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14. The user agency shall obtain environmental clearance, 2006 if required.
15. The user agency shall carry out muck disposal at pre-designated sites in such manner so as to avoid its rolling down.
16. The dumping area for muck disposal shall be stabilized and reclaimed by planting suitable species by the user agency at the cost of project under the supervision of State Forest Department. Retaining walls terracing shall be carried out to hold the dumping material in place. Stabilization and reclamation of such dumping sites shall be completed before handing over the same to the State Forest Department in a time bound manner as per plan.
17. The user agency shall consult organization (s) having experience in construction of roads in hilly areas to avoid frequent road blocks due to landslides etc. and shall provide beast walls and retaining wherever necessary.
18. The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Central Government.
19. All other conditions as may be mandatory under relevant Acts, Rules and guidelines shall be complied with by the user agency.

2. the proposal has been initiated by Executive Engineer, Minor Irrigation Division, Chandrapur for diversion of 56.860 ha. Zudpi Jungle land /Protected Forest land for construction Kotal barrage Project under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The proposed project shall benefit 20 villages of Gadchiroli, district. The total irrigable command area of the project is 6620 ha. the storage capacity of Barrage is 59.524 Mm³ and average annual utilization is 103.22 Mm³. The basic aim of the proposed project is to provide water availability for three lift irrigation schemes and virgin command on the banks of rivers in Naxal prone Gadchiroli, district in the State of Maharashtra. The proposed forest land for this project is mainly required for submergence in low lying area below designed level. The water utilization of the project is as under:

3. The project is administratively approved by the Government of Maharashtra, Water Resources Department, Government Resolution No. AA-2011/776/(263/2011)/WRD, dt. 05.11.2011. The total non-forest area involved in the project is 376.96 ha. The site inspection report of the Chief Conservator of forests (T), Gadchiroli and the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Wadsa Forest Division, Chandrapur are enclosed with the proposal.

4. There are 481 tree of various species and girth coming in the submergence area proposed for diversion.

5. The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Wadsa, Deputy Conservator of Forest, Gadchiroli and Divisional Forest Officer, Chandrapur have certified that there is no cutting and felling of the trees involved in the implementation of the project.

6. The District Collector, Gadchiroli, district Collector, Chandrapur, Deputy Conservator of Forests, Wads Forest Division Wadsa, DCF, Gadchiroli Forest Division, Gadchiroli and Divisional Forest Officer, Chandrapur Forest Division, Chandrapur have certified that no alternate alignment is possible and the forest land required is the barest minimum.

7. The user agency has agreed to defray the cost of CA over degraded forest land.

8. The user agency has submitted an undertaking to defray the cost of Net Present value of the forest land proposed under diversion.

9. The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Wadsa, Deputy Conservator of Forest, Gadchiroli and Divisional Forest Officer, Chandrapur have certified that the area involved in the project does not form part of any existing National Park, Wildlife Sanctuary, Nature Reserve etc.

10. The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Wadsa, Deputy Conservator of Forest, Gadchiroli and Divisional Forest Officer, Chandrapur have certified that the proposed project is beyond 10 km of boundaries of the Protected Area (Wildlife Sanctuary and National Park).

11. The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Wadsa, Deputy Conservator of Forest, Gadchiroli and Divisional Forest Officer, Chandrapur have certified that the area involved in the project does not affect any monumental site of cultural, historical, religious, archaeological or recreational importance.

12. The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Wadsa, Deputy Conservator of Forest, Gadchiroli and Divisional Forest Officer, Chandrapur have certified that there is no violation of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

13. The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Wadsa, Deputy Conservator of Forest, Gadchiroli and Divisional Forest Officer, Chandrapur have certified that it is contiguous & suitable for management purpose and it is free from encroachment and encumbrances.

14. The User Agency has submitted the certificates of Collector, Chandrapur and Collector, Gadchiroli under Schedule Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dweller's (Recognition of Forest rights) Act 2006.

The PCCF (HoFF), Maharashtra State, Nagpur has recommended the proposal subject to the conditions, given in his specific recommendations, under Section-2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. His specific recommendations are given in the proposal

Comments of Additional Information By :**i. TO Remarks**

— The Shape file as given for proposed diversion and sites identified for CA purpose has been examine by DSS cell and their observation are ;

In Case of Land proposed for Diversion:

1. Proposed forest area for diversion falls under Chandrapur & Garhchiroli district of Maharashtra State.
2. Calculated area of Shape file/ KML file of Forest land proposed for diversion is found 57.83 ha
3. There is no WLS/ PA/ Tiger Reserve or Tiger Corridor is located within 10 Km radius of proposed area for diversion.
4. As depicted through High resolution satellite imagery, there are presence of Agricultural fields inside the proposed area for diversion.
5. Forest Cover: Out of total forest area proposed for diversion, 1 ha of land is characterized with Open forest, 1 ha of land as water and 56 ha. of land as Non Forest in terms of forest classes (as per the ISFR 2015) based on the interpretation of satellite data period 2013-2014.
6. Forest Types details: 5A/C3 Southern Dry Mixed Deciduous Forest: 1 ha & Non-Forest: 57 ha.

In Case of Compensatory Afforestation Land:

1. Compensatory afforestation has been proposed over Zudpi land (As reported by the Deputy conservator of Forest, Wardha Forest Division, Government of Maharashtra)
 2. CA has been provided in Twelve different patches falling under the Wardha district of Maharashtra State.
 3. Total area of proposed Compensatory afforestation land is found 146.69 ha.
