Proposal for seeking prior approval of the Central Government under Section Sub: 2(1)(ii) of the Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980 for nonforestry use of balance 41.819 ha of forest land (32.425 ha of DLC forest land for mining and allied activities, safety zone area of 8.568 ha and greenery of 0.826 ha) in addition to already diverted 567.087 ha of forest land in Joda East Iron & Manmora Manganese Mines in favour of M/s Tata Steel Ltd. in Keonjhar Forest Division of Odisha during 3rd RML period.

SITE INSPECTION REPORT IN RESPECT OF DIVERSION OF BALANCE 41.819 HA (32.425 HA OF DLC FOREST LAND FOR MINING AND ALLIED ACTIVITIES, SAFETY ZONE OF 8.568 HA AND GREENERY O F0.826 HA) IN ADDITION TO ALREADY DIVERTED 567.087 HA OF FOREST LAND JODA EAST IRON & MANMORA MANGANESE MINES OF M/S TATA STEEL LTD. IN KEONJHAR FOREST DIVISION OF ODISHA DURING 3RD RML PERIOD.

The site inspection of the above project was carried out by the undersigned on 05.04.2024 & 06.04.2024 along with DFO, Keonjhar and representatives from the user agency.

1. Legal status of the forest land proposed for diversion:

As reported by State Govt., legal status of the forest land is as below:

2. Wildlife:

It is informed that faunal species noticed in the area includes Python (*Python mlurus*) Cobra (*Naja naja naja*), Krait (*Bungarus caeruleus*), Viper (*Viper Russel*), Rabbit (*Oryctolagus cunniculus*), Pangolin (*Monis cassicaudata*), Wild boar (*Sus scrofa*). Also movement of wild Elephant is often noticed in the nearby area.

Whether forest area proposed for diversion is important from wildlife point of view or not:

The DFO, Keonjhar has reported that the area does not form a part of any National Park/Wildlife Sanctuary/Elephant corridor, but it falls within Elephant Habitat Zone-2 as per ORSAC report.

As such the user agency has to bear the proportionate cost @ Rs.43,000/- per hectare of leasehold area towards implementation of the comprehensive Regional Wildlife Management Plan covering the entire mining belt prepared for Bonai and Keonjhar Division as per revised norm approved by Govt. of Odisha. As reported, the lessee has deposited an amount of Rs.1,34,21,859/- towards proportionate cost of Regional Wildlife Management Plan at pre-revised rate of Rs.20,000/- per ha ha for 671.093 ha out of due amount of Rs.2,88,56,999/-. The lessee has also furnished an undertaking to bear the differential cost of Wildlife Management Plan. Further, the State Govt. has recommended that the user agency also pay towards cost of implementation of Site Specific Wildlife Conservation Plan.

3. Vegetation:

The density of vegetation is reported to be 0.2.

(a) Total number of trees to be felled.

The tree enumeration in 10 nos. of sample plots 1.00 ha each has been undertaken for virgin forest land of 32.425 ha proposed for mining activities. It has been estimated by the DFO, Keonjhar Forest Division that 443 nos. of trees above 30 cm and 1235 nos. of trees below 30 cm girth have been enumerated in 10 nos. of sample plots of 1.00 ha each. By extrapolating this figure in 32.425 ha, 1436 nos. of trees (above 30 cm girth) and 4005 nos. of trees below 30 cm girth) are assessed to be available in the virgin area which may be

required to felled. Similarly, tree enumeration over the remaining 9.394 ha, that includes safety zone of 8.568 ha and greenery area of 0.826 have also been taken up which reveals that 710 nos. of trees above 30 cm girth and 4795 no. of trees below 30 cm girth are existing over the area which are to be preserved. As such, 10,946 no. of trees are available in the whole forest area of 41.891 ha proposed for diversion.

Effect of removal of trees on the general ecosystem in the area:

As there are large numbers of trees to be felled, it will affect the general ecosystem of the area. Trees should be felled in a phased manner when absolutely essential to remove to minimize the adverse impact on the eco-system.

(b) Important species:

As reported by the State Govt., the tree species available in the applied area is Sal (Shorea robusta), Siali (Bauhinia vahlii), Dhaura (Annogeisus latifolia), Asan (Terminalia tomentosa), Kendu (Diospyros melanoxylon), Gambhari (Gmelina arborea), Char (Buchnania lanzan), Mahul (Madhuca indica), Neem (Azadirachta indica) etc. Sal is pre-dominant species.

4. Background note on the proposal:

The applied mining lease was originally held by the then Maharaja, Keonjhar Estate over an area of 2.59 Sq. Miles. The said lease was granted by Superintendent, Keonjhar State in favour of M/s Tata Iron & Steel Co. Ltd. for a period of 30 years with effect from 01.07.1925 to 30.06.1955. The lease deed was executed and registered on 28.04.1926.

1st Renewal of Mining Lease was granted for a period of 30 years w.e.f. 01.07.1955 to 30.06.1985 over the same area of (i.e. 2.59 Sq. Miles) by Mining & Geology Department, Govt. of Odisha vide letter No.III(A)MG-21/57 dated 21.08.1957. The lease deed was executed on 19.07.1965.

2nd Renewal of Mining Lease was granted in favour of M/s TISCO Ltd. for a period of 20 years w.e.f. 01.07.1985 to 30.06.2005 by the Mining & Geology Department, Govt. of Odisha vide letter No.III(A)SM-7/97-7533/SM dated 21.08.1997 over a reduced area of 671.093 ha and lease deed was executed and registered on 20.01.1998. During 2nd RML period, the user agency has obtained diversion of forest land of 521.622 ha in this lease vide MoEF letter No.8-32/93-FC dated 16.01.1997.

During the year 2005, name of M/s TISCO Ltd. was changed to M/s Tata Steel Ltd. The Steel & Mines Department, Govt. of Odisha vide letter dated 17.11.2006 communicated their acceptance of the change of name of the Company. M/s Tata Steel Ltd. had applied for 3rd Renewal of Mining Lease for 20 years over same area of 671.093 ha w.e.f. 01.07.2005 to 30.06.2025 on 19.04.2004 i.e. one year prior to expiry of 2nd RML period on 30.06.2005. The applied Mining Lease area is having 671.093 ha which consists of 608.906 ha of forest land (520.727 ha of Baitarani R.F., 0.927 ha of Khesra Forest, 87.252 ha DLC forest) and 62.187 ha of non-forest land. During 3rd RML period, out of total forest land of 608.906 ha, the user agency had applied for diversion of 567.087 ha comprising of 133.309 ha of earlier broken forest land, 378.123 ha broken during 2nd RML period, 1.185 ha for Magazine house and 54.470 ha of broken up non-forest land included in the DLC report for mining and allied activities leaving the balance 41.819 ha (8.568 ha for safety zone, 0.826 ha Khesra forest for greenery and 32.425 ha of DLC forest land for future exploration). Govt. of India, MoEF had granted Stage-II/Final forest clearance over an area of 567.087 ha of forest land (including 54.470 ha of DLC forest land) vide letter No.8-32/1993-FC (Vol.II) dated 24.09.2007.

As per provisions of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, forest land cannot be assigned without obtaining prior permission of MoEF, Govt. of India under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. Further, the guidelines of MoEF bearing No.11-362/2012-FC dated 01.02.2013 requires seeking diversion of entire forest land within the lease within a period of two years. In view of this, the 41.891 ha of balance forest land in this lease is required to be diverted during 3rd RML period. Meanwhile, the State Govt. in Steel & Mines Department have decided in in-principle to renew the lease during 3rd RML and issued the relevant order under Section 8(3) of MMDR Act, 1957 vide No.4072 dated 31.05.2014.

Ministry vide letter No.8-32/1993-FC (Vol.-II) dated 10.10.2017 has granted Stage-I approval for change in land use pattern over already diverted area of 567.087 ha of forest land in Joda East Iron Ore Mine and Manmora Manganese Mines of M/s Tata Steel Ltd.

The present proposal is for diversion of balance 41.819 ha of forest land (32.425 ha of DLC forest land for mining & allied activities, Safety zone area of 8.568 ha and greenery of 0.826 ha) in addition to already diverted 567.087 ha of forest land in Joda East Iron & Manmora Manganese Mines of M/s Tata Steel Ltd. during 3rd RML period.

5. Compensatory afforestation:

The details of non-forest land required for compensatory afforestation is indicated below:

In lieu of 32.425 ha of virgin DLC forest land proposed to be used for mining & allied activities additionally, 32.425 ha of non-forest Govt. land has been identified by State Govt. for the purpose of raising compensatory in Plot No.83(P) & No.97(P), Khata No.87, Kissam Parbat of village Raba under Telkoi Tahsil of Keonjhar district.

Further, the DFO, Keonjhar has reported the above CA land is suitable for planting @ 200 seedlings/ha in total 6485 nos. seedlings can be accommodated. Therefore, to accommodate balance seedlings of 25,940 (32,425 nos. – 6,485 nos.) or 26,000 nos., 26.00 ha of degraded forest land has been identified in Kalimati RF of Ghatagaon Range of Keonjhar Forest Division. The DFO, Keonjhar has furnished land suitability certificate.

As per Para 7.9 (vi) of Chapter 7 of Consolidated Guidelines and Clarification issued under Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980 and Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Rules, 2023 "provision of the raising CA as applicable in the entire forest area proposed for diversion, will be applicable in lieu of forest land located in the safety zone as well". Hence, the State Govt. should provide equivalent non-forest land for raising C.A. in lieu of forest land earmarked for Safety zone. So, the user agency has to identify additional 8.568 ha of non-forest land for CA in lieu of Safety Zone.

(a) Whether land for compensatory afforestation is suitable from plantation and management point of view or not:

The DFO, Keonjhar Forest Division has furnished land suitability certificate. The C.A. site was inspected along with DFO, Keonjhar. The DFO, Keonjhar Division said that as the identified non-forest CA area is large in size i.e. 32.425 Ha, close to Raiduga PF and in one compact block, so there will be no problem from management point of view.

(b) Whether land for compensatory afforestation is free from encroachment/other encumbrances:

The Tahasildar, Telkoi has issued non-encroachment and non-encumbrance certificate.

(c) Whether land for compensatory afforestation is important from Religious/Archaeological point of view:

It has been reported that the land for CA is not important from Religious/Archaeological point of view.

(d) Land identified for raising compensatory afforestation is in how many patches, whether patches are compact or not:

The non-forest land identified in Raba village under Telkoi Tahasil of Keonjhar under Keonjhar Forest Division for raising compensatory afforestation is comprising 32.425 Ha is in one compact block.

(e) Map with details:

The DGPS map & SoI Map indicating location of identified non-forest land for C.A. has been submitted by the State Govt.

(f) Total financial outlay:

The C.A. Scheme over 32.425 of non-forest land has been technically approved by APCCF (Nodal), Odisha with a financial outlay of Rs.47,87,500/-.

6. Whether proposal involves violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 or not. If yes, a detailed report on violation including action taken against the concerned officials:

The violation committed by the lessee along with the status of compliance have been reported by the PCCF, Odisha which are as follows:

The State Govt. vide letter No.10F(Cons)257/2014-18356/F&E dated 15.10.2015 has submitted application for change in land use pattern over already diverted 567.087 ha of forest land in Joda East Iron Ore Mine and Manmora Manganese Mines by M/s Tata Steel Ltd. The user agency has said that State Govt.'s report in respect of the OB dumps and slurry pipeline have been included in the proposal for change in land use pattern over already diverted forest land of 567.087 ha. Ministry vide letter No.8-32/1993-FC (Vol-II) dated 10.10.2017 has accorded in-principle approval for change in land use pattern over already diverted forest land of 567.087 ha of forest land.

Regarding, status of the OR Case No.63CH of 2011-12 in JMFSC Court, Barbil, the State Govt. vide letter No.24838/FE&CC dated 30.11.2023 has informed that one OR Case vide OR No.63CH of 2011-12 was booked & Prosecution Report vide PR No.20 of 2011-12 has been sanctioned and submitted to the Hon'ble JMFC, Barbil vide letter No.1846 dated 12.03.2012 of DFO, Keonjhar for taking necessary legal action against the offenders. Further, as reported by the DFO, Keonjhar Division, in the meantime the cognizance has been taken by the learned Court JMFC, Barbil. The Asst. Public Prosecutor has been requested to finalize the case at the earliest by taking efforts for speedy trial.

7. Whether proposal involves rehabilitation of displaced persons. If yes, whether rehabilitation plan has been prepared by the State Government or not:

The State Govt. has reported that there is no displacement of any human habitation. Hence, rehabilitation and resettlement plan is not required.

8. Reclamation plan:

The State Govt. has reported that the Phased Reclamation Plan and Afforestation Programme has been submitted. This plan includes reclamation of exhausted pits by back filling with mine waste materials, take up block plantation over the stabilized dumps as well as vacant areas. The user agency has furnished an undertaking to execute this work.

9. Details on catchment and command area under the project:

Not reported.

10. Cost benefit ratio:

As reported, the total benefit of due to the proposed project comes to Rs.63 Crores. The loss on forest including environmental loss, NPV cost and other mandatory payments comes to Rs.2,67 Crores. Hence, the Cost-Benefit Ratio is reported to be 1:23.55.

11. Recommendations of the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests/State Government:

The forest area proposed for diversion has been duly recommended by PCCF.

12. Utility of the project:

As reported by State Govt., the project has direct employment for 800 persons which will increase gradually.

Numbers of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes to be benefited by the project:

Not reported.

13. (a) Whether land being diverted has any socio-cultural/religious value:

Not reported.

(b) Whether any sacred grove or very old growth trees/forests exist in the areas proposed for diversion:

Not reported.

(c) Whether the land under diversion forms part of any unique eco-system:

No such report available.

14. Situation with respect to any Protected Area:

The nearest Protected Area is Similipal National Park, which is about 70 Km away from the project.

15. Any other information relating to the project:

Not reported.

- 16. Recommendations of Dy. Director General of Forests (Central) along with detailed reasons:
- 1. The Mining Scheme of Joda East Iron Ore Mines including Progressive Mines Closure Plan for the period from 2010-11 to 2014-15 was approved by the Controller of Mines (Central Zone) vide letter No.314(3)2009-MCCM(CZ)/MS-46 dated 02.07.2010. The Review of Mining Plan in respect of Joda East Iron Ore Mines of M/s Tata Steel Limited for the period 2020-21 to 2024-25 has been approved by the Regional Controller of Mines, IBM, Bhubaneswar vide letter No.RMP/A/43-ORI/BHU/2019-20/2373 dated 21.02.2020.
- 2. As reported by the State Govt. there is no displacement of people due to this project. Hence, rehabilitation and resettlement plan is not required.
- 3. Compensatory Afforestation: In lieu of 32.425 ha of virgin DLC forest land proposed to be used for mining & allied activities additionally, 32.425 ha of non-forest Govt. land has been identified by State Govt. for the purpose of raising compensatory in village Raba under Telkoi Tahsil of Keonjhar district. Further, to accommodate balance seedlings of 25,940 (32,425 nos. 6,485 nos.) or 26,000 nos., 26.00 ha of degraded forest land has been identified in Kalimati RF of Ghatagaon Range of Keonjhar Forest Division. However, as per Para 7.9 (vi) of Chapter 7 of Consolidated Guidelines and Clarification issued under Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980 and Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Rules, 2023, the State Govt. State Govt. should also provide equivalent non-forest land for raising C.A. in lieu of forest land earmarked for Safety zone. So, the user agency has to identify additional 8.568 ha of non-forest land for CA in lieu of Safety Zone.
- 4. **Effectiveness of measures taken against Encroachment/violation:** The Safety zone has been fenced and inside the safety zone, plantation has been done. The Brudhashram boundary wall have been realigned leaving the forest area. The Crusher Unit and Buildings has been dismantled. The OB dump area and slurry pipeline inside the mining lease area and for the forest land involved, re-diversion proposal has been approved by MoEF vide letter No.8-32/1993-FC (Vol-II) dated 10.10.2017
- 5. During site inspection, it was observed that there is a difference between KML of proposed 41.819 ha forest land and the physically demarcated area with boundary pillar. The user agency has furnished revised KML file of the proposed forest land for diversion which is being sent along with the report.
- 6. As the area is coming under Elephant Habitat Zone-2 as per ORSAC and there is movement of elephant often noticed in this area, Wildlife Conservation Plan with special emphasis to mitigate the adverse impact on elephant movement as well as conservation and protection of other wildlife found in and around the proposed area is required. To address the issue of wildlife conservation, the State Govt. has recommended for Site Specific Wildlife Conservation Plan duly approved by CWLW, Odisha. Besides, State Govt. has also recommended that the user agency shall pay towards cost of Regional Wildlife Management Plan for the entire ML area.
- 7. The number of trees to be felled is large. To minimize the adverse ecological impact, trees should be felled in a phased manner and when become absolutely necessary. With above facts and observation made during field inspection, diversion of 41.819 ha of forest land (32.425 ha of DLC forest land for mining & allied activities, Safety zone area of 8.568 ha and greenery of 0.826 ha) is recommended with standard condition and additional non-forest land of 8.568 ha for C.A. in lieu of Safety zone.


