SITE INSPECTION REPORT

<u>Title of the project</u>: Diversion of 43.58 ha of forest land in Ramanamalai Block (RM Block) forest, near Ramgad village, Sandur Taluk, Ballari District for Dharmapura Iron Ore Mines (Old Mining Lease number 2239 of M/s Zeenath Transport Company in favour of M/s JSW Steel Ltd (New ML number 0013), successful bidder in e-auction.

The lease was inspected in the presence of the representatives of the State Forest Department and of M/s JSW, the User Agency, on 20.5.2024 to 22.5.24

The NFL is not adjacent to any notified forest land but is contiguous with CA land proposed by the same User Agency against another Mining Lease i.e, Bhomman Iron Ore Lease (ML no. 0014) of M/s JSW in Chitradurga Forest Division. As per the information provided during the inspection, together with the NFL against ML number 0014 admeasuring 98.17 ha (against required 81.40 ha), total NFL in the patch comes to 142.79 ha, against requirement of 125.08 ha required. Entire NFL identified for both the leases has been mutated in the name State of Forest Department. The NFL identified and mutated against the under lease discussion has encumbrances spread over about 2.32 ha including Cattle/agri produce storage sheds, Roads. and agricultural fields. Majority of encumbrance is roads which are used by people for accessing sheds and agriculture land. Similarly in the adjacent NFL mutated and given against another lease, about 11.32 ha is under liabilities in the form of agricultural fields, water canal, temporary sheds, Community quarry for stones electricity line and borewell for agriculture use, was informed by as SFD Officers during inspection. The NFL given is over a small

hillock with good vegetation at some places and dry rocky

		 patches at some other places. Planting is possible in open patches with some soil only. To ensure 1000 plants per hectare, existing natural growth may also be worked on and protected. The site looks like a forest at many places. Since the entire hillock acts like a watershed for a lake down below, it would be in the fitness of things to consider accepting this NFL and enrich and protect it with suitable SMC works and planting, to ensure water security of nearby areas. CA land is recommended for acceptance, considering the large contiguous patch, its potential and utility to provide ecological services to nearby communities if enriched and protected well.
8.	Whether proposal involves violation of FCA, 1980 or not, if yes, a detailed report on violation including action taken against the concerned officers	 The lease is functional and was being operated during the time of visit also. As was informed by the UA and SFD officials during the visit:
		 The Ministry had issued Stage II clearance under FCA, 1980 on 30.1.1997 for an area of 44.13 ha, for a period of 30 years coterminous with lease in favour of M/s Zeenath Transport Company. The lease was extended up to 31.3.2020 by the State Government by way of supplementary ML Deed on 22.08.2016. FC approval was also deemed extended up to

31.3.2020, coterminous with the lease.

 Upon e-auction of the lease, the new Lessee M/s JSW was declared as preferred bidder vide Lol dated 13.8.2019.

- Quoting Mineral the Laws Amendment Act 2020, and the MoEFCC guidelines dated 31.3.2020. all the rights. approvals, clearances, licenses and the like of earlier lessee were deemed vested with the new lessee, and a new Mining lease was executed by the DMG with M/s JSW on 30.7.2020 for a period of 2 years. Accordingly, working permission was issued by the SFD.
- SFD issued stoppage notice vide letter dated 15.6.2022, to stop work as the Vesting order was to expire after 2 years on 29.7.2022.
- However, the State Government issued revised vesting order to allow JSW mining beyond 2 years as per the provisions of MMDR Amendment Act 2012 (Sec 8B)
- The SFD, quoting MoEFCC guidelines date 7.7.2021 asked for compliance of conditions referred therein for allowing mining.

In response, JSW filed а revision application with Revisionary Authority (Jt Secy, Ministry of Mines) against the stoppage order of SFD, and obtained a favourable interim order directing the State Government not to interfere with

		 transfer application by the UA. The transfer application is with the State Government. Being a B category lease, it is likely that the matter of transfer will be decided at the State Government level, rendering this diversion proposal infructuous and/or putting the decision of Ministry in this case in conflict with that of State Government in transfer case. The Lease period has been extended as per the MMDR Act and FC has been considered extended to make it co-terminus with the Lease. But the forest land should have been handed over to the UA and operations should have commenced only after compliance of conditions in earlier FCA approval. Instead, the UA has approached the Ministry of Mines and the HC and continued Mining without complete compliance of conditions.
21	Conclusion and Recommendation	 The proposal is for renewal of earlier diversion under FCA, 1980. Since there is a separate Transfer application under process at State government level, either one of the diversion proposal or transfer proposal needs to be processed. Mining operations are being carried out, pending compliance of conditions of earlier FC approval, citing High court order. Suitable decision on the proposal needs to be taken on priority to ensure compliance of conditions.

Regarding road being used by the UA, since they are being used based on an NOC of the other User agencies (M/s ZTC in this case) which have obtained FC clearance for the roads, protocol may be put in place for such rediversions - like the SFD should be the permitting authority, charging of NPV/CA from the new UA, etc. The proposal is recommended for approval upon compliance of conditions of earlier FC approval and clarification on observations in sl number 20 and 21 above.






Soil Moisture conservation works as part od R& R Plan



Mining operations




Boundary demarcation













Compensatory Land- NFL

ORDER

Heard Dr.Abhishek Manu Singhvi, learned Senior Advocate appearing for Sri.Aditya Narayan, the counsel on record of these cases.

2. Learned Sr. Advocate Dr.Singhvi submits that though series of interim orders were passed for protecting the petitioner against the stoppage orders issued by the respondent-authorities, the representative of the Forest Department namely Forest Range Officer, Sandur, North Range, communication has forwarded a to Senior Geologist copy whereof is supplied to the petitioner. The said communication concludes with a direction to halt the mining operation though its second paragraph refers to the intended exercise of survey and the request for the nomination of technical officer from the side of the Survey Department.

3. The petitioner was aggrieved by the direction to stop the mining operation. The sum and substance of

Sr.Advocate Dr.Singhvi is that in spite of interim order passed by this court, the authority particularly the Forest Department was mechanically & casually passing a slew of learned Additional reply, the orders. In stoppage Advocate Sri.S.S.Mahendra inviting our Government attention to certain factual aspects like the first order passed by this court on 2.8.2022 submitted that though the petitioner has approached this court raising certain grounds to challenge the notice, the petitioner at the same time parallelly availed the remedy of revision which aspect is noted in the order dated 2.8.2022. He then invites our attention to the Memo filed on behalf of the State in this court on 5.9.2023 along with a copy of the order passed by the Revisional Authority on 31.3.2023.

4. The perusal of the revisional order shows that the petitioner himself had submitted before the Revisional Authority that if some reasonable time was granted (i.e., six months), he will complete all the necessary formalities of purchasing and handing over C.A. land to the Forest



Department. Now considering this statement and also considering the fact that already there were interim orders permitting the mining operation, stopping the petitioner from carrying on the mining activity would defeat the purpose of section 8B of the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957. The Revisional Authority allowed the revision. In the operative portion at para 21(b), the Revisional Authority directs the State Government to provide the revisionist a reasonable time of six months i.e., till 1.9.2023 now extended to 30.09.2023 vide corrigendum dated 05.04.2023 to complete all the formalities in respect of provision of CA land and not to interfere with the mining operations during the said period. Then clause (c) reads: "if the Revisionist fails to provide CA land within the said period, the State Government may take necessary action with respect to the continuity of the mining operations."

5. Now on the backdrop of the Revisional Authority' order, attempt was initially made by the learned Additional

Government Advocate to submit that in spite of grant of sufficient time, the petitioner failed to take appropriate steps for the compensatory afforestation and handing over the land to the State Government. However, the petitioner has filed a Rejoinder dated 25.9.2023, a communication is placed on record at page 34 (Annexure-AF) dated 24.8.2023 which clearly indicates that the petitioner has taken all necessary steps as per the undertaking given to the Revisional Authority. This communication also gives a tabular statement to show that the additional lands are purchased by the petitioner for compensatory afforestation and this purchase is duly made by the registration of the sale deeds, in the name of Forest Department.

6. Needless to state that now, further formalities are required to be undertaken by Revenue Officials for change of Khata. The learned Additional Government Advocate submits that to his knowledge, there is no order passed till today by jurisdictional authority of the State



Government, particularly by the Senior Geologist, Department of Mines & Geology, Bellary, pursuant to the communication dated 16.11.2023. As such, considering this factual matrix of the matter which is not in dispute, we deem it appropriate to dispose off all these petitions with the following directions:

[i] The petitioner is permitted to approach the competent authority i.e., Sr. Geologist, Department of Mines & Geology, Bellary, along with all necessary documents to show that it has complied the order of the Revisional Authority in letter & spirit, in turn the authorities may forward these materials/documents to the jurisdictional authorities.

[ii] The competent authorities shall hold the proceedings with the participation of the petitioner's side and decide as to whether there is due compliance of the revision order referred to above. It is open to the jurisdictional



authority to solicit any information or documents from the side of petitioner as are required for accomplishing this task.

[iii] If the order to be passed by the jurisdictional Authority goes adverse to the interest of petitioner, the same shall not be given effect to for a period of three weeks from the date of an authenticated copy of the same is served on the petitioner so that he can have a reasonable space for laying a challenge to the same in accordance with law.

[iv] The decision shall be taken by the jurisdictional Authority within a period of eight weeks and that the petitioner's ongoing mining operations shall not be halted by issuing notices of the kind, which we have commented upon, \mathcal{Y} supra.

[v] Needless to state that we have not made any observation in the form of assessment of

merits of the matter or contention of the parties and as such, all contentions are kept open.
