Construction of two forest ponds in Gopalasamudiram RF at a cost of Rs.5,00,000/-. This work will be implemented by the Forest Department. The cost will be provided by the User Agency.



Recommendation No.3:

Construction of Pump house with Solar energized water pump near the water trough for supplying water to the wildlife.

Two pump houses will be constructed near the proposed forest ponds at a cost of 3.00 lakhs each. Two 2 HP motor, solar panels and battery setup will be installed in the pump house at a cost of Rs.3.00 lakhs each. Totally Rs.12.00 Lakhs for the entire structures. The proposed road passes through the drinking spots of wild animals. Therefore this component is proposed to avoid any disturbance to animals for drinking water. This work will be implemented by the Forest Department. The cost will be provided by the User Agency.

Please refer to the State Government's letter No. 11662/FR.10/2022-1 dated 12.09.2022 and online application No.FP/TN/ROAD/151511/2022 seeking prior approval of the Central Government for diversion of forest land in accordance with Section'2' of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for the above mentioned project.

After careful consideration of the proposal submitted by the State Government and considering the importance of the project, I am directed to convey the Central Government's in principle approval (Stage-I) under Section '2' of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 2.5553 ha of forest land for widening and improvement of existing carriage way to 4-laning of Poondiyankuppam-Sathanathapuram section of NH-45A in the State of Tamil Nadu under NHDP Phase IV (Pkg-3) Bridge across Gopalasamudram RF in Nagapattinam District in favour of NHAI, PIU, Puducherry, Bommaiyapalayam, Tamil Nadu, for a period of 20 years, subject to the following conditions:-

- (i) Legal status of the diverted forest land shall remain unchanged;
- Demarcation of the proposed forest area shall be carried out by erecting 4 feet high cement concrete pillars duly numbered at an interval of 20 meters at the cost of the User Agency;

- (iii) The State Forest Department shall carry out compensatory afforestation over an extent of 5.2 ha of Degraded Forest Land identified in Point Calimere wildlife Sanctuary, in Kodiakarai Range, at the cost of the User Agency;
- (iv) Identified CA area and CA scheme shall not be changed without prior approval of Central Government;
- (v) The State Government shall charge the Net Present Value of the diverted forest land measuring 2.5553 ha from the User Agency as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 28.03.2008 and 09.05.2008 in IA Nos.826 in 566 with related IA's in Writ Petition (Civil) No.202/1995 and Ministry's guideline No. 5-3/2011-FC(Vol-I) dated 06.01.2022 and clarification issued vide letter dated 19.01.2022 and 22.03.2022
- (vi) Additional amount of the Net Present Value (NPV) of the diverted forest land if any, becoming due after revision of the same by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in future, shall be charged by the State Government from the User Agency. The User Agency shall furnish an undertaking to this effect;
- (vii) All the funds received from the User Agency under the project shall be transferred/ deposited to CAMPA fund only through e-portal (<u>https://parivesh.nic.in/</u>);
- (viii) The User Agency shall construct retaining walls and check walls wherever required, by consulting the DFO concerned, at the project cost;
- (ix) The User Agency shall carryout avenue plantation and its maintenance on sides of the road at the cost of the project;
- (x) The User Agency shall obtain prior approval of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India / CEC for felling of tree of spontaneous origin and UA shall abide by the recommendations of the CEC. The State Government shall not issue working permission till prior approval of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India / CEC, realization of all levies and compliance of other conditions for issuing of such working permission;
- (xi) As the wildlife like Palm civet, Monitor lizard, Jackal, Cobra, etc wildlife present in and around the forest land proposed for diversion, the site specific Wildlife mitigation plan duly approved by the CWLW shall be implemented at the project cost;
- (xii) Construction of culverts / bridges, if any, over the natural streams/rivers/canals shall be done in such a manner that it does not

hamper the natural course of water, does not give rise to water-logging, and also does not hamper movement of wild animals. The pillars, if necessary to be constructed in the river, then proper precaution may be taken to ensure that it does not hamper the natural course of water;

- (xiii) Roadside cuttings and fillings which require engineering support shall be provided as per the instructions of the DFO concerned so as to stabilize the soil;
- (xiv) The dug out material / overburden shall be dumped outside the forest area. Storage of any material shall not be done in the forest area;
- (xv) The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Central Government;
- (xvi) The User Agency shall provide fire wood preferably alternate fuel to labourers working at the site to avoid damage/tree felling and no labour camp shall be established inside the forest area;
- (xvii) Disturbance shall be kept minimum by creating labour camps outside the forest area as far as possible and it shall be the responsibility of the User Agency to ensure that the labourers & staff engaged in execution of work do not destruct nearby forest flora & fauna;
- (xviii) The total forest area utilized for the project shall not exceed <u>2.5553 ha</u> and the forest area diverted shall not be used for any purpose other than those shown in the diversion proposal. The User Agency shall furnish an undertaking to this effect;
- (xix) The forest land proposed for diversion shall under no circumstances be transferred or sublet to any other agency, department or person without prior approval of the Central Government;
- (xx) The User Agency and the State Government shall ensure compliance to provisions of the all Acts, Rules, Regulations and Guidelines, for the time being in force, as applicable to the project;
- (xxi) Any other conditions that the Central Government or Regional Officer (Central) of Integrated Regional Office, Chennai may impose from time to time in the interest of afforestation, conservation and management of flora and fauna in the area, shall be complied by the User Agency;
- (xxii) In the event of failure to comply with any of the above conditions the User Agency is liable for penal action as per the rules / guidelines issued under FCA, 1980;

(xxiii) The State Government shall process and submit compliance report on the above conditions through online (<u>https://parivesh.nic.in/</u>);

After receipt of the compliance report on above mentioned conditions, the proposal will be considered for final approval. This in-principle approval shall be valid for a period of 5 years from the date of issue of this letter. In the event of non-compliance of the above conditions, this in-principle approval shall automatically stand revoked after 5 years.

This approval is subject to prior approval of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India / CEC for felling of tree of spontaneous origin
